

"LEND A HAND- BUILD A BETTER LIFE FOR CHILDREN" CAMPAIGN MULTI STAKEHOLDER BUSINESS PLAN

September 18, 2002

1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1. The Department of Social Development and its provincial counterparts seek to enable the poor, vulnerable and excluded people in the South African society to secure a better life for themselves, in partnership with them and with all those who are committed to building a caring society¹.
- 1.2. In his State of the Nation Address, President Mbeki outlined key objectives that needed to be prioritised and achieved in 2002. Cardinal among them was to ensure that all those beneficiaries who qualify for grants do actually access them. The President emphasised the need for Government and the entire society to join hands in tackling the huge socioeconomic challenges facing the country under the banner of "Pushing Back the Frontiers of Poverty". Furthermore, the President characterised this year as the year of volunteering (LetsemalIlima) in which he urged all South Africans to give particular focus on children during October.
- 1.3. The Social Cluster of governance has since adopted the registration of children as a campaign of the cluster. Considering the fact that six in ten children are considered to be poor², the Minister for Social Development has also declared this year "Children First/Abantwana Kuqala". The Minister set a target of registration of one million children for grants during the financial year of 2002/2003, as part of the overall target of the government to register three million children by the year 2005.
- 1.4. The campaign represents a key focus for the stakeholders and brings flesh to their commitment to improving the quality of lives of children through a comprehensive social security.

1.5. Baseline Data³

The indication and statistics show that, the following must be considered for the Campaign:

Thus although the baseline target is an additional 800 000 children into the system, by 31 March 2003, consideration must be made in the spread of the three grant types targeting children and other grant types should also be targeted. Experience during the Child Protection Week (27 May - 02 June 2002) shows that 300 000 children were registered, between the months of April and June, as a result of an extensive campaign undertaken in the community, print and electronic media.

1.6. Targeting

Attention must be paid to the fact that there has been uneven developments in the provinces in the above regard, with some recording high uptakes whilst others recording very low, if not stagnant figures. Given the historic spatial development plans and the uneven spread of poverty, vulnerability and social exclusion within and between provinces. Emphasis will be placed on certain provinces that have generally rendered a low up-take and communities that have reletaviley higher levels of poverty.

Additionally, consideration must be given to the facts that whilst there is a general increase in up take in the Child Support Grant, there is a relatively slow up-take on other child targeted grant types. Thus grant types such as the Care Dependency Grant (for children with disabilities) and the Foster Care Grant (for fostered children) will receive special attention.

1.7. Cooperative Governance

Whereas a national guiding plan to assist provinces in planning, provincial business plans and local business plans exist, this plan seeks to complement these and coordinate action amongst a select number of Stakeholders, who are free to individually engage in any of these other plans. Note should therefore be taken of the following national events:

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*The International Day of the Older Person (1 October),
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The Presidential Imbizo Week (16 – 22 October),

ZEThe World Food Day (16 October),

ZEThe International Poverty Eradication Day (17 October),

∠The Family Fun Week.

ExThe Environment Month (November)

Sixteen Days of Activism (25 November – 10 December)

1.7. Community Participation from the outset, i.e. planning process is critical to the sustainability of the project, thus the collaboration with civil society organisations is seen as both an information dissemination mechanism and a long term sustainability programme. Note must be made that the poorest communities often lack the resources for planning and considerable assistance is required up front to assist and enhance capacity in these communities.

2. DEVELOPMENT FRAMEWORK

2.1. Problem Statement

2.1.1. Poverty in South Africa

Poverty is distributed unevenly among nine provinces of the country. The Eastern Cape, the Northern Province and more recently, the Free State, have by far the highest poverty rates. In line with poverty distribution by provinces, 72% of poor people in South Africa live in rural areas, and 70% of all rural people are poor. Within both urban and rural areas themselves the situation is highly stratified, either spatially (i.e. specific pockets of extreme

poverty), or by target group (e.g. Women and children, the elderly or the disabled). Rural communities are also highly dispersed and this often presents difficulty in accessing appropriate levels of support or service.⁴

2.1.2. Food Insecurity

Of the many factors associated with poor communities, food insecurity is one of the major indicators linked to poverty and vulnerability. For those members of society who are dependent on cash payments from government, most use these grants to improve food security. It is estimated that 40% of the population is vulnerable to food insecurity⁵.

2.1.3. Limitations of existing social assistance (security) system

There is a general admission on the inadequacy of the existing system of social security/social assistance, as it does not cover many vulnerable groups. The intent of this plan is to firstly extend assistance to those who qualify with the view of collecting lessons for building a more efficient and effective social security and services system. The Committee of Inquiry into a Comprehensive Social Security System has tabled its report to Cabinet and comments from the public are being processed. In the interim measures in the form of the "Lend a Hand Help A Child" Campaign are necessary.

2.2. Strategic Purpose

- 2.2.1 The strategic purpose of this Campaign is to systematically address conditions that limit access to grants to eligible beneficiaries, particularly children, over an initial six-month period.
- 2.2.2 The ultimate aim and eventual development outcome over a 3-year period is a reduction of poverty partly through an increased awareness on all government services.
- 2.2.3 To enhance partnership between the Government, Business and Civil Society Sectors, whilst creating a space for an independent civil society working in concert with government.
- 2.2.4 The development of a comprehensive social security and the improvement of social cohesion of specific demographic groups (e.g. Women, youth, children, infirm, disabled and older persons) who are particularly vulnerable to the conditions associated with poverty, is also an anticipated, but not a directly intended outcome.
- 2.2.5 Critical to such a Campaign, is the creation of capacity through local partnerships, which are able to identify and pursue additional development initiatives that are viable. Such partnerships become the means through which communities are able to plan and manage their own initiatives.

2.3. Objectives

The Campaign will be monitored and evaluated in terms of its impact in regard to specific outcomes. All inputs, processes and delivery outputs will be geared towards attaining the outcomes. They are stated as the following objectives:

Promotion of Children's access to grants

significantly and educating the public about grants especially child related grants

- Promoting policies and programmes of the Department of Social Development and Government
- Enhancing partnership within and between government, civil society and the business sector with regard to the promotion of the rights of children
- Enhancing cooperative governance through strengthening coordination within and between National, Provincial and Local Government

2.4. Indicators

- 2.4.1. The number of beneficiaries registered at the targeted nodal points.
- 2.4.2. The percentage increase, per grant type, in grant recipients per area
- 2.4.3. The number of viable local institutional structures (partnerships) for the sustainable management and maintenance of government services information in the targeted areas within a 3-year period.
- 2.4.4. The percentage decrease in the number of children who are not registered for grants.
- 2.4.5. The number of rural households benefiting from grants in each target area.
- 2.4.6. The number of training workshops undertaken
- 2.4.7. The number of volunteers trained and utilised
- 2.4.8. The amount and frequency of media coverage received by the Campaign

2.5. Key Messages and themes of Campaign

- 2.5.1. The adopted national communication strategy details the communication plan and key messages as:
 - & Government and partners are committed to building a better life for all
 - Sovernment and partners are determined to remove children from poverty
 - Sovernment and partners committed to enhancing the socio-economic rights of children
 - **Partnerships critical to the government's delivery of services
- 2.5.2. In line with the President's call, the National Year of the Volunteer and Governments five year theme the theme of the campaign is "Lend A Hand- Build a Better Life for Children" and the sub themes are "Abantwana Kuqala/Children First" and "Building a Caring Society together".

3. CAMPAIGN SCOPE

3.1. Profile

This Campaign will be implemented as a high profile campaign involving the Presidency, Ministers (especially those of the Social cluster), Premiers and MEC 's, Mayors and Councilors, MPL's, MP's, civil society, entertainment and business leaders.

3.2. Target Audience

Children themselves, poor communities, community based organisations working with children (especially those in the Social Development Sector), Religious Organisations, Business, Labour, Mass Media, International Organisations (including donors working with children) and all tiers of Government,

3.3. Key Activities

- 3.3.1. The Campaign will therefore be mass based and would target nodal points that either are of strategic importance or areas of low uptake. The Campaign will involve
 - Awareness raising and public education

 - **Stakeholder** mobilisation
 - Monitoring and research

3.3.2. Awareness Raising and public education

The key limitation and reason for the relatively low levels of registration and access to all grants is the lack of information on requirements and grant types available. The core element of the Campaign will be targeted awareness raising and public education. This will require the production of accessible information and its dissemination thereof. The following tools will be implemented:

- Materials development; will include a grants booklet and a Training manual to be finalised by Soul City, Acess and the Department of Social Development. There is an understanding that should other materials development be necessary, the campaign will be open to exploring the need and mobilising the necessary resources.
- Provincial clearinghouses have been identified and will be used as key distribution points in respective provinces.
- Capacity building will take place through information flow through materials and through running respective workshops which key community organisations, religious organisations etc. will be capacitated to facilitate information flow within respective communities.
- Since registration is influenced by proximity to registration points and the lack of transport in certain areas the Campaign will employ an outreach strategy which will have capacity to register on site.
- Public local level launches, Jamborees and Imbizo's, with high profile leaders will be used in order to encourage registration during a particular period after which it is anticipated that community organisations and civil society organisations will support local authorities in registering and disseminating the information.

3.3.3. Media Advocacy

The mass media is central to the communications strategy and with its rural bias, Soul City and Soul Buddies are at the centre of the joint communication strategy. These vehicles and attached communication tools will be used optimally to get messages across through edutainment on television, radio and print. The media advocacy will include:

**EThe publication of information leaflets and posters by Johnnic publishing

- Example use of community media both as an information dissemination mechanism but also as communal information and registration points
- Public events such as Jamborees, radio launches and press conferences will take place in targeted nodal points starting in October running through to March 2003.

3.3.4. Stakeholder Mobilisation

Stakeholder mobilisation refers to a process of increasing the support base for the campaign at the level of civil society, business and respective relevant government departments. These will involve the following

- Business Summit, wherein the Minister of Social Development will appeal for specific support to Social development areas including the registration of citizens illegible for grants
- Networking with key umbrella structures, with an emphasis on labour and religious organisations, to join the Campaign
- Linking with other relevant campaigns such as Khomanani, Treatment Action Campaign, Public Service Week etc. so as to build solidarity and inter linking issues.
- Mobilising the right number of volunteers at the rights registration and payment points so as to add capacity to the public service
- Lobbying key Departments such as Education and Home Affairs to have a visible presence within the Campaign

3.3.5. Monitoring and research

This particular strategy will provide an ongoing information base for the further development and progress of the campaign through focussing on the following activities:

- The refinement of planning processes and development of Business Plans by the Social Development departments through the support of Businesses in particular the National Business Initiative
- EXThe refinement of indicators/benchmarks to review progress of the campaign objectives
- Addentification of key blockages in respective provinces, with a view to developing appropriate responses to blockages
- Periodic and scheduled meetings between all the stakeholders so as to review progress on the Camapign
- 3.3.6. The registration events highlighted in the events attached action plan assume that there will be mobile units stationed at the venue for the week preceding the event.

3.4. Management of the Campaign

- 3.4.1. The Campaign will be managed by a multi stakeholder team led by the Ministry of Social development and will include the Youth Commission and Sonke, the team will form sub committees to lead the four key activities above
- 3.4.2. The team is accountable to the Minister for Social Development via the broad stakeholders' Forum, and will provide detailed reports to all the stakeholders and the Minister
