BOARD NOTICE 124 OF 2003

THE SOUTH AFRICAN PHARMACY COUNCIL

FEES PAYABLE TO THE COUNCIL UNDER THE PHARMACY ACT, 1974

In terms of section 4(zG) of the Pharmacy Act, 1974, as amended, and the Regulations Relating to the Registration of Persons and the Maintenance of Registers, the fees as determined by and payable to the Council for the year 2004 as set out in the Schedule hereto, are hereby published for the information of all relevant stakeholders.

The fees as set out in the Schedule include Value Added Tax (VAT) at 14%.

SCHEDULE

1. The following fees shall, under the Act, be payable to the Council by –
 - (1) a pharmacy student for –
 - (a) registration as a pharmacy student: R148.20;
 - (b) annual fees, payable not later than 1 June of each year by a 2nd, 3rd or 4th year pharmacy student: R84.36;
 - (2) a pharmacist intern for-
 - (a) registration as a pharmacist intern: R621.30;
 - (b) the cession of an internship contract from one pharmacy or provider to another, as the case may be: R274.74;
 - (c) entrance to the pre-registration evaluation for a second or subsequent attempt: R111.72;
 - (3) the prospective tutor of a pharmacist intern or pharmacist's assistant for the evaluation and approval of a pharmacy for purposes of an internship or in-service training to be undertaken at such pharmacy: R614.46;
 - (4) a pharmacist's assistant for-
 - (a) registration as a pharmacist's assistant (learner basic) or pharmacist's assistant (learner post-basic): R186.96;
 - (b) registration as a pharmacist's assistant (basic) or pharmacist's assistant (post-basic): R380.76;
 - (c) annual fees, payable not later than 1 June of each year by a pharmacist's assistant (learner basic) or a pharmacist's assistant (learner post-basic): R84.36;
 - (d) annual fees, payable not later than 1 June of each year by a pharmacist's assistant (basic) or pharmacist's assistant (post-basic): R186.96;

- (5) a pharmacist for-
 - (a) registration as a pharmacist: R614.46;
 - (b) the registration of an additional qualification or supplementary training: R295.26;
 - (c) entrance to an examination for registration of a speciality: R1081.86;
 - (d) the registration of a speciality: R810.54;
 - (e) annual fees, payable not later than 1 February of each year: R684.00;
- (6) a company which owns a pharmacy for-
 - (a) the issuing of a new registration certificate after the company has changed its name to the company: R77.52;
 - (b) the conversion of a company to a close corporation: R1,964.22;
- (7) a close corporation which owns a pharmacy for-
 - (a) the issuing of a new registration certificate after the close corporation has changed its name to the close corporation: R77.52;
 - (b) the conversion of a close corporation to a company: R1,964.22;
- (8) a Trust which owns a pharmacy for the issuing of a new registration certificate after the Trust has changed its name to the Trust: R77.52;
- (9) a pharmacy owner carrying on business as a pharmacist, for-
 - (a) the one-time recording of a new pharmacy: R984.96;
 - (b) the registration of the responsible pharmacist for each of the premises wherein or from which the pharmacy owner carries on the business of a pharmacist: R137.94;
 - (c) a pharmacy which is entered in the register in the category "community pharmacies" or "institutional pharmacies", an annual fee, payable not later than 2 January of each year: R844.74;
 - (d) a pharmacy which is entered in the register in the category "consultant pharmacies", an annual fee, payable not later than 2 January of each year: R767.22;
 - (e) a pharmacy which is entered in the register in the category "manufacturing pharmacies" or "wholesale pharmacies", an annual fee, payable not later than 2 January of each year: R4,378.74;
 - (f) the one-time recording of a pharmacy owner: R456.00;
 - (g) the responsible pharmacist of each of the premises wherein or from which the pharmacy owner carries on the business of a pharmacist an annual fee, payable not later than 2 January of each year: R100.32;
 - (h) the evaluation of a pharmacy for purposes of accreditation: R2,214.56;
 - (i) a duplicate certificate for the recording of a pharmacy or the registration of the responsible pharmacist or the recording of a pharmacy owner: R77.52;

- (10) a provider of pharmacy education and training in terms of section 33 (1) (b) of the Act for-
 - (a) the evaluation of an application for purposes of approval as a provider: R7,380.36;
 - (b) the one-time registration as a provider R767.22;
 - (c) annual fees, payable not later than 1 June of each year: R767.22;
 - (d) the approval of a short course: R738.72;
 - (e) the approval of a course leading to a qualification: R1,476.30;
- (11) an assessor in terms of section 33 (1) (l) of the Act for-
 - (a) the one-time registration as an assessor R188.10;
 - (b) annual fees, payable not later than 1 June of each year: R125.40;
- (12) any person lodging a Notice of Appeal in terms of the Regulations Relating to the Registration of Persons and the Maintenance of Registers against:
 - (a) a decision of Council, a committee of Council or the Registrar regarding his, her or its own registration, suspension or cancellation of registration: R2,755.55;
 - (b) a decision of Council, a committee of Council or the Registrar regarding the registration, suspension or cancellation of registration of a person other than the appellant: R13,794.00;
- (13) any person for-
 - (a) the issuing of a duplicate certificate of courses completed for the Council's Diploma in Pharmacy: R248.52;
 - (b) the issuing of a duplicate registration certificate or a certified extract from the register or certificate by the Registrar in terms of Section 27 of the Act: R274.74;
 - (c) entrance to the professional examination/evaluation as approved by Council for purposes of registration as a pharmacist (per paper): R738.72;
 - (d) analysis of examination results (per paper): R232.56;
 - (e) the issuing of a certificate of status: R759.24.

General

2. The Council may exempt any person from payment of any annual fee payable in terms of item (1) on the grounds of age or ill-health or other such circumstances as the Council may approve. The following reduced fees will be considered for-
- (1) pharmacists working part time (any occupation), that is less than 13 weeks per year or equivalent to an average of less than 2 days per week: R412.56;
 - (2) pharmacists' assistants (basic or post-basic) working part time (any occupation), that is less than 13 weeks per year or equivalent to an average of less than 2 days per week: R114.10;
 - (3) pharmacists aged 70 or older and who are retired: R87.78;
 - (4) pharmacists' assistants aged 70 or older and who are retired: R25.10;

3. Any annual fee payable by a person upon initial registration, may be calculated on a *pro rata* basis from the first day of the month in which such registration took place until 31 December of the year of such registration.
4. The following fees will be charged for the sale of registers, examination papers and the GPP document:
 - (a) Sale of registers – Pharmacists/Pharmacies: R495.90;
 - (b) Sale of registers – Wholesalers: R206.55;
 - (c) Sale of examination papers (per paper): R27.36;
 - (d) GPP document: R107.84;
 - (e) GPP document annexures (each): R43.89;
 - (f) Pre-registration guide: R111.72;
 - (g) Academic record and curriculum: R274.74.
5. Restoration fees are published annually by way of regulation.
