Appropriation of amounts of money for requirements of State

1. Subject to the Public Finance Management Act, 1999 (Act No. 1 of 1999), there are hereby appropriated out of the National Revenue Fund for the requirements of the State in respect of the financial year ending 31 March 2003, the amounts of money shown in the Schedule.
