PETITION PROCEEDINGS REPLACEMENT ACT, 1976. Act No. 35, 1976

# ACT

To provide for the replacement of petition proceedings in courts of law.

*(English text signed by the State President.)  
(Assented to 19 March 1976.)*

**BE IT ENACTED** by the State President, the Senate and the House of Assembly of the Republic of South Africa, as follows:-

1. As from the commencement of this Act any reference in any law to the institution of application proceedings in any court by petition, shall be construed as a reference to the institution of such proceedings by notice of motion in terms of the rules regulating the conduct of the proceedings of such court. Construction of certain references to petition proceedings.

2. This Act shall be called the Petition Proceedings Replacement Act, 1976, and shall come into operation on 1 July 1976. Short title and commencement.
