OCCUPATIONAL DISEASES IN MINES AND WORKS AMENDMENT ACT, 1980

To amend the provisions of the Occupational Diseases in Mines and Works Act, 1973, so as to provide for the further increase of benefits and special awards.

(Afrikaans text signed by the State President.) (Assented to 12 June 1980.)

RE IT ENACTED by the State President, the Senate and the House of Assembly of the Republic of South Africa, as follows:---

1. (1) Subject to the provisions of subsection (2), a benefit as Increase of 5 defined in section 1, and a special award referred to in section 101 benefits and or 115, of the Occupational Diseases in Mines and Works Act, 1973 (Act No. 78 of 1973) (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act), which are payable in terms of the principal Act but have not yet been paid, and which were increased by the Occupational

10 Diseases in Mines and Works Amendment Act, 1974 (Act No. 67 of 1974), the Occupational Diseases in Mines and Works Amendment Act, 1975 (Act No. 45 of 1975), the Occupational Diseases in Mines and Works Amendment Act, 1977 (Act No.

117 of 1977), and the Occupational Diseases in Mines and Works 15 Amendment Act, 1979 (Act No. 83 of 1979), shall be further increased with effect from 1 July 1980—

in the case of any such benefit, by ten per cent; (a)

in the case of a special award referred to in section 101 (b) of the principal Act, by an amount which the com-missioner may in his discretion determine, but not exceeding ten per cent of any such special award payable immediately prior to 1 July 1980; and

in the case of a special award referred to in section 115 (C) of the principal Act, by an amount which the authority referred to in that section may in its discretion determine

in accordance with the availability of moneys in the Fund referred to in that section not required for the payment of benefits under the principal Act or this Act:

Provided that any such benefit or special award so increased shall 30 be calculated to the next complete rand.

(2) The provisions of this section shall not apply with reference to any one-sum benefit, as defined in section 1 of the principal Act, to which a person became entitled before 1 July 1980.

2. This Act shall be called the Occupational Diseases in Mines Short title. 35 and Works Amendment Act, 1980.
