# ACT

**To provide for the appropriation of money from the National Revenue Fund for the requirements of the State in the 2007/08 financial year; and to provide for matters incidental thereto.**

## PREAMBLE

**WHEREAS** section 213(2) of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996, provides that money may be withdrawn from the National Revenue Fund only in terms of an appropriation by an Act of Parliament;

**AND WHEREAS** section 26 of the Public Finance Management Act, 1999 (Act No. 1 of 1999), provides that Parliament must appropriate money for each financial year for the requirements of the State,

**BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED** by the Parliament of the Republic of South Africa, as follows:—

## Definitions

**1.** In this Act, unless the context indicates otherwise, any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in section 1 of the Public Finance Management Act has the meaning assigned to it in that Act, and—

“**conditional grants**” means conditional allocations to provinces, local government or municipalities from the national government’s share of revenue raised nationally, contemplated in section 214(1)(c) of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996;

“**current payments**” means any payment made by a national department in respect of the operational requirements of that department, and includes payments for—

- (a) compensation of employees;
- (b) goods and services;
- (c) interest;
- (d) rental of immovable property; and
- (e) financial transactions relating to assets and liabilities,

but excludes—

- (i) transfers and subsidies;
- (ii) payments for capital assets and
- (iii) payments made under section 73 of the Public Finance Management Act;

“**payments for capital assets**” means any payment made by a national department—

- (a) for an asset that can be used continuously or repeatedly in production for more than one year, and which is expected to have future economic benefits or service potential for the national department making the payment; and
- (b) that must be classified as or deemed to be a payment for capital assets in accordance with the *Reference Guide to the new Economic Reporting Format* (November 2003, Version 2) and the *Asset Management Framework* (April 2004, Version 3.3), issued by the National Treasury under section 76 of the Public Finance Management Act;

**“Public Finance Management Act”** means the Public Finance Management Act, 1999 (Act No. 1 of 1999);

**“transfers and subsidies”** means any payment made by a national department to another organ of state or to a person or organisation outside government in respect of which the national department does not receive a direct benefit of similar value in return, and includes the payment of conditional grants. 5

#### **Appropriation of money for requirements of State**

2. (1) Appropriations by Parliament of money from the National Revenue Fund for the requirements of the State in the 2007/08 financial year, to votes and main divisions within a vote, and for the specific listed purposes, are set out in the Schedule. 10

(2) The spending of appropriations contemplated in subsection (1) is subject to the Public Finance Management Act.

#### **Appropriation listed as specifically and exclusively**

3. Despite the provisions of any law, an appropriation to a vote or main division within a vote that is listed as specifically and exclusively appropriated in the Schedule, unless an Act of Parliament amends or changes the institution to or purpose for which it was allocated, may only be— 15

- (a) transferred to the identified institution; or
- (b) utilised for the indicated purpose.

#### **Short title**

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4. This Act is called the Appropriation Act, 2007.
