PARLIAMENTARY AND PROVINCIAL MEDICAL AID SCHEME ACT, 1975

## ACT

To provide for compulsory membership of the Parmed Medical Aid Scheme of members of certain legislative bodies and of certain other persons; to provide for the deduction of contributions payable to the said medical aid scheme from the salaries payable to certain persons; to repeal the Parliamentary Medical Aid Scheme Act, 1974; and to provide for incidental matters.

#### (English text signed by the Acting State President.) (Assented to 14 April 1975.)

**BE IT ENACTED** by the State President, the Senate and the House of Assembly of the Republic of South Africa, as follows:—

1. Every person who is or becomes-

- (a) while not being a member of either the Senate or the House of Assembly, a Minister or Deputy Minister;
- (b) an Administrator of a province or the Administrator of the territory of South West Africa;
- (c) a member of the Senate, of the House of Assembly, of the provincial council of a province or of the Legislative Assembly of the territory of South West Africa;
- (d) while not being a member of a provincial council, a member of the executive committee of a province or, while not being a member of the Legislative Assembly of the territory of South West Africa, a member of the Executive Committee of the said territory,

shall, for as long as he holds that office or post, be a member of the Parmed Medical Aid Scheme, subject to the rules of that medical aid scheme as registered in accordance with the provisions of the Medical Schemes Act, 1967 (Act No. 72 of 1967).

2. (1) There shall be deducted monthly from the salary payable to any person—

- (a) holding any office or post mentioned in section 1; or
- (b) who, after ceasing to hold any such office or post, has continuously remained a member of the Parmed Medical Aid Scheme, and at any time after so ceasing to hold such office or post, holds any other office or post in respect of which a salary is paid to him by the State (including any provincial administration or the administration of the territory of South West Africa),

an amount equal to the amount which is payable by such person, on payment to him of the said salary, in respect of contributions in terms of the rules of the Parmed Medical Aid Scheme.

(2) An amount so deducted shall be paid to the manager of the said medical aid scheme,

3. (1) The Parliamentary Medical Aid Scheme Act, 1974, is hereby repealed.

#### PARLIAMENTARY AND PROVINCIAL MEDICAL AID SCHEME ACT, 1975

(2) Anything done, or deemed to have been done, under the provisions of the said Act, shall be deemed to have been done under the corresponding provisions of this Act.

Short title and commencement.

4. This Act shall be called the Parliamentary and Provincial Medical Aid Scheme Act, 1975, and shall be deemed to have come into operation on 1 April 1975.
