HEALTH PROFESSIONS ACT, 1974 (ACT NO.56 OF 1974)

REGULATIONS REALTING TO QUALIFICATIONS WHICH ENTITLE MEDICAL LABORATOTRY SCIENTISTS TO REGISTRATION

The Minister of Health has, under Section 24 of the Health Professions Act, 1974 (ACT NO.56 of 1974) and on the recommendation of the Health Profession Council of South Africa, made the regulation in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE

Definitions

- 1. In this regulations, "ACT "means the Health Professions Act, 1974 (ACT NO.56 OF 1974) and any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the ACT has the meaning so assigned and, unless the context otherwise indicate-
- "Professional Board" means the Professional Board for Medical Technology established in terms of Section 15 of the Act;
- "Medical Laboratory Scientist" means a person who is registered as such in terms of the Act

Qualification

2. The following qualification, provided it is obtained in medical technology, shall entitle the holder thereof to registration, as a medical laboratory scientist, in one or more of the categories of clinical pathology, clinical chemistry, haematology, microbiology, immunohaematology, cytology, histology, immunology, virology, cytogenetics, pharmacology,

and forensic science: Provided that such person has completed a four year course in one or more of the categories in which registration is sought.
