

NOTICE 2968 OF 2004
DEPARTMENT OF TRADE AND INDUSTRY
CONSUMER AFFAIRS (UNFAIR BUSINESS PRACTICES) ACT, 1988

I, Mandisi Mpahlwa, MP, Minister of Trade and Industry, after having considered a report by the Consumer Affairs Committee in relation to an investigation of which notice was given in Notice 1639 of 2002 published in *Government Gazette* No 23793 of 30 August 2002, which report was published in Notice 2967 in *Government Gazette* No 27125 of 20 December 2004, and being of the opinion that an unfair business practice exists which is not justified in the public interest, do hereby exercise my powers in terms of section 12 (1)(b) and 12(1)(c) of the Consumer Affairs (Unfair Business Practices) Act, 1988 (Act No. 71 of 1988), as set out in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE

In this notice, unless the context indicates otherwise -

1. "The parties" means Johannes Lodewyk Coetzee, also known as Johan Coetzee (ID 730819 5240 08 0), Johannes Lodewyk Coetzee, also known as Boet Coetzee (ID 420328 5016 08 1), Bennie de Bruin (ID 410929 5030 08 9) and Leonie Swart (ID 680614 0104 08 8).
2. "Unfair business practice" means the business practice whereby the parties, directly or indirectly,
 - (a) invite any persons to make investments in companies or close corporations in which they are shareholders or members;
 - (b) receive investment funds from investors for management or re-investment of such funds on behalf of the investors
 - (c) pay interest to previous investors from monies obtained from more recent investors.
3. The parties are hereby directed to:
 - (a) cease to commit the unfair business practice;

- (b) refrain from at any time applying the unfair business practice;
 - (c) cease to have any interest in a business or type of business which applies the unfair business practice or derive any income therefrom;
 - (d) refrain from at any time obtaining any interest in or deriving any income from a business or type of business specified in the notice.
4. The unfair business practice is hereby declared unlawful in respect of the patties.
5. This notice shall come into operation upon the date of the publication hereof.
