## ACT

To amend the Police Act, 1958, so as to prohibit members of the Reserve Police Force, only while serving in the Force, to take part in the activities of political parties or any other movements, organizations, bodies or associations with political objects, and to prohibit a member of Parliament from performing service in the Force as a member of the Reserve Police Force or Police Reserve; and to provide for matters connected therewith.

Amendment of section 35 of Act 7 of 1958, as inserted by section 2 of Act 55 of 1991

- 1. Section 35 of the Police Act, 1958, is hereby amended by the substitution for subsection (1) of the following subsection:
  - "(1) (a) No member of the Force, [including] excluding a member [of the Reserve Police Force whether or not while serving in the Force, but excluding a member] referred to in paragraph (b), may be a member of or take part in the activities of a political party (whether or not it is registered) or any other movement, organization, body or association with political objects, or stand for election as a member of, or serve on, an institution, council or body referred to in section 84(1)(f) of the Provincial Government Act, 1961 (Act No. 32 of 1961) (in this section referred to as a local authority).
- 15 (b) No member of the Reserve Police Force or Police Reserve may, while [serving] performing service in the Force, take part in the activities of such political party or any other movement, organization, body or association with political objects, or while he is a member of Parliament perform service in the Force.".

#### 20 Short title and commencement

2. This Act shall be called the Police Second Amendment Act, 1992, and shall come into operation on a date fixed by the State President by proclamation in the Gazette.
