NOTIFICATION BY PRESIDENT IN RESPECT OF ENTITIES IDENTIFIED BY THE UNITED NATIONS SECURITY COUNCIL: SECTION 25 OF THE PROTECTION OF CONSTITUTIONAL DEMOCRACY AGAINST TERRORIST AND RELATED ACTIVITIES ACT, 2004

I, Jacob Gedleyihlekisa Zuma, President of the Republic of South Africa, hereby, in terms of section 25 of the Protection of Constitutional Democracy against Terrorist and Related Activities Act, 2004 (Act No. 33 of 2004), give notice that the Security Council of the United Nations, under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations, has amended the Lists reflected in the Annexures in respect of entities which have been identified as being -

- (a) entities who commit, or attempt to commit, any terrorist and related activity or participate in or facilitate the commission of any terrorist and related activity; or
- (b) entities against whom Member States of the United Nations must take the actions specified in the Resolutions of the said Security Council, in order to combat or prevent terrorist and related activities.

Decisions Taken Following Review of Delisting Requests Submitted Through Office of the Ombudsperson

On 2 January 2014, the Security Council Committee pursuant to resolutions 1267 (1999) and 1989 (2011) concerning Al-Qaida and associated individuals and entities removed the names of the individuals below from the Al-Qaida Sanctions List after concluding its consideration of the delisting requests for these names submitted through the Office of the Ombudsperson established pursuant to Security Council resolution 1904 (2009), and after considering the Comprehensive Reports of the Ombudsperson on these delisting requests.

Therefore, the assets freeze, travel ban and arms embargo set out in paragraph 1 of Security Council resolution 2083 (2012) no longer apply to the names set out below.

ANNEXURE B SECURITY COUNCIL AL-QAIDA SANCTIONS COMMITTEE ACTION REGARDING JABER ABDALLAH JABER AHMAD AL-JALAHMAH

On 3 January 2014, the Security Council Committee pursuant to resolutions 1267 (1999) and 1989 (2011) concerning Al-Qaida and associated individuals and entities decided that Jaber Abdallah Jaber Ahmad Al-Jalahmah (QI.A.237.08) should be included on the Al-Qaida Sanctions List.

Jaber Abdallah Jaber Ahmad Al-Jalahmah was originally included on the Al-Qaida Sanctions List on 16 January 2008, but had petitioned the Committee, through the Office of the Ombudsperson established pursuant to Security Council resolution 1904 (2009), for removal from the List. Following the presentation to the Committee by the Ombudsperson of her Comprehensive Report on this petition, the Committee received new information concerning recent support by Jaber Abdallah Jaber Ahmad Al-Jalahmah to Al-Qaida-related entities. This information was not available to the Ombudsperson at the time she delivered her report to the Committee and was not considered by the Committee when making its decision on the petition. Consequently, the Committee simultaneously approved the petition for removal from the List based on the Ombudsperson's report, and decided to re-list Jaber Abdallah Jaber Ahmad Al-Jalahmah based on the new information.

The Committee therefore approved the addition of the entry specified below to its Al-Qaida Sanctions List of individuals and entities subject to the assets freeze, travel ban and arms embargo set out in paragraph 1 of Security Council resolution 2083 (2012) adopted under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations:
