DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL AFFAIRS AND TOURISM

INVITATION TO APPLY FOR RIGHTS TO UNDERTAKE COMMERCIAL FISHING OR TO ENGAGE IN MARICULTURE OR TO OPERATE A FISH PROCESSING ESTABLISHMENT IN TERMS OF SECTION 18 OF THE MARINE LIVING RESOURCES ACT, 1998 (ACT NO. 18 OF 1998)

The Department of Environmental Affairs and Tourism hereby announces for general information that it is the intention of the Honourable Minister of Environmental Affairs and Tourism to allocate rights to undertake commercial fishing or to engage in mariculture or to operate a fish processing establishment in terms of section 18 of the Marine Living Resources Act, 1998 (Act No. 18 of 1998) ("the Act").

Note 1: FISH PROCESSING ESTABLISHMENT AND MARICULTURE

The Department will provide a further opportunity in 2002 for those wishing to apply for rights to operate a fish processing establishment or to engage in mariculture.

Important Information

A designated verification unit, independent of the Department, has been appointed and tasked to undertake any relevant investigative measure to verify or ascertain information submitted in any application.

Applicants should note that in terms of Section 28 of the Act the Minister may cancel or revoke any right granted to applicants who presented a document, made a statement or gave a return or information to the Department that was false or misleading in any material particular.

Duration of Rights

Rights will generally be awarded for a period not exceeding four years except in the case of rights to engage in mariculture or to operate a fish processing establishment which will be awarded for a period not exceeding 15 years. Abalone rights will be awarded for a period of two years.

Application fees

An application fee of **R 6000,00** (six thousand rand) will be charged for lodging an application for a right to undertake commercial fishing, or to engage in mariculture or to operate a fish processing establishment.

An application fee of **R 500,00** (**five hundred rand**) will be charged for lodging an application for a right to undertake commercial fishing of:

1) No more than 60 000 oysters per annum using no more than four harvesters;

- 2) White mussels for bait purposes;
- 3) 850 kg or less Abalone;
- 4) 1.5 tonnes or less west coast rock lobster;
- 5) Linefish Traditional with no more than four crew members;
- 6) By means of small nets (beach seine for mixed shoal fish, drag, gill/drift, cast and shove).

All applicants are herewith informed that any application submitted without proof of proper and timeous payment of the stipulated fee at the time of lodgement will not be considered.

No money is to be sent with the Application Form. Application fees must be paid into the bank account of the Rights Verification Unit and proof of such deposit, by way of a deposit slip, must be attached to each Application Form. Full details are given in the Application Form.

Application fees are not refundable. In exceptional circumstances, the Minister may refund application fees.

While the information that the Department will make available, will to the best of its knowledge, be true and correct at the time of preparation, it will be up to the applicants to inform themselves of any additional information, any changes or developments and to satisfy themselves of the veracity of the information supplied.

Submission of Applications

Applications may only be made on the numbered Application Forms supplied by the Department. Applications submitted on any form other than the approved Application Form will not be considered.

An applicant must submit one original Application Form and two copies of the Application Form and all its annexures, per sector or fishery applied for.

Only one application per sector or fishery will be accepted in respect of an applicant. Where more than one application relating to a specific sector or fishery is received in respect of a particular applicant, then, unless the applicant formally withdraws the first application in writing, any subsequent application will be deemed invalid. Where more than one application relating to a sector or fishery is received at the same time (eg. same mail delivery) then all applications will be considered invalid.

Applications transmitted by facsimile will not be accepted.

No applications received after 12h00, Friday, 13 September 2001 will be accepted or considered. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that the application reaches the Rights Verification Unit/Department by the closing date. Delays by the Post Office, courier or other delivery services will not be considered a valid reason for accepting a late application.

The Rights Verification Unit will issue applicants with a receipt. Such receipts will be issued at the time of delivery at the physical address and within 48 hours of receiving a postal application. Storage of Application Forms submitted will be the responsibility of the Rights Verification Unit.

It is the responsibility of applicants to provide any information, which they wish the Department to consider in relation to their applications at the time of lodging an application. In assessing applications, the Rights Verification Unit or the Department may conduct its own investigation to determine additional information or to verify any information provided. However, the Department is under no obligation to seek out or consider any information other than that which is provided by the applicant at the time of lodging its application.

No amendments, alterations or additions can be made to an application after the closing date, except where such amendment, alteration or addition is in response to a specific request from the Rights Verification Unit or the Department.

- 11. If you intend to submit an application for another sector/fishery, a separate application in a separate form with separate documentation must be completed. There must be a separate application for each sector/fishery in respect of which you are applying for a right.



- 16. You must pay the application fee properly and timeously and must use the application form number as the reference number on the bank deposit slip. Proof of payment (bank deposit slip) must accompany the application.
- 17. Application fees are not refundable. Only in exceptional

- circumstances, will the Minister refund application fees.
- 18. Please take note that by completing and submitting an application, you are not entitled to an allocation of fishing rights.
- 19. If you furnish any information that is not true or complete, you may be disqualified from applying or your application refused or, if granted, revoked or suspended. An application is not true and complete if
 - you provide false documentation, or
 - you falsify documents, or
 - you make misleading or false statements, or
 - you fail to disclose material information or information which may materially affect the assessment of this Application,
- 20. If you fail to comply with the requirements set out in the Government Gazette Notice Policy Guidelines and Application Form your Application may not be considered, or, if considered, refused.
- 21. In order to allow for the proper verification of this application, you are required to authorise any institution, organ of state, person or body, who possesses or acquires any information concerning or related to your application or to the Applicant, to disclose or make same available to the Minister, his delegate or a duly authorised official of the Department of Environmental Affairs and Tourism.
- 22. All applications will be subject to verification. For purposes of verification the Minister reserves the right, among other things, to inspect any of the vessels, or processing establishments referred to in your application.

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Mariculture applicants are required to supply supplementary information relating to their operation. This may include authorizations from other decision making authorities, descriptions of proposed site and operations, environmental impact assessments, water quality reports, information pertaining to the use of exotic species, details of chemical and feed use, and details of business/development plans, amongst others. This information must be attached to the application form. The supplementary information requirements for new applications can be extensive and the applicant is encouraged to ascertain that all issues are covered prior to submission. For future permit renewals, these requirements will generally be limited to compliance with permit conditions and information requested in the permit application form.

1 - Purpose of the Application

State whether this is a Plan for a new or current operation. New applications include new entrants and existing operators applying for a new site or new species. A single Operational Plan may be submitted for polyculture practices in which the secondary species, cultivated at the same site, is not intended for the market. A primary example is the integrated culture of seaweeds in land-based operations as a feed source or biological filter. The Department of Environmental Affairs and Tourism (DEA & T) will advise on acceptable polyculture practices. Details of the applicants' ownership or tenure arrangements (right to use the premises or place) must accompany this application together with a copy of any relevant documents (Annexure 6.4.1). Provide a 1:50 000 scale map of the site clearly indicating position of operation (Annexure 6.4.2).

Written approvals from a number of decision-making authorities may be required to support your application (Annexure 6.4.3). For land-based operations these include the Local Authority (eg. municipality, district council, rural council), the Department of Public Works (for state-owned land, the Admiralty reserve, fishing harbours), the Department of Water Affairs and Forestry (for estuaries and sea outfalls) and the relevant provincial conservation authority (eg Department of Environmental and Cultural Affairs and Sport (Cape), KwaZulu Natal Nature Conservation Services). Approval of proposed building plans should also be attached. In the case of sea space, approval and lease agreements will be required from Portnet or Parliament (National Assembly). Applications for sea space outside Portnet control will be routed to the National Assembly by DEA & T. Applications will not be considered unless they are accompanied by relevant approvals. Approval may be subject to a detailed integrated Environmental Management procedure.

Environmental impact assessments

According to the Environment Conservation Act No. 73 of 1989 and the Marine Living Resources Act, an environmental impact assessment by independent consultants may be required (Annexure 6.4.4). The objectives of Integrated Environmental Management provided in the National Environmental Management Act No. 107 of 1998 also apply. This process will also allow for public comment on the proposed venture as required by the Sea Shore Act No. 21 of 1935 and the above. Decisions regarding the applicants' obligations in this regard will be made by the provincial conservation authority and DEA & T.

At present new environmental legislation is being formulated as the Integrated Environmental Management Regulations promulgated by the National Environmental Management Act, and the National Coastal Management Bill. Cognizance will need to be taken of this new legislation as and when it comes into force,

Attach information on nearby activities that may impact in a negative manner on water quality at the site and indicate location of potential contaminant sources on a map (Annexure 6.4.5). Particular concerns are sewage contamination from marine outfalls and nearby activities that may produce toxic or hazardous substances such as heavy metals and pesticides. Independent water quality reports may be required for certain areas (Annexure 6.4.6).

DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL AFFAIRS AND TOURISM

Policy Guidelines with regard to applications for the granting of rights in terms of the Marine Living Resources Act 18 of 1998

Introduction

The Minister of Environmental Affairs and Tourism and his Department is committed to an equitable and transparent process of rights allocation. To this end, an independent verification unit has been appointed to verify information contained in the applications and to co-ordinate and collate the applications. The assessment and allocation process will be similarly managed, with the Minister being assisted by a panel of specialists, who will be appointed following a public tender process.

The Minister intends to allocate rights for a period not exceeding four years (fifteen years in respect of mariculture and fish processing), which will greatly enhance opportunities for investment and the promotion of stability in the fishing industry. With reference to abalone, rights will be allocated for a period of two years only. This is to allow the abalone industry, together with other stakeholders and the Department, to develop a plan that will lead to better management of the resource and significantly address the issue of over-exploitation and poaching.

This document is provided to assist applicants in the preparation of applications for commercial fishing rights in terms of section 18 of the Marine Living Resources Act 18 of 1998 ("the Act").

Applicants should note that "Historically Disadvantaged Persons" ("HDP") means those persons or categories of persons, who prior to the new democratic dispensation marked by the adoption and coming into force of the Republic of South Africa Act, 1996 (Act No. 108 of 1996), were disadvantaged by unfair discrimination on the basis of their race and includes juristic persons or associations owned and controlled by such persons.

In completing the application forms, applicants are encouraged to demonstrate their initiative, experience and capability to participate in the sector or fishery applied for.

Evaluation of Applications

Applications will be evaluated in accordance with the objectives and principles set out in section 2 of the Act and with regard to the policy guidelines set out below. No precedence, ranking or weighting is implied by the order or content of the policy guidelines.

1. Business plan, fishing plan or operational and investment strategy

Cognisance has been taken of the fact that substantial investments have been made by many of the current rights holders. This factor, together with the need to create an environment that will promote further long-term investment in human and material resources are important considerations. Historical involvements, proof of investment and past performance are therefore important factors. Applicants that are able to demonstrate the creation of employment through the effective utilisation of their allocation will be viewed in a favourable light.

2. Equity, transformation, restructuring and empowerment

The transformation of South Africa from an unequal society rooted in discrimination and disparity to a constitutional democracy founded upon freedom, dignity and equality poses particularly profound challenges for the fishing industry. It is here that there are acute imbalances in personal wealth, infrastructure and access to financial and other resources. While it is acknowledged that transformation or restructuring of the fishing industry cannot be achieved overnight, it nevertheless is a primary objective to build a fishing industry that in its ownership and management, broadly reflects the demographics of South Africa today.

In determining the degree of transformation, the following factors will be taken into account:

- · ownership of, or equity within the applicant;
- the distribution of wealth created gained through access to marine living resources.
- the extent to which the applicant provides employment to members of historically disadvantaged sectors of the community;

There is also a high degree of gender inequality throughout the fishing industry. The manner in which this is addressed, as well as racial and other historical imbalances in the context of contributing towards achieving equity, are important factors.

In the more capital-intensive sectors of the fishing industry, a higher level of internal transformation of current rights holders rather than the introduction of new entrants is encouraged.

To effectively address the injustices of the past in an orderly and just manner and to achieve equity in the fishing industry, it is the intention to allocate a notable proportion of the TAC/TAE to deserving applicants in order to encourage transformation, either through the internal restructuring of current rights holders, or through the accommodation of new entrants.

3. Impact on the resources, environment and the fishing industry

A key responsibility is the need to conserve the marine living resources for present and future generations, while at the same time achieving optimum utilisation and

ecologically sustainable development. In order to achieve this, the following considerations will apply:

- All South Africans and those in coastal communities especially, should as far as possible benefit from the limited marine living resources along our shores and in our oceans;
- The apportionment of the hake TAC will be maintained at the current proportions for the hake trawl and hake (longline) fisheries, i.e. the line caught hake will not exceed 10% of the global TAC. This apportionment will only be reviewed by way of thorough scientific investigations together with management considerations, which will be implemented through the proposed Management Working Groups and the Consultative Advisory Forum. This will be the manner in which all matters such as this will be addressed in future;
- The hake line sector (longline and handline) has been identified as a suitable vehicle for the promotion of HDI's in the hake sector, more specifically small-and-medium -sized enterprises (SMME'S). In order to achieve the objectives contemplated in section 2 of the Act, particular regard will be paid to the need to grant access to new entrants, particularly those from historically disadvantaged sectors of society;
- For the hake longline fishery it is the intention to demarcate a boundary at 20 degrees east (Cape Agulhas). This will serve two purposes:
 - (a) For conservation purposes to limit the number of vessels operating to the east thereby protecting the M. Capensis resource; and
 - (b) To afford preferential consideration to applicants living in the Southern and Eastern Cape;
- In the horse mackerel sector, an experimental step-wise increase in the Precautionary Maximum Catch Limit by as much as 10 000 tons over the next four years is proposed, subject to annual assessments of the stock, in order to gauge the response of the stock to higher levels of harvesting;
- The overcapacity of fish processing establishments and vessels in some sectors of the fishing industry is of great concern and applicants should note that the Department is in the process of developing a management plan aimed at reducing effort and applications should deal with this matter where applicable. This should not be seen as excluding participation by new entrants who wish to acquire or invest into existing effort or infrastructure or to acquire new fish processing establishments or bring new vessels into a particular sector or fishery;
- Overfishing, non-compliance with permit conditions and poaching seriously compromises the sustainable utilisation of marine resources. Any conviction or transgression committed by an applicant will impact negatively in the consideration of an application. It should be noted that the Department will not hesitate to invoke the provisions of section 28 of the Act (when appropriate) in order to revoke, suspend, cancel or alter a right, licence or permit;
- Insofar possible applicants should fish their allocations in the areas indicated in their applications.

New Entrants

Regard will be given to accommodating new entrants, particularly those from historically disadvantaged communities, in order to meet the requirement of restructuring the fishing industry to address historical imbalances and to achieve equity within all branches of the fishing industry.

It is recognised that new entrants often do not have access to sufficient capital to invest in the fishing industry. For this reason, applicants should note that non-ownership of a vessel or fish processing establishments will not disqualify new entrants.

New entrants should be able to demonstrate the following:

- Involvement in the fishing industry;
- A clear commitment to enter, invest and re-invest, and to share the risks of fully participating in the sector or fishery;
- Business acumen;
- · Financial capability or capacity;
- Knowledge of the sector or fishery applied for; and
- The capacity or the ability to catch, process and market the right applied for.

It is the intention to assist small commercial enterprises in certain commercial fishing sectors instead of in subsistence fishing and informal fishing. With reference to abalone, West Coast rock lobster, oysters, white mussels for bait purposes and small nets (beach seine net for mixed shoal fish; gill/drift, cast, drag and shove), applicants should note that maximum allocation levels have been determined to promote small commercial enterprises from historically disadvantaged sectors of society having their origin in subsistence and informal fishing.

Transfer of rights

In determining whether to grant approval for the transfer of any fishing right, or part thereof, the following policy considerations will be taken into account:

- The extent to which "paper quotas" holders are created or prolonged
- Transformation performance
- The degree to which rational consolidation of and stability in the fishing industry will be achieved

In order to discourage "paper quotas", applications for the transfer of fishing rights, or part thereof, will generally not be favourably considered during the first two years from the date the allocation is made.

Employment

Improved employment conditions within the fishing industry, particularly onboard fishing vessels and a move away from seasonal employment towards permanent employment is encouraged.

Foreign fishing

To the extent possible, a broadening of access, by accommodating South Africans in sectors and fisheries that have been previously exploited by foreign fishing interests, is sought.

Experimental fishing

In an effort to extend and broaden access to marine living resources, further experimental fisheries will be initiated. The Department is currently investigating the opening of a number of experimental fisheries (including octopus, indian squid and red-eye herring) with a view to developing further commercial fisheries. An announcement will shortly be made to bring an end to the tuna longline experiment with a view to establishing a regular commercial fishery in that sector.

Development

Recognising the impoverished state of many fishing communities, it is the intention to introduce levy concessions in order to assist the development of remote fishing communities and harbours.

Compliance

To extend the compliance capacity of the Department, tenders have been issued for the supply of one offshore and three inshore fishery protection vessels. The objective is to address more adequately the question of illegal, unregulated and unreported (IUU) fishing within South Africa's Exclusive Economic Zone and on the high seas, and to deal with the question of under-reporting, overfishing and poaching. In addition, it is the intention to increase the use of Vessel Monitoring Systems to increase compliance and to curb IUU fishing.

Service delivery

There is a direct correlation between the resources available to the Department and its capacity to provide services within the context of Batho Pele. The Act allows the Department to charge fees and receive levies in order to enhance/improve its service to the fishing industry through effective and efficient resource management, compliance and research.

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
