APPLICATION FOR VARIATION OF REGISTERED SCOPE OF A BARGAINING COUNCIL

I, Johannes Theodorus Crouse, Registrar of Labour Relations, hereby, in terms of section 58(1) of the Labour Relations Act, 1995, give notice that an application for the variation of its registered scope has been received from **The Bargaining Council for the Furniture Manufacturing Industry of the Western Cape**

Particulars of the application are reflected in the subjoined table.

Any person may object to the application on any or all of the following grounds:

- the applicant has not complied with the provisions of section 29 of the Act, read with the changes required by the context;
- (b) the sector and area in respect of which the application is made is not appropriate; and
- (c) the applicant is not sufficiently representative in the sector and area in respect of which the application is made.

Any person who objects must lodge his/her written objection with me, c/o the Department of Labour, Laboria House, 215 Schoeman Street, Pretoria (postal address: Private Bag X117, Pretoria, 0001), within 30 days of the date of this notice. A copy of the objection must be served on the applicant within the said period and I must be satisfied that a copy of the objection has been served on the applicant.

The applicant may respond to the objection within 14 days of the expiry of the 30-day period mentioned above and must satisfy me that a copy of the response has been served on the person who objected within the 14-day period.

Intention of the application

The intention of the application is to vary the scope of the sector and to change the reference to the areas without extending the jurisdictional area of the council.

Interest and area in respect of which the application is made:

The Furniture, Bedding, Upholstery and Curtain Manufacturing Industry, as defined hereunder, in the Provinces of Western Cape and Northern Cape, excluding the Magisterial Districts of George, Kynsna, Oudtshoorn, Mossel Bay and Plettenberg Bay.

"Furniture, Bedding, Upholstery and Curtain Manufacturing Industry" or "Industry" means, without in any way limiting the ordinary meaning of the expression, the industry in which employers and their employees are associated for the manufacture, either in whole or in part, of all types of components of furniture, furniture, bedding, curtains, upholstery and/or re-upholstery and will, inter alia, include but not be limited to the following:

(a) Furniture

Manufacturing, assembling, repairing, staining, spraying, polishing, re-polishing, making loose covers and/or cushions, wood machining, veneering, woodturning, carving, assembling, painting, spraying, cutting, edging, drilling, wood bending, laminating and/or papering/foiling, of board.

"Board" means any type of wood or wooden or related product or any other substitute material amongst others being: -laminated board, fibre board, chip board, block board, veneer board, pressed board.

Furniture manufacturing will also include the manufacturing, repairing, polishing, assembling, cutting, drilling, edging, re-polishing, staining, spraying either in whole or in part of: pianos, organs, kitchen cupboards, attached wall cupboards, built-in cupboards, free standing cupboards, bars or built-in bar counters, cane, wicker or grass furniture, cabinets including cabinets for

musical instruments and radios, wireless or television cabinets, coffins, draw and draw fronts, doors and cupboard doors irrespective of size, bathroom cupboards, cupboards tops and furniture for tea-rooms, restaurants, offices, churches, schools, libraries, hotels, other educational institutions, conference centres and theatres.

(b) Bedding

The manufacturing, assembling, repairing, covering, re-covering of mattress bases, mattresses, spring mattresses, overlays, bolsters, pillows, cushions for studio couches, spring units, box-spring mattresses sleeper couch and studio couches.

"Studio Couch" means an article of furniture, which is designed for seating and for conversion into a double bed or two or more beds and of which the frames are constructed mainly of metal and the seating and/or sleeping surfaces consist of mattresses and/or cushions.

(c) Upholstery

The upholstering or re-upholstering of any furniture, or item of furniture, bedding, seating, pelmets, mattress bases, foam mattresses and/or cushions.

(d) Curtain making

The making, altering, repairing and hanging of curtains and/or blinds made mainly of fabric, wood, cane, wicker, reed or grass. Curtain making includes window treatment, cutting of rails and rods, fitting of pelmets, curtains, blinds and associated products.

Sector and area(s) in respect of which registration is held:

The Furniture Manufacturing Industry, as defined hereunder, in respect of

- (i) the Magisterial Districts of Beaufort West, Bredasdorp, Caledon, Carnavon, Clanwilliam, Ceres, Fraserburg, Hopefield, Heidelberg, (Cape), Ladismith, Laingsburg, Malmesbury, Montagu, Namaqualand, Paarl, Piketburg, Prince Albert, Riversdale, Robertson, Simonstown, Somerset West, Stellenbosch, Sutherland, Swellendam, Tulbagh, Van Rhynsdorp, Victoria West, Wellington, Williston, Worcester, Barkly West, Britstown, De Aar, Gordonia, Herbert, Hay, Hopetown, Kenhardt, Kimberley, Kuruman, Philiptown and Prieska as those areas were constituted as at 8 August 1958, and
- (ii) the Magisterial Districts of Bellville, the Cape, and Wynberg as those areas were constituted as at 29 September 1983.

For the purpose of paragraphs (i) and (ii) above "Furniture Manufacturing Industry" means repairing, upholstering, re-upholstering, staining, spraying or polishing and/or repolishing, the making of loose covers and/or cushions and/or curtains and/or the making and/or repairing of boxspring mattresses and/or frames for upholstering, wood-machining, veneering, wood-turning, wood-caving in connection with the manufacture and/or repair of furniture, polishing and/or repolishing of pianos or the manufacture and/or staining, spraying, and polishing and/or repolishing of tearoom, office, church, school, bar or theatre furniture, and cabinets for musical instruments and radio or wireless or television cabinets and includes the manufacture or processes in the manufacture of bedding, the definition and interpretation of which includes all manner or types of mattresses, springmattresses, overlays, pillows, bolsters and cushions, and includes the activities carried on in any premises where woodmachining, wood-turning and/or carving in connection with the production of furniture is carried on; and includes further the repairing, re-upholstering or repolishing of furniture in or in connection with establishments in which the production of furniture or any operation associated with the final preparation of any article of furniture for sale either in whole or in part is carried on, and the veneering of laminated block-board or plywood doors used for furniture, and all parts of materials used in the construction of furniture, but excludes the manufacture of articles made principally of wicker, grass and/or cane, and the manufacture of metal furniture, including the manufacture of metal bedsteads.
