ACT

To provide for the passing of the assets, rights, liabilities and obligations of the Cape Town General Board of Aid to the State; to repeal certain laws; and to provide for incidental matters

(English text signed by the State President.) (Assented to 11th April, 1973.)

BE IT ENACTED by the State President, the Senate and the House of Assembly of the Republic of South Africa, as follows:—

Passing of assets, rights, liabilities and obligations of the Cape Town General Board of Aid to the State.

- 1. (1) As from the date of commencement of this Act all assets, rights, liabilities and obligations of the Cape Town General Board of Aid established under section 25 of the Poor Relief and Charitable Institutions Ordinance, 1919 (Ordinance No. 4 of 1919 of the Cape of Good Hope), and all assets, rights, liabilities and obligations which, but for the provisions of this Act, would have vested in or devolved upon the said Board, shall vest in the State, and any reference in any law or document to the said Board shall be construed as a reference to the State.
- (2) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any law contained, any document required to be executed by the transferor for the purposes of transferring to the State any assets or rights vested in the State in terms of subsection (1), shall be deemed to have been so executed if it is executed by a person authorized thereto by the Minister of Social Welfare and Pensions.

Repeal of laws.

2. The laws mentioned in the Schedule are hereby repealed to the extent set out in the third column of the Schedule.

Short title and commencement.

3. This Act shall be called the Poor Relief and Charitable Institutions Ordinance, 1919 (Cape) Amendment Act, 1973, and shall come into operation on a date fixed by the State President by proclamation in the *Gazette*.
