PROVISIONAL PROTECTION OF THE HISTORICAL GREEN POINT BURIAL GROUND AS A HERITAGE RESOURCE

By virtue of the powers vested in the South African Heritage Resources Agency in terms of section **29** (1) of the National Heritage Resources Act no **25** of 1999 (the Act), read with section **29** (1) (a) (iii) of the Act , the properties fully described hereunder are hereby provisionally protected for a period of six months.

SCHEDULE

Descripfion

1. The area generally referred to as the Historical Green Point Burial Ground situated in the west city precinct of the City of Cape Town, South Africa.

Extent of site

The area of property proposed for provisional protection is:

From the corner of Strand and Bree Streets, northwest to Buitengracht Street, southwest to Longmarket Street, northwest to the top of Longmarket Street, northeast to a point just north of the Tana Baru Historical Burial Site and then in a straight line running southeast to the corner of Chiappini and Hout Streets. Then from there northeast to the corner of Chiappini and Strand Streets, then northwest to the intersection of Strand and Vos Streets, northeast to the intersection of Vos and Waterkant Streets, turning northwest on Waterkant and along a line that follows Waterkant, Rawbone and Braemar Roads to Upper Portswood Road. Then from there northeast along Portswood Road to intersect the historical coastline, and then southeast, past Jetty 1, following the historical coastline to and along the Old Dock Road to the Hans Strydom and Bree Streets intersection, and finally southwest along Bree Street to the corner of Strand and Bree Streets, including the street reserves.
