PROHIBITION ON THE MAKING OF FIRES IN THE OPEN AIR: WESTERN

CAPE

I, Arnold Michael Muller, Director General of Department of Water Affairs and

Forestry, hereby declare, in terms of section 25(1) of the Forest Act, 1984 (Act No. 122

of 1984) - that in my opinion -

State forests or private forests in the area the boundaries of which are indicated in the

Schedule hereto, are subject to extraordinary fire hazards and direct that in the said area

no person shall from 1 December 2004 up to and including 30 November 2005 make a

fire in the open air or, if such a fire has been made, allow it to continue to burn or add

fuel thereto, otherwise than -

(a) fires made within a demarcated picnic or camping area or caravan park or holiday

resort, but only at places within such a demarcated area as have been specifically

prepared and maintained for that purpose: Provided that such fires are properly

attended to:

(b) fires made for the purpose of preparing food or for any other domestic or customary

purpose on residential stands in proclaimed townships or homesteads in communal

areas or farms which are adequately protected against spreading and are properly

attended to; and

(c) for all other fires prior approval must be obtained from the relevant authorities, which

approval shall be applied for in writing.

SCHEDULE

That portion of the Cape Peninsula which is bounded by the sea from a point on the coast opposite the Muizenberg Railway Station along the coast around Cape Point to the mouth of the Salt River; thence in a straight line to the Salt River Railway Station; thence along the railway line across the Cape Flats to the Muizenberg Railway Station; thence in a straight line to the said point on the coast opposite the Muizenberg Railway Station, the point of beginning.
