## HEALTH PROFESSIONS ACT, 1974 (ACT NO.56 OF 1974)

# REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE QUALIFICATIONS FOR REGISTRATION OF EMERGENCY CARE PRACTITIONERS

The Minister of Health has, under section 24 read with section 61 (1) of the Health Professions Act, 1974 (Act No. 56 of 1974), and in consultation with the Health Professions Council of South Africa, to made the regulations in the Schedule.

### SCHEDULE

### Definitions

 In these regulations any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Act shall bear such meaning and, unless the context otherwise indicates –

"board" means the professional board for emergency care practitioners established in terms of section 15 of the Act;

"emergency care practitioner" means a person registered as such in terms of the Act;

"section" means a section of the Act;

"the Act" means the Health Professions Act, 1974, (Act 56 of 1974).

## Qualifications for registration of persons as emergency care practitioners

 The qualifications required for registration as emergency care practitioner under the Act shall be as follows:
