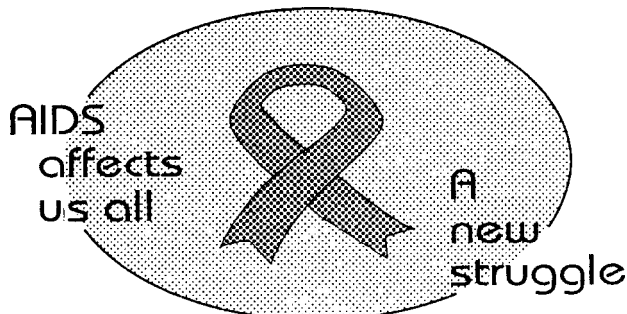

NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY ACT, 1996 (ACT NO. 27 OF 1996)**APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS TO SERVE AS MEMBERS ON THE
MINISTERIAL PROJECT COMMITTEE AND THE ESTABLISHMENT OF
ADVISORY COMMITTEE OF THE PROJECT TO STREAMLINE
CURRICULUM 2005**

On 26 July 2000 Cabinet agreed to the development of a National Curriculum Statement, which must deal in, clear and simple language with what the curriculum requirements are at various levels and phases. Such a statement must also address the concerns around the curriculum overload and must give a clear description of the kind of learner – in terms of knowledge, skills, values and attitudes – that is expected at the end of the General Education and Training (GET) Band.

As part of the approved management structure of the project to streamline Curriculum 2005, provision has been made for a Ministerial Project Committee and an Advisory Committee.

Members of the Advisory Committee will be appointed at the invitation of the Minister of Education.
