NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY ACT, 1996 (ACT NO. 27 OF 1996) AND THE SOUTH AFRICAN SCHOOLS ACT, 1996 (ACT NO. 84 OF 1996) AS AMENDED

NATIONAL POLICY REGARDING FURTHER EDUCATION AND TRAINING PROGRAMMES: AMENDMENTS TO THE PROGRAMME REQUIREMENTS OF THE SENIOR CERTIFICATE AS CONTAINED IN THE POLICY DOCUMENT, A RESUME OF INSTRUCTIONAL PROGRAMMES IN SCHOOLS, REPORT 550 (2001/08)

- I Grace Naledi Mandisa Pandor Minister of Education, hereby, in terms of Sections 3(4)(1) and 7 of the National Education Policy Act, 1996 (Act No. 27 of 1996) and Sections 6(A) and 61 of the South African Schools Act, 1996 (Act. No. 84 of 1996), approve the following amendments to the programme requirements of the Senior Certificate as contained in the policy document, A resumé of instructional programmes in schools, Report 550 (2001/08):
- 1.1 Provisos to prevent the offering of Senior Certificate subjects with a substantial content overlap:
 - (a) **A** candidate may not offer more than one **of** Mathematics HG/SG, Commercial Mathematics SG or Functional Mathematics **SG**.
 - (b) **A** candidate may not offer both Physical Science HG/SG **and** Functional Physical Science SG.

- (c) A candidate may not offer more than one of Hotelkeeping- and Catering SG, Hospitality Studies SG, Reception Studies SG or Restaurant Studies SG.
- (d) Dance Performance SG will be restricted to those candidates offering Dance SG.
- **1.1.1** The provisos listed in paragraph **1.1** above will also be applicable to additional subjects, **i.e.** the seventh, eight subject, and will therefore not be printed on the Senior Certificate.

1.2 The following obsolete subjects will be phased out with immediate effect:

1.3 An amendment to the definition of an immigrant candidate:

1.3.1 The new definition of an immigrant candidate reads as **follows:**

An immigrant candidate is, for the purposes of these measures:

- **A.** A child, or a dependent **of** a diplomatic representative of a foreign government accredited in South Africa or
- **B.** Any person who -
 - (i) First entered a South African school in Grade 7 **or** a more senior grade; i.e. enrolled and attended a South African school, or

(ii) Having begun his or her schooling at a school in South Africa, has attended school outside South Africa for two or more consecutive years after Grade 6, or its equivalent.

In the case where two languages are required for certification, immigrant candidates as contemplated in <u>paragraphs A and B</u> above need to offer only one Official Language, provided that another instructional offering is offered in lieu of the one language that **is** not offered.

To be classified as an immigrant candidate, such a candidate must be in possession of

- B(i) The relevant official documentation issued by the Department of Home Affairs; and
- B(ii) The relevant official documentation issued by the school where the learner entered the South African school system for the first time.

1.4' A special concession regarding the offering of the Serbian Language *to* candidates from the Serbian community

The special concession regarding the offering of the Serbian Language to candidates from the Serbian community will be terminated with effect from **1** January 2005 in Grade 10.
