SECOND COLOURED PERSONS EDUCATION AMENDMENT ACT, Act No. 95, 1976

To amend the provisions of the Coloured Persons Education Act, 1963, so as to provide for the continued provision of education to certain Coloured persons; and to provide for incidental matters.

BE IT ENACTED by the State President, the Senate and the House of Assembly of the Republic of South Africa, as

1. Section 1 of the Coloured Persons Education Act, 1963, Amendment of is hereby amended-

(a) by the substitution in subsection (1) for the definition as amended by

of "Coloured person" of the following definition:

section 1 of
"Coloured person' means a person classified under the Act 76 of 1967 and section 1 of Population Registration Act, 1950 (Act No. 30 o Act 53 of 1973, 1950), as a member of the Cape Coloured, Malay, Griqua or Other Coloured Group and includes any South African citizen having his home in an independent State and who would have been so classified had the provisions of the Population Registration Act, 1950, been applicable to him;";

by the insertion in subsection (1) after the definition of "home" of the following definition:

"independent State' means a territory which formed part of the Republic and became an independent State in terms of an Act of Parliament;".

2. This Act shall be called the Second Coloured Persons Short title and Education Amendment Act, 1976, and shall come into opera-commencement. tion on the date of commencement of the Status of the Transkei Act, 1976.
