## DETERMINATION OF THE UPPER LIMIT OF THE SALARIES AND ALLOWANCES OF THE PREMIERS, MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCILS AND MEMBERS OF THE PROVINCIAL LEGISLATURES

- In terms of section 6(1) of the Remuneration of Public Office Bearers Act, 1998 (Act No. 20 of 1998) ("the Remuneration Act"), I hereby determine that the upper limit of the annual salaries and allowances of the various grades of the office bearers mentioned in Column 1 of the Schedule 1 and Schedule 2 shall be as set out in Columns 2, 3 and 4 of Schedule 1 with effect from 1 April 2003, subject to section 6(7)(a) and (b) of the Remuneration Act.
- Column 4 of the Schedule applies to a re-elected member who has occupied his or her current office, or an office in the same or a higher grade according to Column 1, for a period of at least 24 months in total, whether before or after 2 June 1999.
- Column 3 of the Schedule applies to all re-elected members other than those referred to in paragraph (2). When a re-elected member to whom Column 3 applies has held his or

her current office, or an office in the same or a higher grade according to Column 1, for a period of 24 months in total, Column 4 becomes applicable to that member.

- Column 2 of the Schedule applies to all members of Provincial Legislatures who are not re-elected members.
- 5. For the purpose of calculating the period of 24 months referred to in paragraphs (2) and (3), a re-elected member who
  - (i) was a member of Parliament or a Provincial Legislature on 1 June 1999; and
  - (ii) pursuant to the elections of 2 June 1999, was designated by the Electoral Commission as a member of the National Assembly or a Provincial Legislature, or appointed as a permanent delegate to the National Council of Provinces (NCOP) in terms of section 61(2)(b) of the Constitution,

is regarded to have continued to occupy the position occupied by him or her on 1 June 1999 until so designated or appointed.

6. In this Proclamation-

"member of Parliament" means a member of the National Assembly, a permanent delegate to the National Council of Provinces or a member of a Provincial legislature; and

"re-elected member" means a person -

- (i) who at any time before 2 June 1999 occupied an office mentioned in Column 1 and
- (ii) whose service in any one or more of those offices has not been interrupted at any time for a continuous period of more than 24 months."

- 7. In terms of section 6(4) of the Remuneration Act, I determine the amount of R40 000,00 per annum as that portion of the remuneration of an office bearer mentioned in Column 1 of the Schedule to which section 8(1)(d) of the Income Tax Act, 1962 (Act No. 58 of 1962), applies.
- 8. Except for the salaries and allowances provided for in this Proclamation, the office bearers mentioned in Column 1 of the Schedule are not entitled to any other remuneration, whether directly or indirectly, in respect of the offices held by them.
- 9. Proclamation No. 73 of 2002, published in Government Gazette No 23880 of 4 October 2002, is repealed.
