To amend the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1966, so as to increase the maximum earnings in respect of which contributions are payable; and to provide for incidental matters.

> (Afrikaans text signed by the State President.) (Assented to 3 March 1978.)

BE IT ENACTED by the State President, the Senate and the House of Assembly of the Republic of South Africa, as follows:-

1. Section 2 of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1966, is Amendment of 5 hereby amended by the substitution for paragraph (d) of $\frac{1}{4}$ of $\frac{1}{4}$ subsection (2) of the following paragraph:

"(d) persons whose rate of earnings calculated in the manner section 1 of set out in section 50 exceeds [six thousand seven Act 27 of 1967, hundred and sixty] eight thousand four hundred rand a section 1 of Act 87 of 1968, year and, in the case of Bantu, does not exceed five section 1 of hundred and forty-six rand a year; or".

Act 30 of 1966, as amended by Act 61 of 1971, section 1 of Act 12 of 1974 and section 1 of Act 51 of 1975.

2. This Act shall be called the Unemployment Insurance Short title and Amendment Act, 1978, and shall come into operation on a date to commencement. be fixed by the State President by proclamation in the Gazette.
