

**NOTICE 2574 OF 2003****INTERNATIONAL TRADE ADMINISTRATION COMMISSION OF SOUTH AFRICA****NOTICE OF TERMINATION OF AN INVESTIGATION INTO THE ALLEGED DUMPING OF CLEAR FLOAT GLASS ORIGINATING IN OR IMPORTED FROM INDONESIA**

The notice of initiation of this investigation was published in government Gazette No. 23015 dated 9 January 2002 (Notice No. 31 of 2002).

The Petitioner alleged that clear float glass (the subject product), originating in or imported from Indonesia, was being dumped into the Southern African Customs Union (SACU) market at export prices lower than the prices charged in the country of export thereby causing material injury and a threat of material injury to the domestic industry.

The investigation was only initiated on a threat of material injury as the International Trade Administration Commission of South Africa (the Commission) did not find that there was *prima facie* evidence that the SACU industry was suffering material injury.

Based on the information before it at the time of the final determination, the Commission found that the subject product originating in or imported from Indonesia was not being dumped into the SACU by the exporters that cooperated in the investigation. For those exporters who did not submit any information, the Commission calculated residual dumping margins for each of the product sizes. The Commission, however, found that as there was no significant rate of increase of these imports into the SACU, they did not constitute a threat of material injury to the SACU industry.

The Commission therefore made a final determination to recommend that the investigation be terminated.
