

SOUTH AFRICAN CITIZENSHIP ACT, 1995**FOURTEENTH AMENDMENT OF THE REGULATIONS MADE UNDER THE SOUTH
AFRICAN CITIZENSHIP ACT, 1995**

The Minister of Home Affairs has, in consultation with the Minister of Finance, under section 23(e) of the South African Citizenship Act, 1995 (Act No. 88 of 1995), hereinafter referred to as "the Act", made the regulations in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE**Definition**

1. In this Schedule "the Regulations" means the Regulations made under the South African Citizenship Act, 1995 (Act No. 88 of 1995), published under Government Notice No. R. 1794 of 17 November 1995, as amended by Government Notice Nos. R. 461 of 15 March 1996, R. 130 of 16 January 1998, R. 447 of 30 March 1998, R. 385 of 24 March 1999, R. 250 of 17 March 2000, R. 313 of 30 March 2001, R. 408 of 28 March 2002, R. 475 of 31 March 2003, R. 433 of 31 March 2004, R. 322 of 1 April 2005, R. 475 of 19 May 2006, R. 67 of 14 January 2008 and R. 345 of 27 March 2009.

Substitution of regulation 10 of the Regulations

2. The following regulation is hereby substituted for regulation 10 of the Regulations:

"Fees

10. The following fees are payable in the respective cases:

- (a) Issuing of a certificate of naturalization as a South African citizen in terms of section 5 of the Act.....R300-00;
- (b) Issuing of a duplicate citizenship certificateR90-00;
- (c) Issuing of a certificate or written confirmation in respect of the status of South African citizenship in terms of section 16 of the Act.....R90-00;
- (d) Application for the retention of South African citizenship in terms of section 6(2) of the Act.....R300-00;
- (e) Application for the resumption of South African citizenship, in terms of section 13 of the Act.....R300-00;
- (f) Application for exemption from the loss of South African citizenship in terms of section 26(4) of the Act.....R300-00."

Short title and commencement

3. These Regulations shall be called the Fourteenth Amendment of the Regulations made under the South African Citizenship Act, 1995, and shall come into operation on 1 April 2011.
