**EXPLOSIVES AMENDMENT ACT, 1983** 

### **GENERAL EXPLANATORY NOTE:**

## ACT

To amend the Explosives Act, 1956, so as to prohibit the possession of petrol bombs and similar devices under certain circumstances.

(English text signed by the State President.) (Assented to 4 March 1983.)

BE IT ENACTED by the State President and the House of Assembly of the Republic of South Africa, as follows:—

1. Section 28 of the Explosives Act, 1956, is hereby amended by the addition of the following subsection, the existing section becoming subsection (1):

"(2) For the purposes of subsection (1) 'explosive' in-

cludes-

1983.

(a) a petrol bomb;

(b) any container, apparatus, instrument or article which—

(i) contains any inflammable substance and can be 10 used, or can be adapted so that it can be used, to cause an explosion or a fire; or

(ii) was made, or can be adapted, to cause, in combination with or by means of any inflammable substance, an explosion or a fire.".

2. This Act shall be called the Explosives Amendment Act,
