## NATIONAL MONUMENTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1970.

Act No. 22, 1970

**ACT**

**To amend the National Monuments Act, 1969, in order to provide for the expropriation of certain land.**

*(English text signed by the State President.)  
(Assented to 3rd March, 1970.)*

**BE IT ENACTED** by the State President, the Senate and the House of Assembly of the Republic of South Africa, as follows:—

1. The following section is hereby inserted in the National Monuments Act, 1969, after section 14:

“Expropriation of land.

**14A.** (1) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any law contained, the Minister of Agriculture may, at the request of the council, and in consultation with the Minister, expropriate for the benefit of the council any land declared or about to be declared under this Act to be a national monument, provided the council has satisfied the Minister that it is unable to acquire such land on reasonable terms.

(2) The provisions of the Expropriation Act, 1965 (Act No. 55 of 1965), shall *mutatis mutandis* apply in respect of the expropriation of any land in terms of subsection (1).

(3) If the Minister of Agriculture expropriates land as aforesaid for the benefit of the council, the council shall become the owner thereof and the expropriation notice of the Minister of Agriculture shall be deemed to authorize the registrar of deeds concerned to register the transfer of such land to the council.

(4) All costs lawfully incurred by the said Ministers in the execution of their duties in terms of this section, shall be refunded to them by the council.”

Insertion of section 14A in Act 28 of 1969.

2. This Act shall be called the National Monuments Amendment Act, 1970. Short title.
