The Minister of Water Affairs and Forestry intends promulgating the draft regulations as set out in the attached Schedule in terms of section 53 of the National Forests Act, 1998 (Act No 84 of 1998), as amended.

In terms of section 54(1) (a) of the said Act, interested parties are invited to submit written comments on the draft regulations on or before 12 June 2002.

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Regulations

Chapter 1: Introduction

General guidelines for reading the regulations

1. In these regulations -

- (a) any word, phrase or expression which has been given a meaning in the Act,¹ has the same meaning, unless -
 - (i) the way it is used indicates otherwise, or
 - (ii) it is defined in these regulations.
- (b) reference to a section, sub-section or chapter is a reference to a section, sub-section or chapter in the Act, unless another Act is mentioned.
- (c) reference to a regulation or sub-regulation is a reference to a regulation or sub-regulation in these regulations.
- (d) whenever a power or duty is given or imposed on the Minister² or the Director-General³, the Minister or Director-General may delegate that power or duty in terms of section 48(1)⁴ or 56(2)⁵ of the Act.
- (e) the small numbers direct you to the footnotes on the same page.
- (f) Footnotes -
 - (i) explain definitions in the Act;
 - (ii) summarise sections in the Act, where a section is referred to for the first time;
 - (iii) give explanations or examples;
 - (iv) give cross-references to regulations, sub-regulations or other footnotes.

- (g) the singular includes the plural, unless the way it is used indicates that it only refers to the singular.
- (h) the plural includes the singular, unless the way it is used indicates that it only refers to the plural.

Some important definitions

- 2. (1) In these regulations, unless the way it is used indicates otherwise –
 - (a) “access” means entry into and use of roads and other structures in State forests and other forests.
 - (b) “the Act” means the National Forests Act, 1998 (Act No. 84 of 1998).
 - (c) “applicant” means a person applying for a licence under these regulations.
 - (d) “Department” means the Department of Water Affairs and Forestry.
 - (e) “Director-General” means the Director-General of the Department of Water Affairs and Forestry.
 - (f) “dispose of” means to get rid of in an environmentally acceptable way.
 - (g) “face-value licences” means licences with the value stamped or printed on the licence.
 - (h) “licensee” means the person holding a licence under these regulations.
 - (i) “lot” means a collection of forest produce or forest products to be sold as a unit at a public auction, by tender or at a tariff.
 - (j) “the Minister” means the Minister of Water Affairs and Forestry.
 - (k) “notice” means notice in the Government Gazette.
 - (l) “price” means, for sales -
 - (i) by public auction: the price of the accepted bid;
 - (ii) by tender: the price of the successful tender; or

- (iii) at a tariff: the value fixed by the tariff.
 - (m) "processed" means put through the special methods needed to produce a product.
 - (n) "publishing" means publishing a notice in the Government Gazette, unless another way of publishing is mentioned.
 - (o) "reserve price" means a minimum price for selling.
 - (p) "road" means any road, slip path, sledge path or foot path in or leading into a State forest.
 - (q) "servitude" means a right, less than ownership, over another's property.
 - (r) "tariff" means a table of fixed charges.
- (2) Words derived from the words defined have corresponding meanings, unless the way they are used indicates otherwise.
- (3) A reasonable interpretation of parts of these regulations which is consistent with the purposes of the Act and these regulations must be preferred over another interpretation which is not.
- (4) In these regulations, neither -
- (a) a reference to a duty to consult specific persons or authorities, nor
 - (b) the absence of any reference to a duty to consult or give a hearing,
- exempts⁶ the official or authority exercising a power or performing a duty from the duty to act fairly towards all persons who have a right to be heard.
- (5) Footnotes are used only as an aid to readers and must not be used to interpret these regulations.

Chapter 2: Sustainable forest management

Research

3. (1) Before commissioning research, the Minister⁷ may -
- (a) give notice of the proposal to commission research and the subject matter of this research;
 - (b) invite comments, suggestions and objections to be submitted within a set period; and
 - (c) consider the comments, suggestions and objections received in response to the notice.
- (2) The Minister commissions research by publishing⁸ a notice⁹ -
- (a) recording the decision to commission the research;
 - (b) naming the person, persons or organisation that will conduct the research; and
 - (c) fixing the period for carrying out the research.

Chapter 3: Use of forests

Sale of forest produce and forest products

4. (1) The sale of forest produce¹⁰ or forest products¹¹ from a State forest must take place -
- (a) by public auction¹²;
 - (b) by tender¹³; or

- (c) at a tariff¹⁴ issued by the Minister under section 55;¹⁵
- except for sales by SAFCOL or by agreement made under section 26,¹⁶ 27¹⁷ or 30¹⁸.
- (2) The Minister may arrange a sale by public auction or by tender, in a manner and on terms set by the Minister.
- (3) Before a sale by public auction the Minister may -
- (a) withdraw all or any of the forest produce or forest products offered for sale;
- (b) postpone the sale to a later date, if for any valid reason it cannot be held.
- (4) At a sale by public auction the Minister may -
- (a) put a reserve price¹⁹ on any forest produce or forest product;
- (b) change the reserve price put on any forest produce or forest product;
- (c) refuse to accept the highest or only bid;
- (d) offer any lot²⁰ for re-auction.
- (e) if the successful bidder fails to pay the purchase price at the conclusion of the sale or to give security under sub-regulation (9)(b) and (c)²¹ -
- (i) declare the sale void,²² and
- (ii) offer the forest produce or forest product for sale by another public auction.
- (5) Whenever forest produce or forest products are to be sold by public auction or by tender the Minister must, despite sub-regulation (2),²³ publish a notice of the sale in at least one local advertising medium.²⁴

- (6) Tenders must -
- (a) be signed by or on behalf of the tenderer,²⁵ sealed and delivered -
 - (i) to a place or a person named in the notice
 - (ii) on or before a date and time set in the notice, and
 - (b) follow any requirements set out in the notice.
- (7) The Minister does not have to accept any tender submitted.
- (8) The sale of timber is at the purchaser's risk and the Minister gives no warranty against latent defects,²⁶ unless -
- (a) the Minister has agreed otherwise, or
 - (b) the Minister is prepared to make concessions on the volume, because of the defects.
- (9) The Minister may require the purchaser -
- (a) to pay in cash or by bank-guaranteed cheque, or
 - (b) to deposit a bond of security issued by a registered commercial bank or insurance company for the amount, and in the form and manner the Minister sets for -
 - (i) the fulfilment of the purchaser's duties, and
 - (ii) compensation for any damage to forest produce or forest products that may be caused by the purchaser's negligence.
 - (c) to pay cash and deposit security, as long as the combined value of this payment and deposit is not less than the amount owing by the purchaser.
- (10) If any person breaches²⁷ sub-regulation (9), the Minister may -
- (a) cancel the contract, and

- (b) claim payment for any loss or damage suffered as a result of the contravention²⁸.
- (11) Timber or other forest produce other than that obtained under regulation 9(6) may be sawn, cut, converted, processed²⁹ or treated at any sawmill, sawpit, saw work station or depot within a State forest only if -
- (a) it was obtained through a sale under this regulation, or
- (b) the Minister has given consent³⁰ in writing.
- (12) Where -
- (a) the contract fixes a period for the removal of forest produce or forest products from the place where it has been harvested, sawn, cut, processed, treated, sold or stored, and it has not been removed, the Minister may -
- (i) grant an extension of time for the removal of the forest produce or forest product; and
- (ii) at the expiry of the extended time, remove and dispose of the forest produce or forest product in a manner to be decided by the Minister.
- (b) the contract does not fix a period for the removal of the forest produce or forest product, and the produce or product has not been removed within a reasonable time, the Minister may -
- (i) give notice to the purchaser to remove the produce or product within a set time, and
- (ii) at the expiry of the set time, remove and dispose of³¹ the forest produce or forest product in a manner to be decided by the Minister.
- (c) in the case of either (a)(ii) or (b)(ii), the Minister has removed and disposed of any forest produce or forest product, the Minister may claim payment for any loss or damage suffered.
- (d) the Minister acts under (a)(ii) or (b)(ii), he or she may employ the services of an agent.³²
- (13) Sales of other assets³³ in State forests are governed by other laws.

Chapter 4: Measures

Measures of area, dimension, volume and mass for forest produce and forest products sold from a State forest

5. (1) Calculations and measurements of area, dimension, volume and mass of forest produce or forest products must follow -
- (a) units and symbols set by the Measuring Units and National Measuring Standards Act, 1973 (Act No. 76 of 1973), and
 - (b) internationally accepted forestry practices where these do not go against South African law or practice.
- (2) Where forest produce or a forest product -
- (a) is irregularly shaped, or
 - (b) can for any reason not be accurately measured,
- the Minister may set rules and methods for -
- (i) calculating estimates of area, dimension, volume or mass
 - (ii) applying rounded-off fractions,³⁴ conversion factors³⁵ and average dimensions.
- (3) The Minister may -
- (a) in measuring any tree, log or timber, and
 - (b) as a result of any defect in its shape or substance,
- make concessions³⁶ on its price.

Chapter 5: Licences

General

6. (1) In every application made for a licence in terms of this Act³⁷ by a person who claims to be applying on behalf of a community or other legal entity, the applicant³⁸ must state –
- (a) the name of the community or entity and its location or relationship with respect to the State forest;
 - (b) whether or not the community or entity is a party to a community forestry agreement under section 30³⁹;
 - (c) whether or not the community is a community property association under the Community Property Association Act, 1996 (Act No. 28 of 1996); or
 - (d) if not a Community Property Association, the nature of the legal entity.
- (2) No licence may be issued unless the applicant has complied with all such requirements as laid down by any environmental legislation.
- (3) Any fee or charge payable under section 55⁴⁰ must be paid -
- (a) on the issuing of the licence, and
 - (b) if the licence is issued for a fixed period, for that period, unless the Minister⁴¹ has agreed to different terms, or
 - (c) if the licence is issued for an indefinite period, for that period or at intervals set by the Minister, but the period or intervals must be for at least three months,
 - (d) following any conditions set by the Minister.
- (4) The Minister may withdraw or change any tariff issued under section 55⁴² or these regulations.
- (5) No licensee⁴³ may -

- (a) in any way interfere with -
- (i) the lawful exercise of any right granted to any person under a licence issued under the Act or these regulations,
 - (ii) any forester or official of the Department⁴⁴ in the performance of their duties under the Act or these regulations.
- (b) plant any weed or invasive plant in any area in respect of which a licence has been issued, unless permitted to do so in terms of the licence or any other law.
- (c) burn any live or dead tree, plant or vegetation without the consent and supervision of a forest officer or other authorised official of the Department.
- (6) If the Minister -
- (a) amends, suspends or cancels a licence in terms of section 25(2)⁴⁵, and
 - (b) the licensee is opposed to such decision,
- the Minister may appoint a mediator⁴⁶ or arbitrator⁴⁷ from the panel referred to in section 45(1) or (2)⁴⁸.
- (7) If -
- (a) the Minister amends, suspends or cancels a licence,
 - (b) the cancellation is not due to any act or omission by the licensee,
 - (c) the licence has been issued for a fixed period, and
 - (d) the licensee has paid a fee or a charge under the tariff,
- the Minister must, out of the amount already paid, pay to the licensee the proportional amount for the unexpired period of the licence.

Types of applications and licences

7. (1) Whenever -
- (a) an application is made and no official form is required,⁴⁹ the application may be made to -
 - (i) an administrative official of the Department;
 - (ii) a Regional Director;
 - (iii) an Area Manager;
 - (iv) a Forest Estate Manager; or
 - (v) the Director-General.
 - (b) a licence is issued, the licence must be on the official General Licence Form 14 in Schedule 2, if no other form is referred to.⁵⁰
- (2) The Minister may from time to time issue face-value licences⁵¹ for any activity under these regulations.

Establishment and management of a plantation

8. (1) Any person, organ of State⁵² or organisation may apply to the Minister for a licence to establish and manage a plantation in a State forest.
- (2) An application under sub-regulation (1) must be made on Form 1 in Schedule 1.
- (3) An application under this regulation -
- (a) must be sent in with a planting plan, which sets out -
 - (i) the name of the State forest;
 - (ii) the area proposed for planting trees;
 - (iii) the period for which the licence is needed; and

- (iv) the type of trees to be planted; and
- (b) may include other relevant information -
 - (i) that the applicant thinks is necessary to support the application;
 - (ii) that the Minister requires.

Felling⁵³ of trees, removal and processing⁵⁴ of timber; harvesting, removal and processing of other forest produce and forest products

9. (1) Any person, organ of State or organisation may, if not a party⁵⁵ to an agreement under section 26⁵⁶, 27⁵⁷, 28⁵⁸ or 30,⁵⁹ apply to the Minister for a licence to -
- (a) fell trees, remove and process timber from a State forest;
 - (b) harvest, remove and process any other forest produce or forest product from the State forest.
- (2) An application under sub-regulation 1 must be made on Form 2 in Schedule 1.
- (3) The Minister may -
- (a) direct that -
 - (i) all timber or other forest produce or product that has been needlessly wasted in the felling, harvesting, removal or processing thereof must be valued, and
 - (ii) this value must be included in the price of the tree or other forest produce or product.
 - (b) place a mark, electronic chip or any other form of identification on any standing tree, other forest produce or forest product sold or for sale.
- (4) No person may remove, destroy, deface⁶⁰ or otherwise interfere with the mark, electronic chip or other identification referred to in sub-regulation (5), unless they have the consent of a forest officer.

- (5) Except for persons who are -
- (a) licensed under section 7(1)(a)⁶¹ or 23(1)(b),⁶²
 - (b) exempt⁶³ under section 7(1)(b)⁶⁴ or 24(6),⁶⁵ or
 - (c) parties to an agreement under section 26, 27, 28 or 30,⁶⁶

no person may remove any tree, other forest produce or forest product from a State forest unless -

- (i) it has been marked or otherwise identified by the Minister,
 - (ii) where the tree, other forest produce or forest product can for any reason not be marked or identified, its removal has been authorised by a forest officer, or
 - (iii) the contract of sale for the tree, other forest produce or forest product says otherwise.
- (6) No forest produce or forest product may be processed in a State forest, except in a place set aside for that purpose by a forest officer.
- (7) Any trees, other forest produce or forest products that must be marked or identified under this regulation must be stacked⁶⁷, or presented so that each tree, forest produce or forest product is easily and safely accessible to the forest officer.
- (8) Where the trees, other forest produce or forest products are not stacked as set out in sub-regulation (7), the forest officer may -
- (a) refuse to mark or identify it, and
 - (b) stop its removal until it has been properly stacked, and marked or identified.
- (9) (a) The forest officer must, before the processing of any trees, other forest produce or forest product takes place under this regulation, work out -
- (i) the volume, and

- (ii) the price of the produce or product.
- (b) If as a result of defects in the trees or other forest produce, the forest officer cannot work out the price, the officer may allow the purchaser to process as much of the trees or other forest produce as will be enough for the officer to work out the price.

The use of land, structures or buildings for domestic, residential, industrial or commercial purposes

10. (1) The Minister -
- (a) may on land set aside for that purpose in a State forest, and
 - (b) may for the proper management of the forest -
 - (i) construct dwellings⁶⁸, buildings or other structures for the use of employees of the Department
 - (ii) establish or provide amenities for the use of employees of the Department, and
 - (c) must approve the building plan or plans for any building or structure.
- (2) (a) Any holder of a right to land in a State forest and for the proper use of this right, or
- (b) any person, organ of State or organisation, and for the purpose of operating or running any business, or for any other commercial purpose,
- may apply for a licence to construct, erect or use a building, shelter, structure or tent.
- (3) An application under this regulation must be on Form 3 in Schedule 1.
- (4) The licensee must maintain the building or structure and site in a neat condition during the licence period.
- (5) No licence under this regulation may be issued unless -
- (a) tenders have been called for, or
 - (b) the Minister has by notice⁶⁹ done away with the requirement for tenders.

The use of land for agricultural purposes

11. (1) Any person may apply to the Minister for a licence to clear, plough or cultivate land in a State forest for the growing of crops.
- (2) An application under sub-regulation (1) must be made on Form 4 in Schedule 1.
- (3) A licence issued under this regulation must -
- (a) define the area for which it is granted;
 - (b) describe the types of crops that may be grown in the area; and
 - (c) set out conditions to ensure that the clearing, ploughing or cultivation is not harmful to the environment.
- (4) No licence may be issued under this regulation if the land intended for clearing, ploughing or cultivation is in an area protected under the Act or any other law.

The use of land, forest produce or forest products for educational or scientific purposes

12. (1) Any person or organisation may apply to the Minister for a licence to use State forest land, forest produce or forest products for educational or scientific purposes.
- (2) An application under sub-regulation (1) must be made on Form 5 in Schedule 1.
- (3) The Minister may, from a State forest, make available to any person, organisation or body free samples of forest produce or any forest product for educational, research, testing, demonstration, promotion or other related purposes.

The use of land for communication purposes; the moving of electricity, water, fuel and gas

13. (1) Any person may apply to the Minister for a licence to erect, construct, use and maintain telecommunication lines, power transmission lines or cables across a State forest.
- (2) An application under sub-regulation (1) must be made on Form 6 in Schedule 1.

The construction, maintenance or use of roads in State forests

14. (1) Any person may apply to the Minister for a licence to construct, maintain or use roads in a State forest.
- (2) An application under sub-regulation 1 must be on Form 7 in Schedule 1.
- (3) Except for State forests managed in terms of an agreement under section 27⁷⁰, the Minister may, at any time and without being liable to any person for any damages –
- (a) close any road in a State forest;
 - (b) prohibit or restrict the use of any road –
 - (i) for a fixed or indefinite period;
 - (ii) by a particular type of vehicle, animal, equipment or machinery;
 - (iii) for any particular purpose.
 - (c) regulate the use of any road within a State forest by traffic signs and other measures.

The grazing or herding of animals

15. (1) Any person may apply to the Minister for a licence to graze or herd animals in a State forest.

- (2) An application under sub-regulation (1) must be made on Form 8 in Schedule 1.
- (3) No licence may be issued under this regulation in respect of a State forest which has a natural forest or protected area in it unless -
 - (a) the Minister is of the opinion that issuing the licence will not have a harmful effect on the forest or area;
 - (b) it is compatible⁷¹ with the management plan of that forest or area;
 - (c) the management plan or rules of the forest or area allow otherwise.
- (4) In addition to any other licence conditions, the Minister may -
 - (a) set the number and type of animal that may be grazed or herded;
 - (b) demarcate⁷² the area where the grazing or herding may take place;
 - (c) set out the manner in which the area referred to in paragraph (b) above, will be managed;
 - (d) fix seasons when grazing or herding may take place.
- (5) The Minister may, in addition to the penalties under section 63 (4)⁷³ and (5)⁷⁴, impound⁷⁵ any animal grazed or herded in a State forest in contravention of⁷⁶ the Act or these regulations.
- (6) Any impoundment of animals under this regulation -
 - (a) does not deprive the Minister of any right to claim damages under the common law or statute;
 - (b) must be performed in terms of, and is subject to, the provisions of any applicable law, ordinance or bye-law.
- (7) A licence issued under this regulation is cancelled if a State forest, or part of it, becomes a protected area under the Act or any other law, unless the Minister directs otherwise.

Hunting and fishing

16. (1) Any person may apply to the Minister for a licence to hunt, catch or kill any game, bird, insect, fish or other animal in a State forest;
- (2) An application for a licence under sub-regulation (1) must be made on Form 9 in Schedule 1.
- (3) The issuing of a licence under this regulation must follow the law dealing with the protection and preservation of species and habitats.

Mining

17. (1) Any person may apply to the Minister for a licence –
- (a) to prospect for or mine precious and base metals, minerals or precious stones, and
- (b) to do anything he or she may lawfully do for that purpose.
- (2) An application under sub-regulation (1) must be made on Form 10 in Schedule 1.
- (3) No licence may be issued under this regulation unless the application is accompanied by a prospecting permit or mining authorisation, issued under the Minerals Act, 1991 (Act No. 50 of 1991).

Chapter 6: Access to forests

The construction, maintenance or use of roads or any other means of transportation and communications into State forests

18. (1) For the purpose of providing access⁷⁷ to any State forest, the Minister⁷⁸ may enter into an agreement with any owner of land to –
- (a) allow members of the public and employees of the Department⁷⁹ to use a road or other structure on that owner's land;

- (b) build and maintain a road,⁸⁰ bridge, culvert⁸¹, chute⁸² or landing strip;
 - (c) lay and maintain railway lines, underground cables, slip paths or sledge paths;
 - (d) erect and maintain telephone lines, power lines or cableways;
 - (e) construct and maintain any other similar structure.
- (2) The agreement may include conditions on –
- (a) the joint undertaking of such building, laying, erection, construction and maintenance of any such structure;
 - (b) the sharing of the costs;
 - (c) the issuing of any licence for the use of any structure referred to in sub-regulation (1);
 - (d) the granting of an exemption under section 24(6)(a)⁸³;
 - (e) compensation to the owner of the land;
 - (f) the sharing of any fees from the use of any of the structures;
 - (g) the general management of the structures.

Access to forests other than State forests for recreation, education, culture or spiritual fulfilment

19. (1) When taking action under section 21(1),⁸⁴ the Minister must approach the owner and
- (a) state why he or she wishes to promote access;
 - (b) request the owner to indicate if he or she is willing to allow access to the public and on what conditions; and
 - (c) draw the owner's attention to section 21(4).⁸⁵

- (2) If the owner requires financial or other assistance for giving access, the owner must -
 - (a) state the nature, extent and duration of the assistance;
 - (b) set out how the assistance will be used;
 - (c) fully explain how the assistance will benefit the forest, the public or the environment; and
 - (d) give all other relevant information.
- (3) If the owner wants compensation for any loss caused by the grant of access, the owner must -
 - (a) accurately state the nature and extent of the loss, and the circumstances leading to the loss;
 - (b) fix the amount he or she is asking for;
 - (c) set out how the amount has been calculated;
 - (d) supply receipts, vouchers and all other evidence in support of his or her claim; and
 - (e) give all other relevant information.

Request by a person seeking access to a forest other than a State forest for recreation, education, culture or spiritual fulfilment

20. (1) Any person or the registered owner of land may request the Minister to enter into negotiations in terms of section 21(3)⁸⁶.
- (2) A request under this regulation must –
 - (a) identify the forest to which access is sought;
 - (b) give details of the registered owner of the land; and
 - (c) give reasons for the request.
- (3) Access granted in terms of this regulation is subject to section 21(2)⁸⁷.

Chapter 7: Protection of trees and forests

Licences for activities in respect of indigenous living trees in natural forests or their products

21. (1) Any person, or organ of State may apply to the Minister for a licence to do anything referred to in section 7(1)⁸⁸.
- (2) An application under sub-regulation (1) must be made on Form 11 in Schedule 1.
- (3) No licence may be issued under this regulation unless the applicant has complied with all such requirements as are laid down by any environmental legislation.
- (4) Whenever a licence is issued under sub-regulation (1), the licence must be shown on the official Licence Form 15 in Schedule 2.

Licences for activities in respect of protected trees or products of protected trees

22. (1) Any person or organ of State may apply to the Minister for a licence to do anything referred to in section 15(1)⁸⁹.
- (2) An application under sub-regulation (1) must be made on Form 12 in Schedule 1.
- (3) No licence may be issued under this regulation –
- (a) unless the applicant has complied with all such requirements as are laid down by any environmental legislation, and
- (b) in respect of trees protected under section 14⁹⁰.

- (4) Whenever a licence is issued under sub-regulation (1), the licence must be shown on the official Licence Form 15 in Schedule 2.

Protection of forests, trees and groups of trees on application by persons or organs of State

23. (1) Any person or organ of State may apply to the Minister to protect a forest, a tree or a group of trees in terms of Chapter 3.
- (2) An application under sub-regulation (1) must be made on Form 13 in Schedule 1.

Setting aside of specially protected areas on private land

24. (1) A registered owner of land may -
- (a) request the Minister to declare his or her land or any part of it, or
 - (b) give consent to the Minister to declare his or her land or any part of it a specially protected area as one of the areas listed in section 8(1).⁹¹
- (2) A request to the Minister under sub-regulation (1) must -
- (a) clearly identify the area;
 - (b) set out in detail the nature of the fauna and flora in the area;
 - (c) fully set out the reasons why the protection is needed;
 - (d) identify the nature of any rights that other persons have over the land;
 - (e) be sent in with a map of the area;
 - (f) say who will benefit from the protection and in what way; and
 - (g) give any further relevant information.
- (3) If the owner needs financial or other assistance for the management of the protected area, he or she must, with the request -
- (a) state the nature, extent and duration of the assistance;

- (b) set out how the assistance will be used;
 - (c) fully explain how the assistance will benefit the area, the public or the environment; and
 - (d) give all other relevant information.
- (4) The consent by the owner under section 8(1)(c)⁹² must be in writing and may include suggestions on the proper management of the area.

Management of protected areas

25. Except for areas protected at the request of registered owners of land in terms of regulation 23, the Minister must –
- (a) whenever he or she decides to declare an area a protected area -
 - (i) consider any existing policy documents and management plans for the area, and
 - (ii) prepare a policy statement for the area, and
 - (b) as soon as possible after the declaration -
 - (i) if there is no management plan or rules for the area, draw up a plan and rules, and
 - (ii) where an area is visited by the public, display and make the rules available in the area.

Chapter 8: Information

Statistical returns on plantations, timber processing factories or plants

26. (1) The Minister may request –
- (a) an owner of a plantation or any group of owners, or
 - (b) a person in charge of a timber processing factory or plant

to submit statistical returns as required in Forms 16 and 17 in Schedule 3.

- (2) Information submitted under sub-regulation (1) must be for –
 - (a) the preceding period of one year from 1 July to 30 June;
 - (b) for the most recent financial year, or
 - (c) such other period as the Minister may determine.
- (3) The request referred to in sub-regulation (1) must –
 - (a) state the date by which the information must be provided;
 - (b) be made at least one month before the end of the period referred to in sub-regulation (2); and
 - (c) allow for a period of at least three months for the submission of the information.

Statistical returns on natural forests and woodlands

27. (1) The Minister may enter into an agreement with any Province for the Province to submit to the Minister statistical returns for natural forests and woodlands in the Province.
- (2) The Minister may authorise any official of the Department or any other suitable person to –
 - (a) enter and inspect a forest;
 - (b) obtain from the owner any information on the forest that may lawfully be obtained;
 - (c) examine and make copies of any book or document reasonably believed to affect the forest; and
 - (d) obtain from the owner or any person in possession of this book or document, a statement about any entry in the book or document.
- (3) No entry, inspection or examination may be made, or information obtained or a statement taken, outside the hours of 08h00 to 18h00.

Chapter 9: Servitudes

Granting and licensing of servitudes⁹³

28. (1) Any person may apply to the Minister for the granting of a servitude in a State forest.
- (2) No activity under a servitude may be carried on before –
- (a) the servitude has been registered; and
 - (b) a licence in respect of all activities under that servitude has been issued.

Chapter 10: Community forestry

Community forestry assistance

29. (1) A community or a person engaged in activities referred to in section 32(1)⁹⁴ may apply to the Minister for assistance.
- (2) The application -
- (a) must -
 - (i) state the nature, extent and duration of the assistance;
 - (ii) say whether or not any assistance has been applied for or received from any other source;
 - (iii) set out how the assistance will be used; and
 - (iv) fully explain how the assistance will benefit the community, forest or the environment; and
 - (b) may include other relevant information the community thinks is necessary to support the application.

Chapter 11: Enforcement

Appointment of forest officers

30. (1) Proof of appointment of a forest officer must -
- (a) be in writing;
 - (b) be headed with the words "Department of Water Affairs and Forestry";
 - (c) show the signature of the Director-General⁹⁵, or an official appointed by the Director-General; and
 - (d) include -
 - (i) the full names of the forest officer;
 - (ii) the date of his or her appointment;
 - (iii) the words "forest officer" in bold print; and
 - (iv) a clear photograph of the forest officer.
- (2) The proof of appointment is not transferable⁹⁶ and must be returned to the Director-General when a person is no longer a forest officer.

Inspections

31. (1) The Minister may carry out an inspection under section 53(4)(a)⁹⁷.
- (2) An inspection carried out under this regulation must be conducted after -
- (a) the designation⁹⁸ referred to in section 53(4)(a) has been shown;
 - (b) the reason for the inspection has been explained; and
 - (c) a request to consent to the inspection has been made

to the owner, possessor,⁹⁹ driver, rider or other person in control of the forest, trees, timber, vehicle, pack-animal¹⁰⁰ or premises.¹⁰¹

- (3) If the consent is unreasonably refused, the inspector may go ahead with the inspection.
- (4) For the purposes of the inspection referred to in sub-regulation (1), the inspector may, for any lawful reason -
- (a) enter any forest, vehicle or premises;
 - (b) get from the owner, possessor, driver, rider or person in control
 - (i) any information on the forest, trees, timber, vehicle, pack-animal or premises;
 - (ii) a statement about any issue to do with the forest, trees, timber, vehicle, pack-animal or premises.
 - (c) examine and make copies of any book or document reasonably believed to affect the forest, trees, timber, vehicle, pack-animal or premises.

Chapter 12: Offences and penalties

Offences and penalties

32. (1) The Minister has in terms of section 53(6)¹⁰² -
- (a) determined that the infringements referred to in sub-regulation (2) constitute criminal offences, and
 - (b) prescribed maximum penalties for the offences.
- (2) (a) Any person who saws, cuts, converts, processes or treats timber or other forest produce in contravention of regulation 4(11)¹⁰³ is guilty of an offence and liable on a first conviction to a fine or imprisonment for a period not exceeding one year, or to both a fine and such imprisonment.

(b) Any person who does not remove forest produce or forest products

- (i) within the extended time referred to in regulation 4(12)(a)(i)¹⁰⁴;
- (ii) within the notice period referred to in regulation 4(12)(b)(i)¹⁰⁵;

is guilty of an offence and liable on a first conviction to a fine or imprisonment for a period not exceeding one year, or to both a fine and such imprisonment.

(c) Any person who contravenes the prohibition on -

- (i) the interference with -
 - (aa) the exercise of a right referred to in regulation 6(5)(a)(i)¹⁰⁶;
 - (bb) a forest officer or an official of the Department referred to in regulation 6(5)(a)(ii)¹⁰⁷;
- (ii) the planting of weeds or invasive plants as set out in regulation 6(5)(b)¹⁰⁸,
- (iii) the burning of any live or dead tree, plant or vegetation, as set out in regulation 6(5)(c)¹⁰⁹,

is guilty of an offence and liable on a first conviction to a fine or imprisonment for a period not exceeding one year, or to both a fine and such imprisonment.

(d) Any person who contravenes the prohibition on the removal, destruction, defacement or interference with a mark, electronic chip or identification, as set out in regulation 9(4)¹¹⁰, is guilty of an offence and liable on a first conviction to a fine or imprisonment for a period not exceeding one year, or to both a fine and such imprisonment.

(e) Any person who contravenes the prohibition on the removal of trees, other forest produce and forest products, as set out in regulation 9(5)¹¹¹, is guilty of an offence and liable on a first

- (f) Any person who contravenes the prohibition on the processing of forest produce or forest products in a State forest, as set out in regulation 9(6)¹¹², is guilty of an offence and liable on a first conviction to a fine or imprisonment for a period not exceeding one year, or to both a fine and such imprisonment.
 - (g) Any person who contravenes the prohibition on the use of a road, as set out in regulation 14(3)¹¹³, is guilty of an offence and liable on a first conviction to a fine or imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months, or to both a fine and such imprisonment.
 - (h) Any person fails to submit information as requested in terms of regulation 26(1)¹¹⁴, is guilty of an offence and liable on a first conviction to a fine or imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months, or to both a fine and such imprisonment.
 - (i) Any person who contravenes the prohibition on the carrying on of activities under a servitude, as set out in regulation 28(2)¹¹⁵, is guilty of a an offence and liable on a first conviction to a fine or imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months, or to both a fine and such imprisonment.
- (3) Any person convicted for a second or subsequent offence –
- (a) under sub-regulation 2(a), (b), (g), (h) and (i) is liable to a fine or imprisonment for a period not exceeding one year, or to both a fine and such imprisonment.
 - (b) under sub-regulation 2(c), (d), (e), and (f) is liable to a fine or imprisonment for a period not exceeding two years, or to both a fine and such imprisonment.

This licence is -

- (a) not transferable (you cannot pass it on to another person),
- (b) only valid for the State forest and the period it was issued for, and,
- (c) unless otherwise stated, only valid between the hours of sunrise and sunset.

2. Showing this licence

You must produce this licence on demand to any forest officer or police officer.

3. Wildlife and vegetation

All wildlife and vegetation are protected - you must not disturb or remove any wildlife or vegetation from the State forest, unless authorised by this licence.

4. Plants, trees, rocks, graves or artwork

Plants, trees, rocks, graves or artwork (e.g. rock paintings) in State forests must not be damaged, defaced or desecrated by carving, scratching, marking or in any other way.

5. Litter, refuse and containers

You must not leave, throw away or drop any litter, refuse or empty containers in a State forest, except in refuse bins specially provided for that purpose.

6. Dogs and fire-arms

You must not bring any dogs and fire-arms into the State forest.

7. Smoking and fires

You must not smoke or light fires in the State forest, except in places set aside for that purpose.

8. Camping

You are only allowed to camp at places approved by the local forest officer.

9. Visits

Arrangements to visit the area must be made beforehand with the local forest officer.

10. Your legal responsibility for damage

As the licensee (person this licence is issued to), you are liable (legally responsible) for all damage to forest produce and other State property in the State forest caused

by -

- (a) your livestock,
- (b) lighting fires, or
- (c) other carelessness or neglect.

11. The amount of compensation for damage

The amount of damage to forest produce or State property will be agreed between you as the licensee and the Department. If no agreement is reached, a court will decide. You must pay the Department the amount agreed or decided by the court within 30 days of the agreement or court decision.

12. Indemnifying and compensating the State

As the licensee, you -

- (a) indemnify the State (legally free the State from responsibility) against all legal claims and court cases by any other person because of the way you carried out your rights under this licence, and
- (b) agree to compensate the State for any costs in opposing these claims and cases.

13. Use of roads and parking

As the licensee, you use departmental roads and parking facilities at your own risk. The State and any State employees will not be responsible in any way for any losses or injuries which you as the licensee or any other person suffers as a result of the use of departmental roads and parking facilities, even if these losses or injuries are caused by negligence.

14. The State's legal responsibility

The State is not liable for any damage to your property as the licensee by any of the State's officers, employees, vehicles or animals, resulting from -

- (a) any operations carried out by or on behalf of the State, or
 - (b) any other cause,
- unless this damage was caused through negligence by the State's employees in carrying out their normal duties.

Conditions for the felling of trees, removal and processing of timber; harvesting, collection, removal and processing of other forest produce and forest products, for sale at prescribed tariffs

[SECTION 24(2) OF ACT NO. 84 OF 1998]

1. All forest produce and products under this licence shall be inspected before removal from the State forest, and the licence endorsed accordingly, except where sanction to the contrary is given on the licence.
2. Only timber and other forest produce or forest products that have been designated for such purpose by a forest officer, may be felled, harvested, removed, or collected.
3. All trees shall be cut close to the ground to the satisfaction of a forest officer.
4. Forest produce or forest products may only be removed from the State forest during normal business hours on normal working days, or at such times on such working days, as determined by the Minister or his representative.
5. The Minister or his representative may place a mark, electronic chip or any other form of identification on any standing tree, other forest produce or products sold or for sale.
6. No person may remove, destroy, deface or otherwise interfere with the mark, electronic chip or other identification referred to in clause 5., unless they have the consent of a forest officer.
7. Under this licence, no person may remove any tree, forest produce or forest product from a State forest which has not been marked or otherwise identified by the Minister, unless for any reason it cannot be marked, and its removal is authorised by a forest officer.
8. No forest produce or forest product may be processed in a State forest, except in a place set aside for that purpose by a forest officer.
9. Any trees, other forest produce or forest products that must be marked or otherwise identified as referred to in clause 7., must be stacked or presented so that each tree, forest produce or forest product is easily and safely accessible to the forest officer.
