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POLICY: CRITERIA FOR REGISTRATION OF PERSONS WITH QUALIFICATIONS OBTAINED OUTSIDE OF THE REPUBLIC OF SOUTH AFRICA: HOMEOPATHY, NATUROPATHY AND PHYTOTHERAPY

The Allied Health Professions Council of South Africa, after due consideration and in consultation with the Professional Board:, Homeopathy, Naturopathy and Phytotherapy has resolved that the criteria for the registration of persons with qualifications obtained outside of the Republic of South Africa in the professions Homeopathy, Naturopathy and Phytotherapy, shall be as Addendum A of this notice.

POLICY – CRITERIA FOR REGISTRATION OF PERSONS WITH QUALIFICATIONS OBTAINED OUTSIDE OF SOUTH AFRICA – HOMEOPATHY, NATUROPATHY AND PHYTOTHERAPY

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Purpose of policy

To ensure the continued consistent and objective review of applications received for registration under the registers for Homeopathy, Naturopathy and Phytotherapy, where the qualification was obtained outside of South Africa and to provide criteria for the holding of an AHPCSA board examination for persons holding such qualifications to determine competency to enter said professions.

1. General requirements for all applications

- i. Completed official application form, together with the applicable application fee and all supporting documentation as required by the application form not specifically mentioned below as additional requirements;
- ii. Copy of South African identity document, or copy of valid foreign passport together with a valid work permit that entitles the person to practice any of the said professions in South Africa either under the terms and conditions of employment or in private practice¹;
- iii. All documents must be certified and the AHPCSA holds the right to call for all original documents in terms of Section 15 of the Act²;
- iv. Any documents submitted in any language other than English must include a sworn translation of the content of the document in English;
- v. All applications must be submitted to the office of the AHPCSA Registrar.

2. Additional Documentation required

- i. Copy of qualification/s in Homeopathy, Naturopathy or Phytotherapy from an accredited institution of education and training;
- ii. Copy of complete academic record for the full duration of studies;
- iii. SAQA Certificate of Evaluation recognising the legal status of the institution of education and training <u>and</u> evaluation of the qualification/s as equivalent to: in the case of Naturopathy or Phytotherapy, an NQF level equal to or above the BSc in Complementary Health Science and a Bachelor of Complementary Medicine (Naturopathy or Phytotherapy); and, in the case of Homeopathy an NQF level equal to or above the South African Master's degree of Technology in Homeopathy;
- iv. Proof of registration with the relevant foreign statutory body;
- v. Original letter of good standing from relevant registering statutory body, which letter must state that the applicant does not have any pending disciplinary proceedings against them or been sanctioned in terms of any disciplinary proceedings. The letter of good standing shall not be older than 3 months;
- vi. Police Clearance Certificate from the relevant foreign country of origin of the applicant;
- vii. If the qualification is older than 5 years the applicant must provide a brief curriculum vitae, in order to establish whether the applicant has been practicing any of the said professions and thereby has kept up to date with the practice and the profession.

¹ In the event of a person not being able to obtain a work permit prior to registration, the Council will provide a letter for such purpose should the applicant meet all the requirements for registration.

3. Application Procedure

- i. Only applications which provide all the details as contained above shall be submitted to the Professional Board for review;
- ii. The AHPCSA Administration will conduct the relevant confirmatory check in respect of work permits with the Department of Home Affairs;
- iii. Applications will be circulated to the Professional Board in .pdf format by way of email to determine suitability for the AHPCSA board examination;
- iv. A combined decision of the Professional Board will be forwarded to the Administration;
- v. If approved, the applicant will be required to successfully complete a board examination, consisting of a clinical competency examination and a written theoretical examination, which will be conducted by the University of the Western Cape for either Phytotherapy or Naturopathy; in the case of Homeopathy the board examination will be conducted by either the University of Johannesburg or the Durban University of Technology;
- vi. Such referral shall be in terms of a Memorandum of Understanding between the Council and the said institutions of education and training. The costs of the assessment shall be for the account of the applicant.
- vii. On successful completion of the board examination the applicant will receive registration, after completing the AHPCSA's Jurisprudence Assessment, which assessment will be managed by the AHPCSA Administration and the production of a valid First Aid certificate from a service provider accredited with the South African Department of Labour.

4. Applicants who are unable to meet or fail to meet any criteria as stated in paragraphs 2 and 3 above

In the event of:

- i. The evaluation of the institution of education and training by the SAQA is such that the institution is deemed to lack legal standing in the country of origin; or
- ii. The SAQA Certificate of Evaluation is not evaluated equivalent to or higher than the relevant NQF level; or
- iii. There is failure to meet any other requirement as indicated above,

then the application shall be rejected.
