NATIONAL ROUTE 1: HUGUENOT TOLL ROAD: HUGUENOT TOLL PLAZA: PUBLICATION OF THE AMOUNTS OF TOLL FOR THE VARIOUS CATEGORIES OF MOTOR VEHICLES, AND THE DATE UPON AND THE TIME AT WHICH THE TOLL TARIFFS SHALL BECOME PAYABLE

The Head of the Department hereby, in terms of section 27 (3) (c) of The South African National Roads Agency Limited and National Roads Act, 1998 (Act No. 7 of 1998) [the Act], makes known that the amounts of toll which may be levied in terms of section 27 (1) (b) of the Act at the Huguenot Toll Plaza (located on the Huguenot Toll Road, declared in terms of Government Notice No. 17151 of 1996) and the date upon and time at which the amounts of toll shall become payable, have been determined by the Minister of Transport in terms of section 27 (3) (a) of the Act and that the said amounts shall be levied under section 27 (3) (b) and (d) thereof, as set out in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

1. DEFINITIONS:

- 1.1 "Motor vehicle" means an entity comprising of one or more mechanically powered units with or without any trailer(s) physically joined by means of tow bars, tow ropes or mechanical articulation, and includes-
 - (b) a motor cycle;
 - (c) a motor tricycle;
 - (d) a motor car;
 - (e) a vehicle which has pedals and a mechanically powered units as an integral part thereof or attached thereto and which is designed or adapted to be propelled by means of either such pedals or such mechanical unit or both; and
 - (f) a light delivery vehicle (a bakkie)
- 1.2 "Motor cycle" means a motor vehicle that has two wheels and includes any such vehicle having a sidecar attached thereto.
- 1.3 "Motor tricycle" means a motor vehicle, other than a motorcycle with a sidecar, which has three wheels and which is designed to be driven by means of the type of controls usually fitted to a motorcycle.
- 1.4 "Motor car" means a motor vehicle, other than a motorcycle or a motor tricycle, designed or adapted solely or principally for the conveyance of persons not exceeding sixteen (16) in number.
- "Light delivery vehicle" means a motor vehicle designed or adapted for the 1.5 conveyance of persons and freight with a tare not exceeding one comma five (1,5) ton and with no heavy axle as defined in paragraph 1.7 hereunder.
- "Axle" means a device or set of devices, whether continuous across the width 1.6 of the vehicle or not, about which the wheels of the vehicle rotate and which is so placed that, when the vehicle is travelling straight ahead, the vertical center-lines of such wheels are in one vertical plane at right angles to the longitudinal center-line of such vehicle.
- "Heavy axle" means an axle the wheels of which are fitted with tyres of a 1.7 size(bead seat diameter) greater than 406,4 millimetres (16 inches), or an axle with more than two (2) wheels irrespective of tyre size, but excluding any axle of a motor cycle, a motor tricycle or a motor car.
- 1.8 "Light vehicle" means a motor vehicle, other than heavy vehicles as defined hereunder.
- "Heavy vehicle" means a motor vehicle with at least one heavy axle and/ or a 1.9 motor vehicle exceeding a tare of one comma five (1,5) ton.
- "Abnormal vehicle" means a motor vehicle exceeding the legal dimensions 1.10 as described in the Road Traffic Act, 1989, or in any other law.

"Trailer" means a vehicle which is not self-propelled and which is designed or 1.11 adapted to be drawn by a motor vehicle but does not include a sidecar attached to a motor cycle.

CLASSIFICATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES: 2.

Class I: Light vehicles:

> Light vehicles are motor vehicles, other than heavy vehicles as defined hereunder, with or without a trailer, and include motor

cycles, motor cars and light delivery vehicles.

Class II: Medium heavy vehicles

Medium heavy vehicles are heavy vehicles with two axles.

Class III: Large heavy vehicles

Large heavy vehicles are heavy vehicles with three or four axles.

Class IV: Extra large heavy vehicles

Extra large heavy vehicles are heavy vehicles with five or more

axles.

AMOUNTS OF TOLL: 3.

The amounts of toll for the usage of the Huguenot Toll Road (or any part 3.1 thereof) is payable at the **Huguenot Toll Plaza** and shall be as follows:

CLASS I: R17.00 CLASS II: R43.00 CLASS III: R68.00 CLASS IV: R112.00

- FREQUENT USER DISCOUNTS AVAILABLE AT THE HUGUENOT 4. MAINLINE TOLL PLAZA:
- Frequent User Discounts on the toll tariff, for Class I motor vehicles only, are 4.1 granted on successful application to the appointed Toll Operator at the The following discounts are offered when a valid Huguenot Toll Plaza. "Frequent User Card", approved by The South African National Road Agency Limited, is tendered for payment at the Huguenot Mainline Toll Plaza for the usage of the Huguenot Toll Road (or a part thereof):
 - for 20 to 39 trips per single card during a calendar month 20% (a) discount; and
 - (b) for 40 and more trips per single card during a calendar month - 40% discount.
- HEAVY VEHICLE DISCOUNT AVAILABLE AT THE HUGUENOT TOLL 5. PLAZA:
- 5.1 A discount of five percent (5%) on the toll tariffs, for Class II, III; and IV (heavy vehicles) only, is granted, irrespective of the number of trips, when a

valid Credit Card (Visa- or Master Card), or a valid Fleet Management Card; is tendered for payment at the Huguenot Toll Plaza for the usage of the Huguenot Toll Road (or any part thereof).

- Information, documentation and application forms regarding Frequent User 6.1 Discount and related costs are available at the Huguenot Toll Plaza.
- The Huguenot Toll Road shall be open to traffic for 24 hours a day. 7.
- 8. The date upon and the time at which the said amounts of toll shall become payable at the Huguenot Toll Plaza shall be March 1, 2004 at 00H:00
