# INTERNATIONAL TRADE ADMINISTRATION COMMISSION OF SOUTH AFRICA

# NOTICE TO TERMINATE THE INVESTIGATION INTO THE ALLEGED DUMPING OF ALUMINIUM OVERHEAD CABLE ORIGINATING IN OR IMPORTED FROM INDIA

The notice of initiation of this investigation was published in *Government Gazette* No.25524 dated **10** October 2003 (Notice **No.** 2536 of **2003**).

The Applicant alleged that aluminium overhead cable (the subject product), originating in or imported from India was being dumped into the Southern African Customs Union (SACU) market at export prices lower than the prices charged in the country of export thereby causing material injury and a threat of material injury to the domestic industry.

The investigation was initiated on a basis of alleged dumping, material injury and  $\alpha$  threat of material injury, and causality.

Interested parties were notified of the initiation of the investigation and were sent questionnaires to complete.

On the information submitted, the Commission found that the subject product originating in or imported from India was not being dumped into the **SACU**.

The Commission made a preliminary determination to terminate the investigation into the alleged dumping of aluminium overhead cable originating or imported from India. The Commission's preliminary findings were communicated in the Commission's Report No.61 and the notice to terminate the investigation was published in the Government Gazette No. 26422 Notice 1054 of 2004 dated 1 June 2004.

Interested parties were given an opportunity to respond to the preliminary report.

After considering the comments made to the preliminary report and the essential facts letter, the Commission made a final determination to recommend to the Minister of Trade and Industry that the investigation into the alleged dumping of aluminium overhead cable originating or imported from India be terminated.

The detailed reasons for the Commission's decision are contained in the Commission's Report No. 81, which is available at the Commission's offices.


