POLICE AMENDMENT ACT, 1970.

Act No. 80, 1970

To amend the provisions of the Police Act, 1958, relating to regulations.

> (English text signed by the State President.) (Assented to 29th September, 1970.)

BE IT ENACTED by the State President, the Senate and the House of Assembly of the Republic of South Africa, as follows:-

1. Section 33 of the Police Act, 1958, is hereby amended by Amendment of the substitution for paragraph (b)bis of subsection (1) of the Section 33 of Act 7 of 1958, as following paragraph:

"(b)bis the establishment, management and control of funds section 8 of to provide for medical, dental and hospital treatment Act 53 of 1961 of members of the Force who have retired or retire on and section 19 of pension, and their families and of the families of Act 64 of 1964. members of the Force who have died or die, the class of members of the Force or other persons who shall be or may become members of any particular fund, the scale or aggregate amount of contributions (if any) to be made to a fund by any particular class of members thereof, the termination of membership of a fund, the rights, privileges and obligations of members of a fund, and generally all matters reasonably necessary for the regulation and operation of a fund;".
