ACT

To empower an administrator of a province to acquire, in certain circumstances, a piece of land or portion of a piece of land traversed but not occupied by a public road, and to provide for matters incidental thereto.

(English text signed by the State President.)
(Assented to 11th May, 1964.)

BE IT ENACTED by the State President, the Senate and the House of Assembly of the Republic of South Africa, as follows:—

1. (1) If a public road traverses a piece of land and the executive committee of the province in question is of opinion that it is in the public interest or that justice as against the owner in question demands that such portion of the said piece of land as is not occupied by such road, or any part of such portion, and any interest in such portion or part be acquired from such owner on behalf of the State, the administrator of such province may, subject to the provisions of sub-section (2), so acquire it.

(2) If the administrator and the owner in question are unable to agree on the conditions of the acquisition in terms of sub-section (1) of any land or any interest in land, the laws relating to the expropriation of land for public purposes in force in the province in question, shall *mutatis mutandis* apply in respect of such acquisition, and if in any province no such laws are in force, the Expropriation of Lands and Arbitration Clauses Proclamation, 1902 (Proclamation No. 5 of 1902 of the Transvaal), shall in such province so apply in respect thereof.

2. This Act shall be called the Extension of Powers of Executive Committees and Administrators Act, 1964. Short title.
