ADJUSTMENTS APPROPRIATION ACT, 2009

(English text signed by the President.) (Assented to 26 November 2009.)

ACT

To appropriate adjusted amounts of money from the National Revenue Fund for the requirements of the State in respect of the financial year ending 31 March 2010; and to provide for matters incidental thereto.

PREAMBLE

WHEREAS section 213(2) of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996, provides that money may be withdrawn from the National Revenue Fund only in terms of an appropriation by an Act of Parliament;

WHEREAS the Appropriation Act, 2009 (Act No. 16 of 2009), provides for the appropriation of money from the National Revenue Fund to provide for the requirements of the State in respect of the 2009/10 financial year;

AND WHEREAS section 30 of the Public Finance Management Act, 1999 (Act No. 1 of 1999), provides for adjustments to be effected to the amounts of money appropriated in an Appropriation Act,

E IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Parliament of the Republic of South Africa, as follows:---

Interpretation

1. In this Act, unless the context indicates otherwise, any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Appropriation Act, 2009 (Act No. 16 of 2009), or the Public Finance Management Act, has the meaning assigned to it in those Acts.

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Appropriation of adjusted amounts of money for requirements of State

- 2. (1) Adjusted appropriations by Parliament of money from the National Revenue Fund for the requirements of the State in respect of the 2009/10 financial year to votes and main divisions within a vote, and amendments to the aims and purposes specified, 10 are set out in Schedule 2 to this Act.
- (2) The spending of appropriations contemplated in subsection (1) is subject to the Public Finance Management Act.

Appropriation listed as specifically and exclusively

3. Despite the provisions of any law, appropriations to a vote or main division within 15 a vote that are listed as specifically and exclusively appropriated in Schedule 2 may only be utilised for the purpose indicated, and may not be used for any other purpose, unless an Act of Parliament amends or changes the purpose for which it was allocated.

ADJUSTMENTS APPROPRIATION ACT, 2009

Conditional expenditure

- 4. (1) The Minister may—
 - (a) impose conditions in respect of an appropriation listed as specifically and exclusively appropriated in Schedule 2, in order to promote and enforce transparency and effective management in respect of revenue, expenditure, assets and liabilities of departments, public entities and constitutional institutions contemplated in section 6(1)(g) of the Public Finance Management Act; and
 - (b) stop any allocation in terms of such appropriation until any condition imposed by the Minister is met.

(2) An amount stopped in terms of subsection (1)(b) must be included in the National Treasury's next statement of actual revenue and expenditure in terms of section 32(1) of the Public Finance Management Act.

Utilisation of saving

- 5. Notwithstanding section 43(4) of the Public Finance Management Act, the National 15 Treasury may approve the utilisation of a saving in—
 - (a) an amount appropriated for transfer to another institution or to an organisation or body outside of government; or
 - (b) an amount appropriated for payments for capital assets, if the saving is to be utilised for other categories of expenditure.

Allocations for and expenditure by newly created departments

- **6.** (1) The votes listed in column 2 of Schedule 1 contain the allocations for departments listed in column 1 of Schedule 1.
- (2) In addition to complying with the requirements of the Public Finance Management Act and the Treasury Regulations, expenditure by departments listed in 25 column 1 of Schedule 1 must be in accordance with—
 - (a) any applicable Proclamations that may be issued by the President;
 - (b) any regulations or instructions that may be issued by the National Treasury in terms of section 76 of the Public Finance Management Act;
 - (c) any regulations that the Minister may prescribe in terms of this Act; and 30
 - (d) the terms of agreements regarding the approval of expenditure, accountability for expenditure, and the allocation of responsibilities in terms of the Public Finance Management Act, that must be entered into between the—
 - (i) executive authorities; and
 - (ii) accounting officers,

of departments whose allocations are included within the same vote that is listed in column 2 of Schedule 1.

- (3) Copies of the agreements referred to in subsection (2)(d) must be provided by departments listed in column 1 of Schedule 1 to the National Treasury by not later than 31 December 2009.
- (4) Despite the provisions of any law, including this Act, expenditure in respect of budget votes listed in column 2 of Schedule 1 does not constitute unauthorised expenditure in terms of the Public Finance Management Act by virtue only of the fact that expenditure by or for departments listed in column 1 of Schedule 1 may not be in accordance with the specified purpose of the budget vote or the purpose of the main 45 division of the budget vote.

Regulations

- 7. The Minister may, by notice in the Gazette, make regulations regarding—
 - (a) anything which may be prescribed in terms of this Act; and
 - (b) any ancillary or incidental administrative or procedural matter that it is 50 necessary to prescribe for the proper implementation or administration of this Act.

Short title

8. This Act is called the Adjustments Appropriation Act, 2009.
