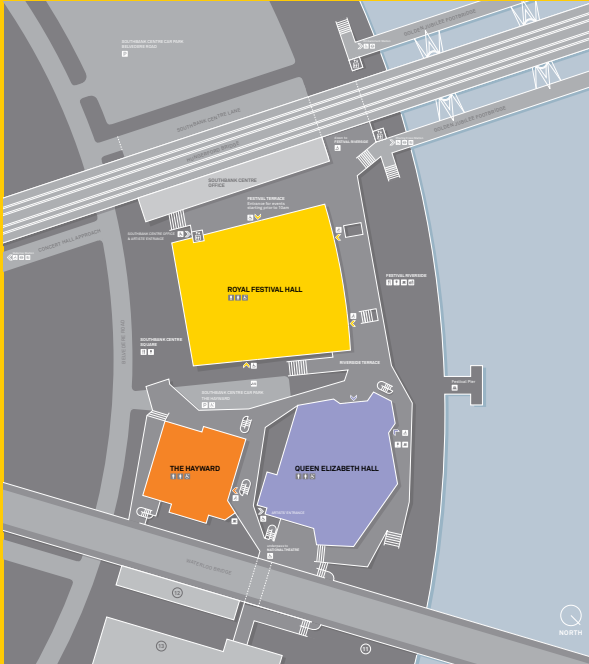

Our hearts and spirits are behind Caster Semenya, the 2009 world 800-meter champion and 2011's silver medal winner, along with world 400m hurdles bronze medalist, LJ van Zyl and Commonwealth Games champion javelin thrower, Sunette Viljoen as well as the rest of our spectacular and talented team.

In the history of the modern Olympics, South Africa has won seventy Olympic medals, twenty of those gold, twenty four silver and twenty six bronze. This year we aim to inspire Team South Africa to bring home even more! The Olympic and Paralympic-

Games are more than sporting events to South Africans. They are a representation of our spirit. They are symbolic to our country's dedication to moving beyond our past, embracing our diversity and overcoming any challenge.

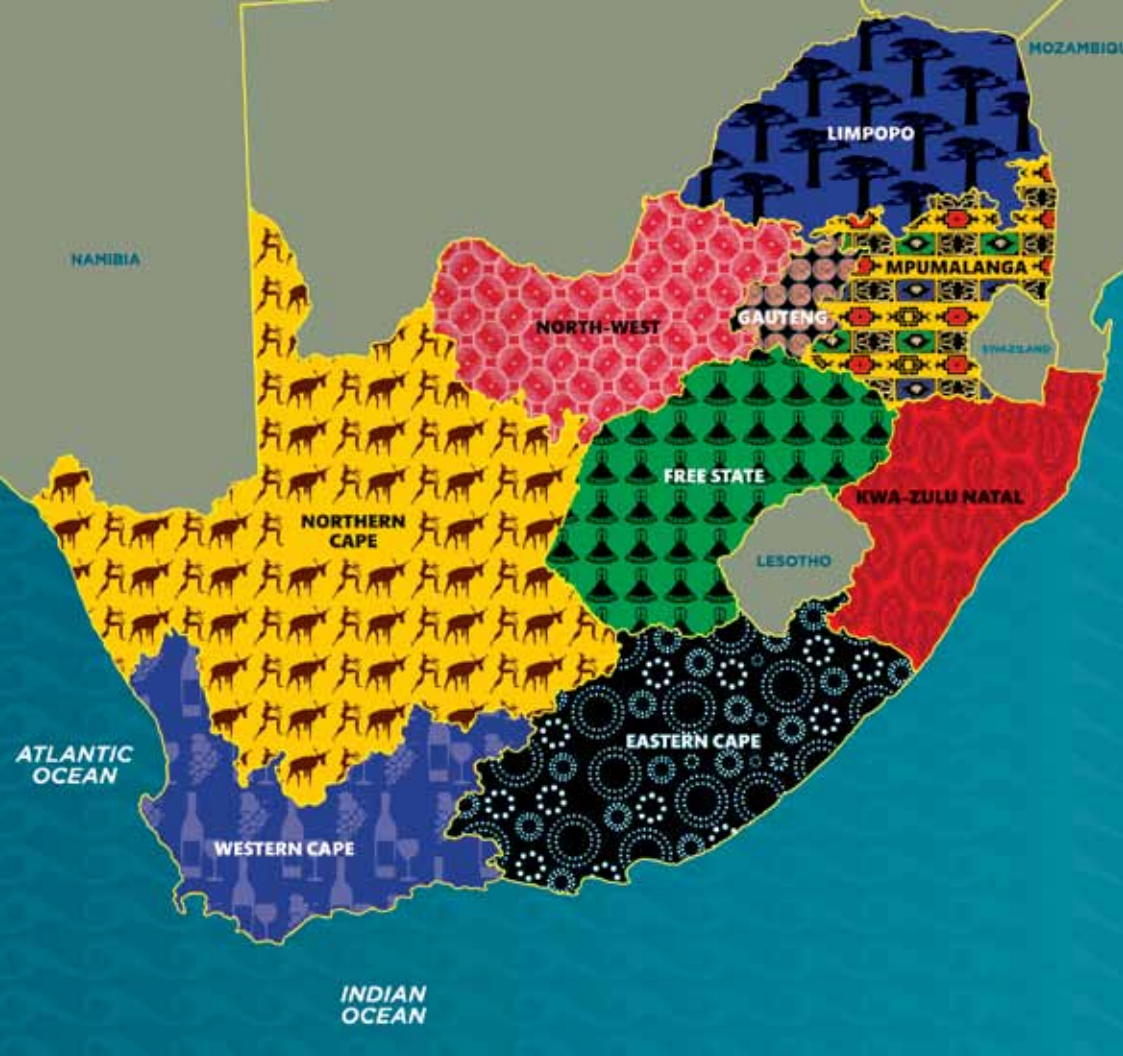

KwaZulu-Natal

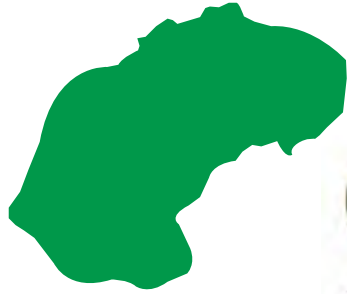
South Africa's playground, KwaZulu-Natal has spectacular mountain ranges, miles and miles of golden beaches, battlefields and some of the best game reserves in the country. Every June and July, hundreds of thousands of sardines make their way up the coast, getting trapped in bays and coves, they beach themselves and create much excitement at this natural extravaganza.

Home to two World Heritage sites, Kwazulu-Natal abounds in natural beauty and cultural heritage. The Greater St. Lucia Wetlands Park is home to five distinct ecosystems and has a unique biodiversity found nowhere else on earth. It offers everything from Big 5 game viewing, gorgeous beaches and some of the best snorkelling and scuba diving in the country.

INTRODUCTION

South Africa is one of the most diverse countries in the world. With exotic landscapes, people, history and culture it's bound to offer an experience that surpasses all ordinary expectations.

Each province in Gauteng offers renowned wildlife parks and beautiful natural scenery allowing for an incomparable experience with its natural beauty. Come to Ekhaya, and take a look at some of the enchanting scenery some provinces have to offer.



Free State

Wedged between the magnificent Orange and Vaal rivers is a region blessed with such beauty and grace that for scores of years thousands of pioneers paid the ultimate sacrifice for the honour and privilege of calling it their home. Embraced by several of South Africa's provinces, the Free State assumes its rightful place at the heart of the country. Today, visitors and inhabitants alike are rediscovering their souls through the majesty of this land and the moulded spiritual ethos of its people.

The Free State is a rural province of wide horizons and blue skies, with farmland, mountains, goldfields and widely dispersed towns. Although the Free State is the third largest province in South Africa, it has the second smallest population and the lowest population density.

The capital of the Free State is Mangaung, having a well-established institutional, educational and administrative infrastructure and housing the seat of the Provincial Government as well as the Supreme Court of Appeal.

The Free State is home to rich cultural and heritage as the birth of the major political parties including the ruling party (African National Congress) that celebrated its centenary in January 2012. The province is home to the seventh World Heritage Site, Vredeford Dome.

The Maluti Mountain range of the Eastern Free State, provides a picture square of amphitheatre for the nature enthusiasts, mountain climbers and adrenalin junky.

The Goldfields area is the home for Phakisa Freeway, the inaugural host of the International Motor GP. The province is also rich in the adventure, sport and events as well as leisure tourism.



Northern Cape

The Northern Cape boasts a colourful history and a variety of cultural tourist attractions and is particularly well known for its incredible annual floral display that takes place in Namaqualand. An utterly beautiful coastline and a number of unique national parks offer the tourist a very different experience of South Africa.

Mining has always defined the history in this part of South Africa and, when diamonds were discovered in Kimberley, unprecedented growth took place in the province. The last remaining true San (Bushman) people live in the Kalahari area of the Northern Cape. The whole area, especially along the Orange and Vaal Rivers, is rich in San rock engravings. The province is also rich in fossils. The Northern Cape is divided into five distinct regions and offers many 'must-see' attractions.

The Northern Cape is a land of many diverse cultures, of frontier history and brave missionaries. It also has countless challenges for the adrenaline junkies, hikers, hunters and 4x4 adventurers. It has impressive parks with endless game and one of the most unique flora in the world. Northern Cape will help you to find some of its most worthwhile treasures.
