NATIONAL POLICY REGARDING FURTHER EDUCATION AND TRAINING PROGRAMMES: APPROVAL OF THE AMENDMENTS TO THE PROGRAMME AND PROMOTION REQUIREMENTS OF THE ENDORSED NATIONAL SENIOR CERTIFICATE

I, Grace Naledi Mandisa Pandor, Minister of Education, hereby, in terms of section 6(A) of the South African Schools Act, 1996 (Act. No. 84 of 1996), approve amendments and additions to paragraphs 10(1)(a)-(f) and 11 of the policy document, An addendum to the policy document, the National Senior Certificate: A qualification at Level 4 on the National Qualifications Framework (NQF), regarding learners with special needs respectively The amendments and additions are listed in the Schedule at Annexure A.

The amendments contained in the Schedule reflect: (a) the minimum outcomes and standards: and (b) the processes and procedures for the assessment of learner achievement as contained in the policy document, *An addendum to the policy document, the National Senior Certificate: A qualification at Level 4 on the National Qualifications Framework (NQF), regarding learners with special needs.*

The amendments and additions are applicable to both public and independent schools.

ANNEXURE A

SCHEDULE

Paragraph 10(1) (a)-(f): "An endorsed National Senior Certificate shall be issued to a candidate who experiences special needs who has achieved 30% in five subjects, one of which is an official language on at least First Additional Language level, provided that a complete portfolio of evidence in the school-based assessment component is submitted in the subject failed."

Paragraph 11(2): "Provisos as contemplated in paragraph 10 of the policy document, the National Senior Certificate: A qualification at Level 4 on the National Qualifications Framework (NQF), will also be applicable to the learners enrolling for the National Senior Certificate with endorsement for learners with special needs."
