GENERAL INFORMATION

The Board consists of no fewer than nine and no more than 12 members, Director-General or an official of the Department designated by the Director-General, and the Chief Executive Officer, and takes all decisions in the performance of the functions of South African National Parks, except those decisions taken in consequence of a delegation in terms of section 71 of the Act or where the Public Finance Management Act provides otherwise.

A member of the Board must be fit and proper person to hold office as a member and have appropriate qualifications or experience.

A person is disqualified from becoming or remaining a member of the Board if that person is holding office as a member of Parliament or a provincial legislature or has been removed from office in terms of section 65 of the Act.
