HEALTH PROFESSIONS ACT, 1974 (ACT NO. 56 OF 1974)

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE REGISTRATION OF STUDENTS DENTAL ASSISTANTS

The Minister of Health intends, under section 61(1)(a) of the Health Professions Act, 1974 (Act No. 56 of 1974), and in consultation with the Health Professions Council of South Africa, to make the regulations in the Schedule.

Interested persons are invited to submit substantiated comments or representations in writing on the proposed regulations to the Director-General: Health, Private Bag X828, Pretoria, 0001 (for the attention of the Director: Human Resource Stakeholder Relations and Management) within two months from date of publication of this Notice.

SCHEDULE

Definitions

 In these regulations any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Act, shall bear such meaning, and unless the context otherwise indicates -

"approved educational institution" means an education and training institution which has been granted recognition and approval by the board for the teaching and training of students in oral health following an evaluation process as determined by the board; **"board"** means the Professional Board for Dental Therapy and Oral Hygiene established in terms of section 15 of the Act;

"section" means a section of the Act;

"student" means a person registered as such under the Act;

"the Act" means the Health Professions Act, 1974 (Act No.56 of 1974)

Registration as a student dental assistant

- 2. A student at an approved educational institution or a person who has worked as a dental assistant without being registered prior to 31 March 2008 for a period of less than five years shall submit to the registrar an application for registration as a student dental assistant on a form provided by the board in accordance with the provisions of regulation 3, and -
 - (1) in the case of students commencing attendance at an approved educational institution, within four (4) months following such commencement; or
 - (2) in the case of persons who have worked as dental assistants prior to 31 March 2008 for a period of less than five years, within four (4) months from date of promulgation of these regulations.

Requirements for registration

- 3. An application by a student for registration as a student dental assistant shall be accompanied by-
 - (a) a certified copy of such student's identity or birth certificate or, if the student is unable to furnish either of these documents, such other proof of his or her age and correct names as may be acceptable to the registrar;
 - (b) a certificate to prove that such student has commenced study in a subject or subjects at an approved educational institution or in the case of an

(c) application by a person who has worked as a dental assistant for a period of less than five years, a certificate issued by the employer of such person to prove that such person has worked for the said period; and

(d) the prescribed registration fee.

4. A person registered as a student dental assistant in terms of regulation 2(2) must enrol for a formal qualification for registration as a dental assistant with an approved educational institution within a period of one year from date of registration as a student dental assistant, failing which, the registration as a student dental assistant shall lapse.
