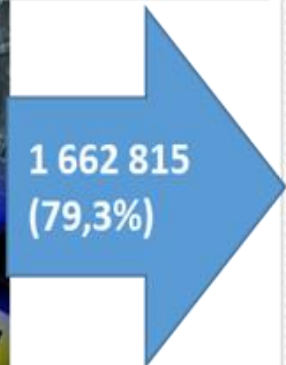

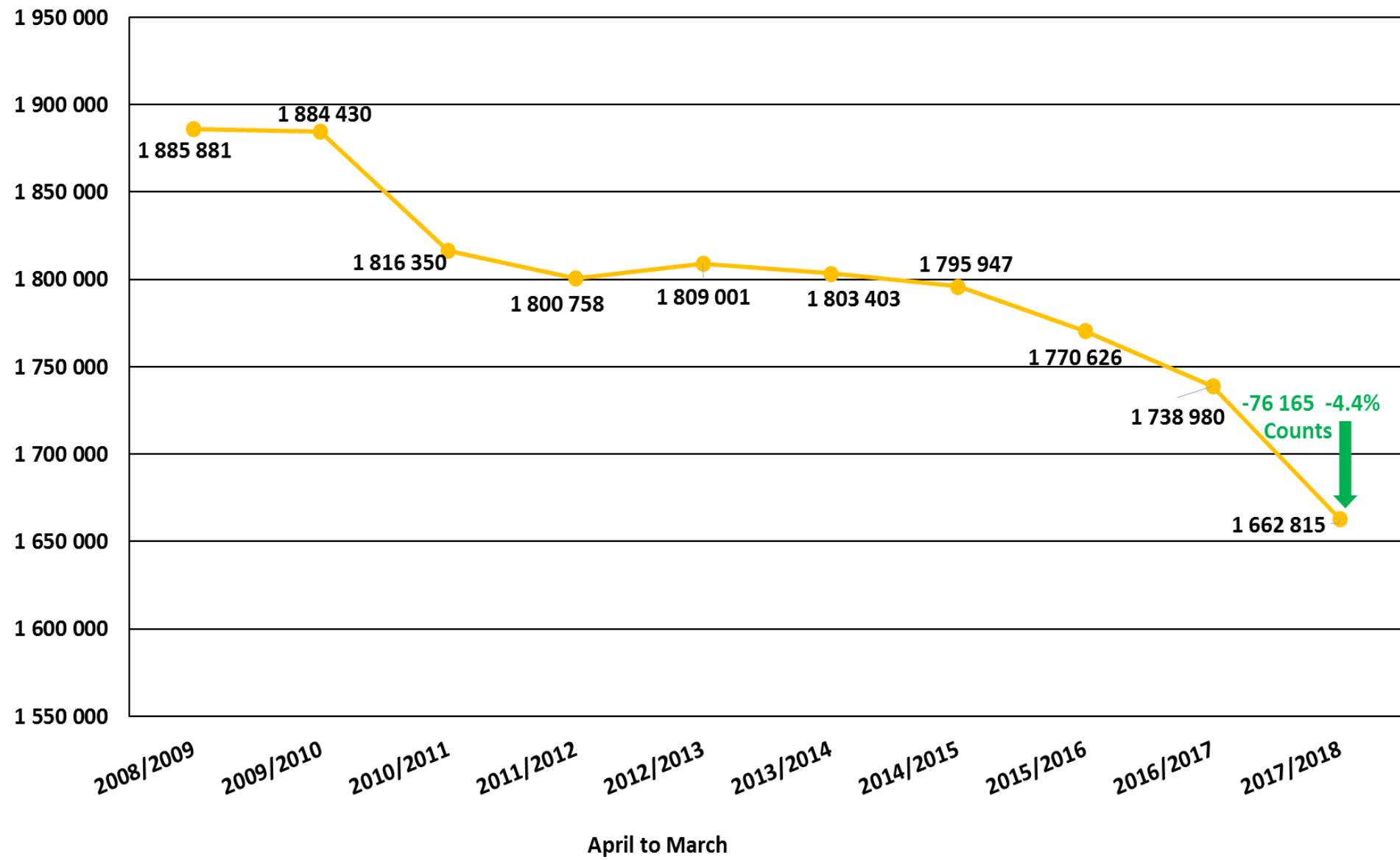

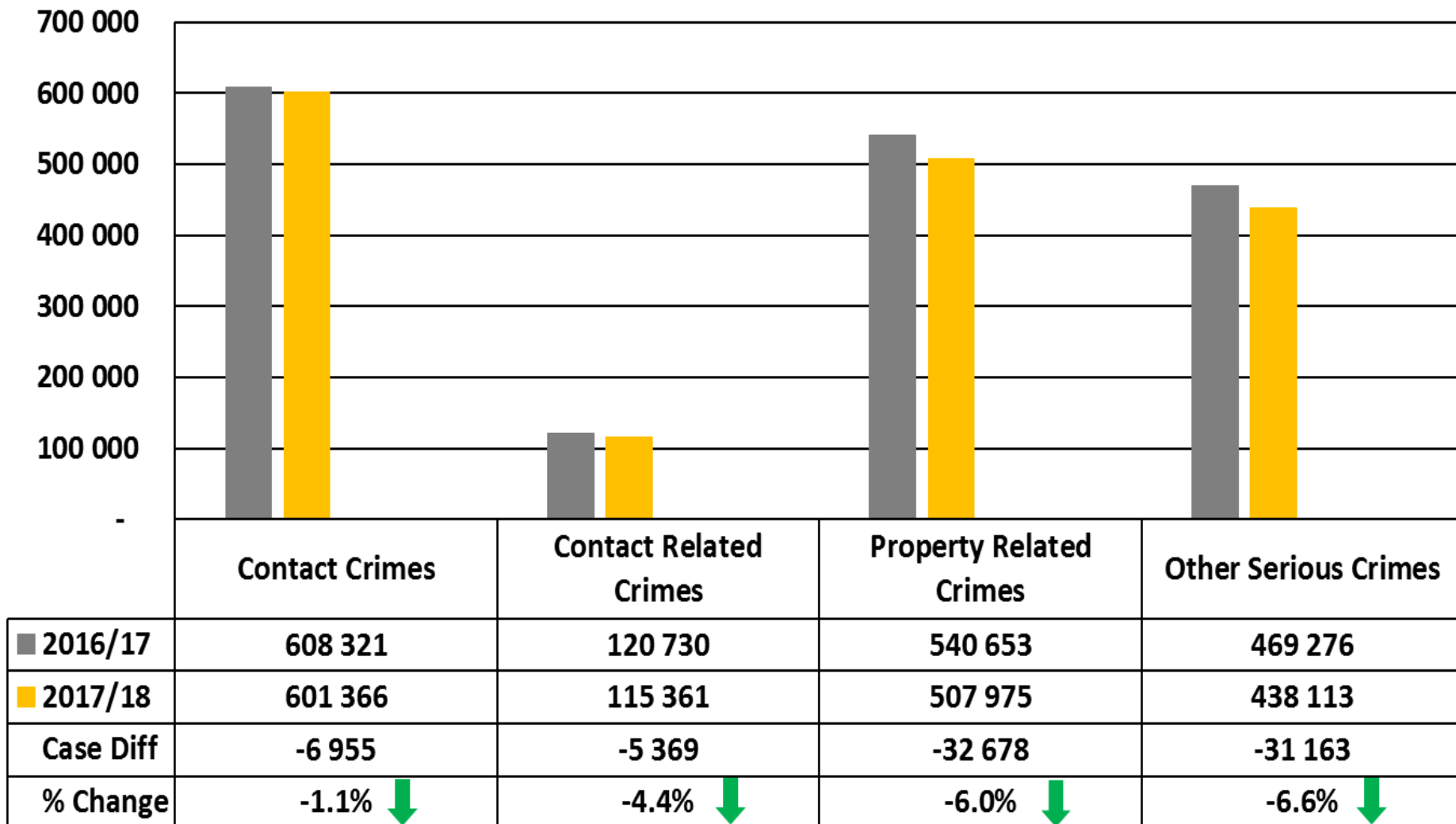

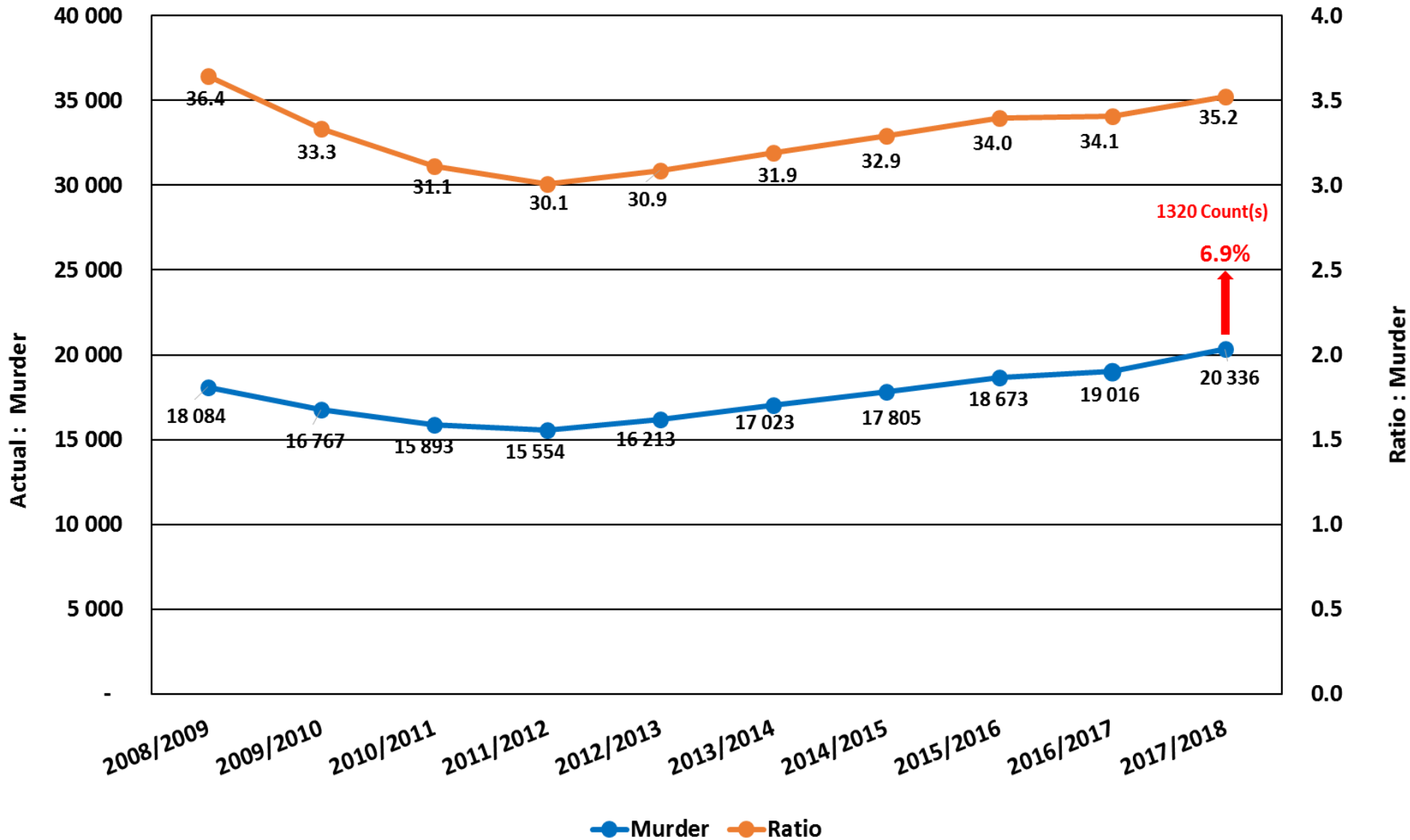

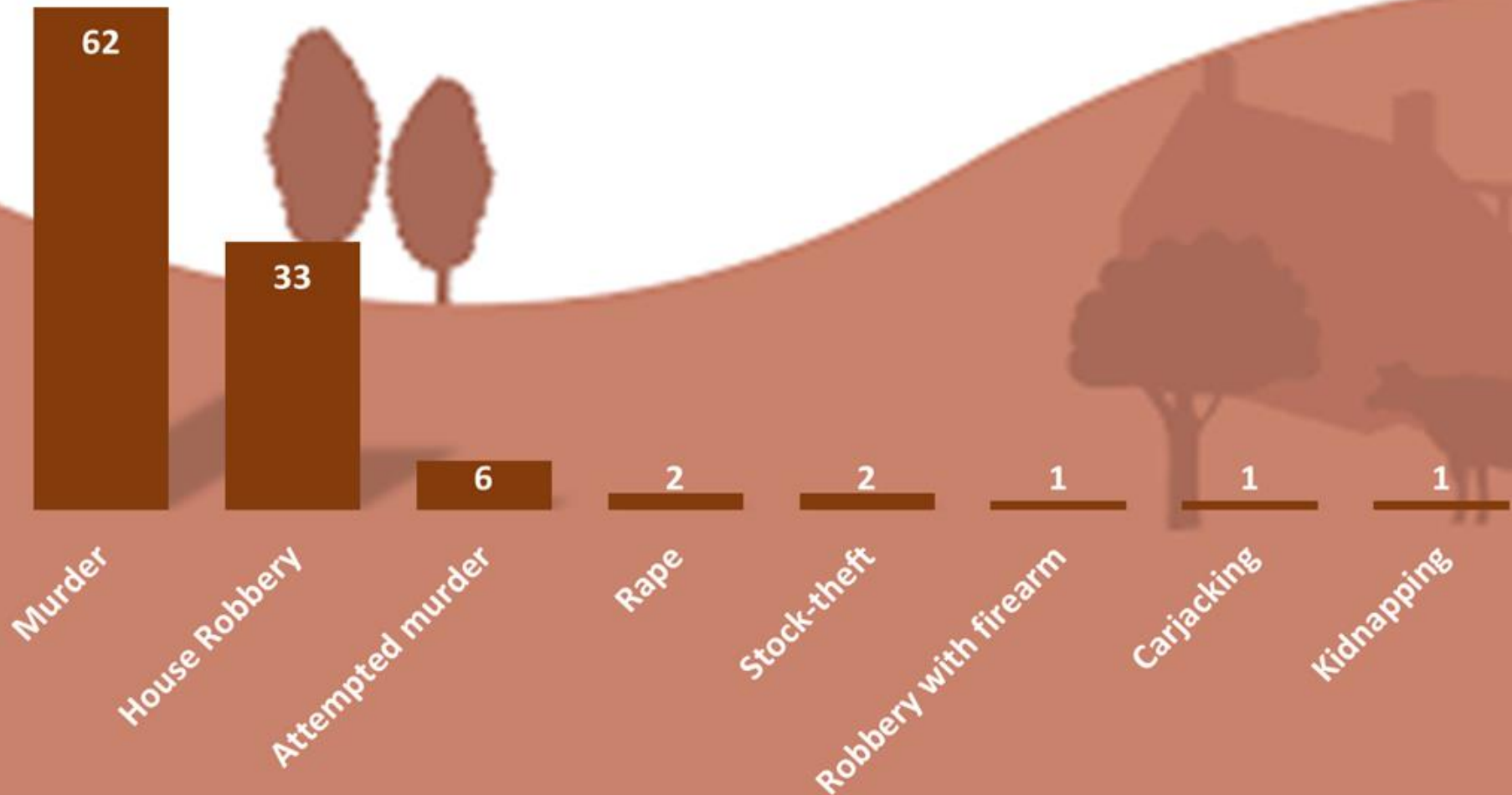

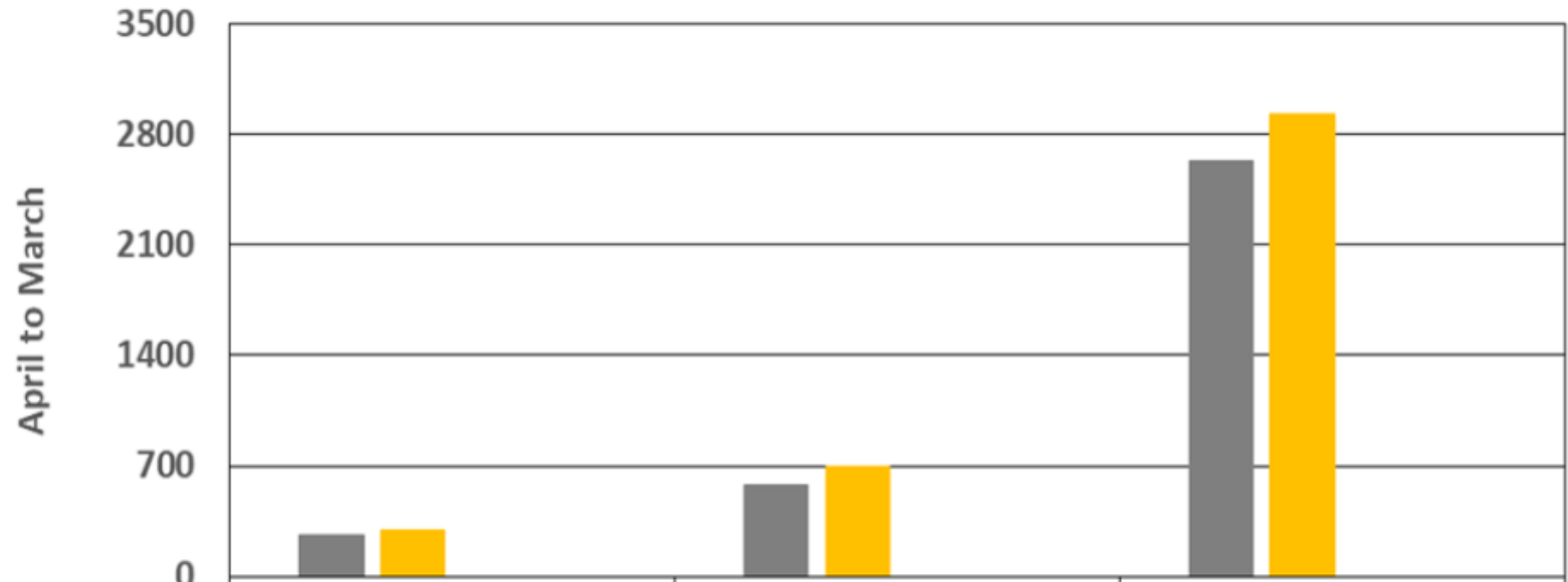

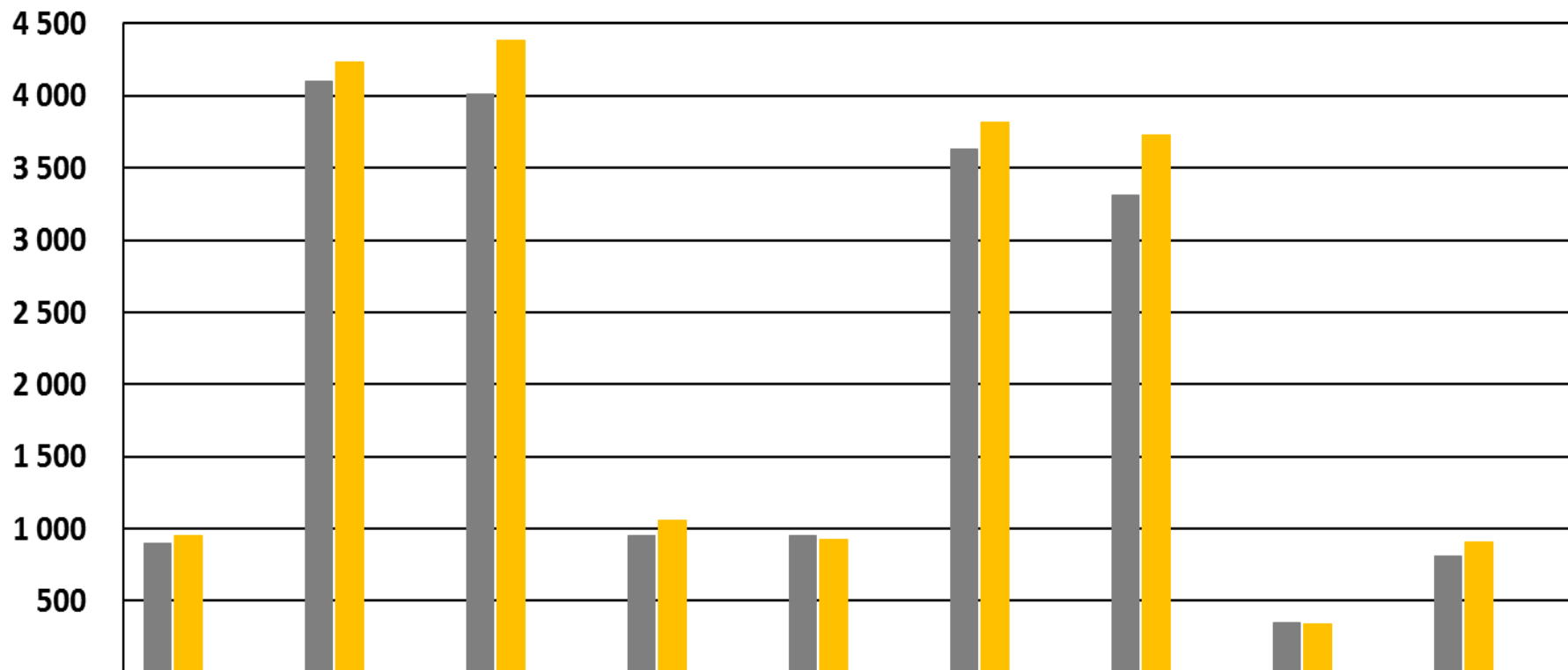


## TEN MOST COMMON INSTRUMENTS USED NATIONALLY TO COMMIT MURDER

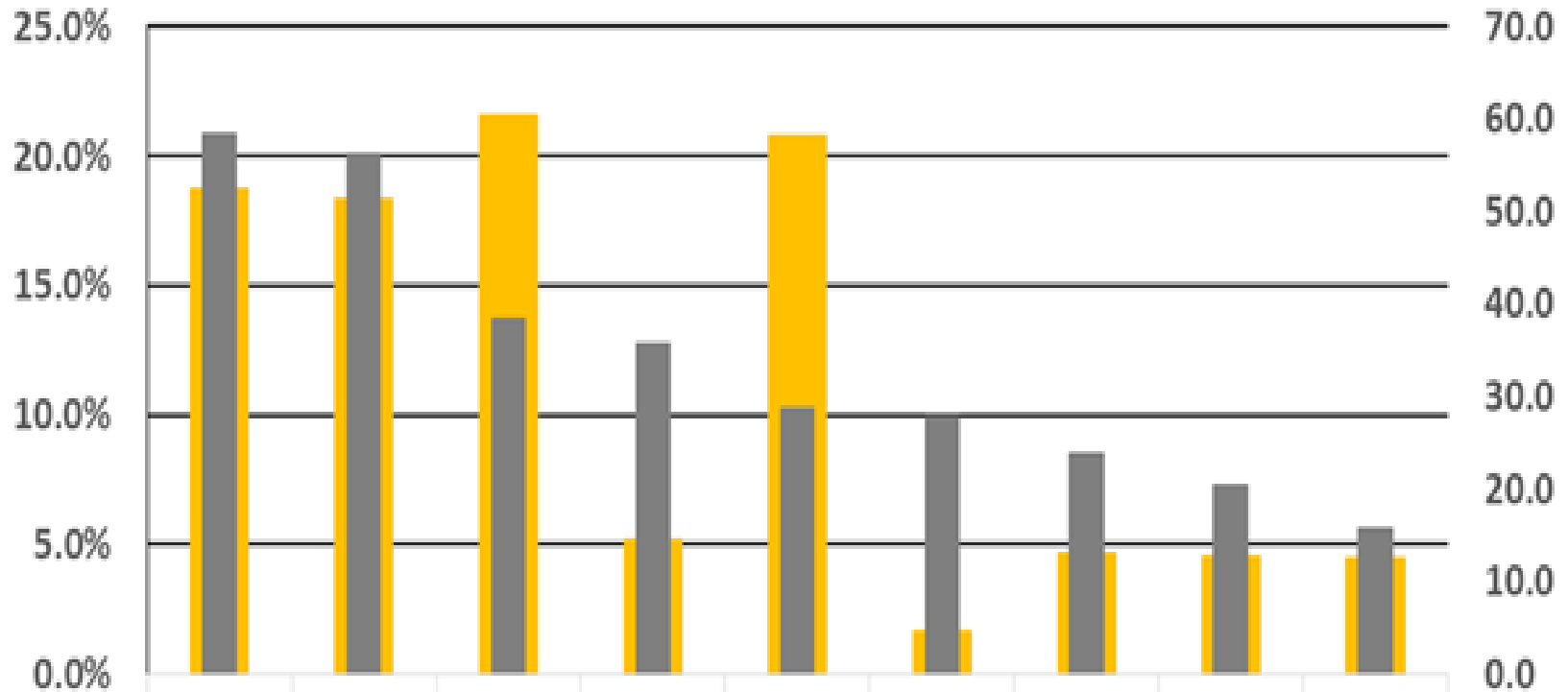

## Percentage contribution vs ratio

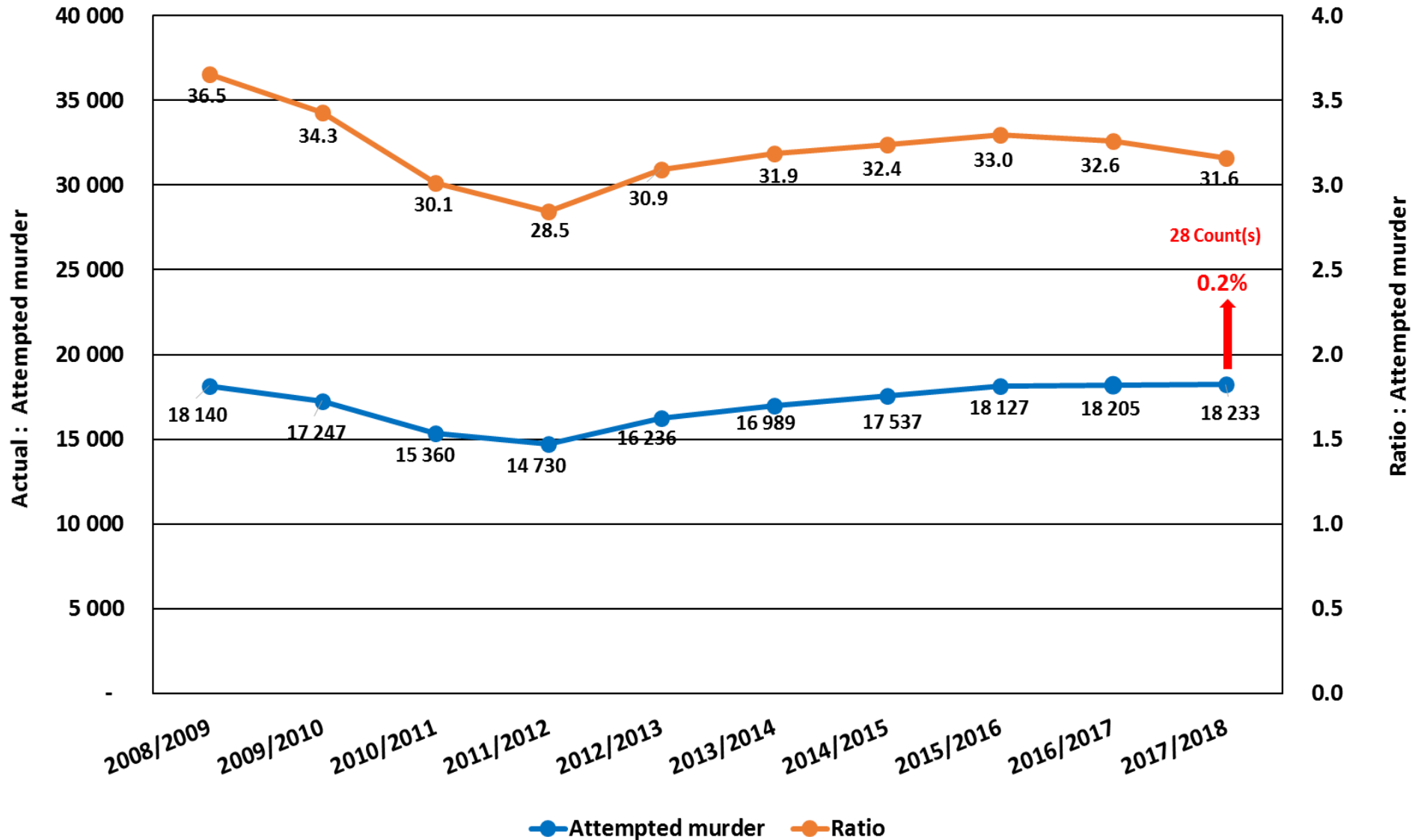

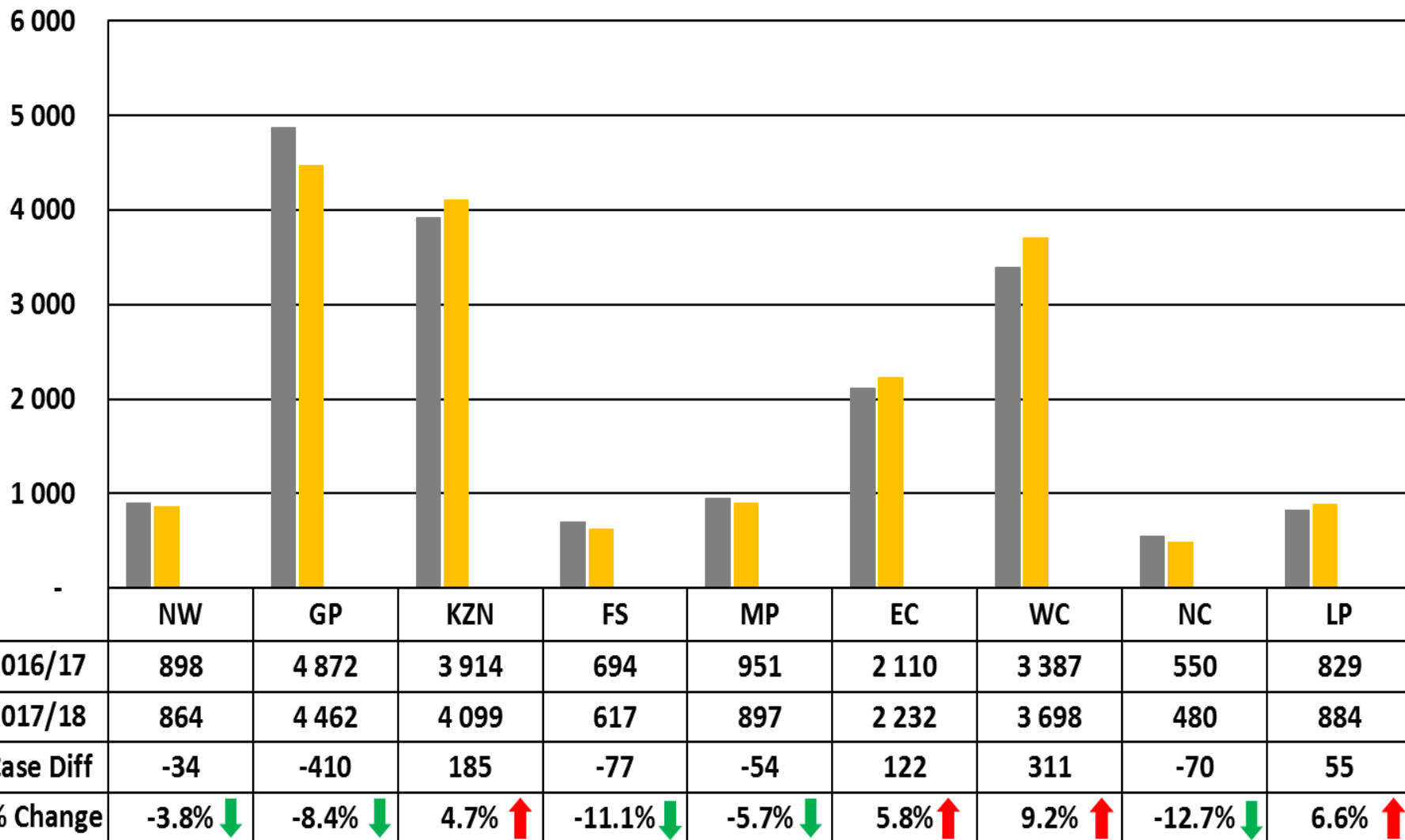

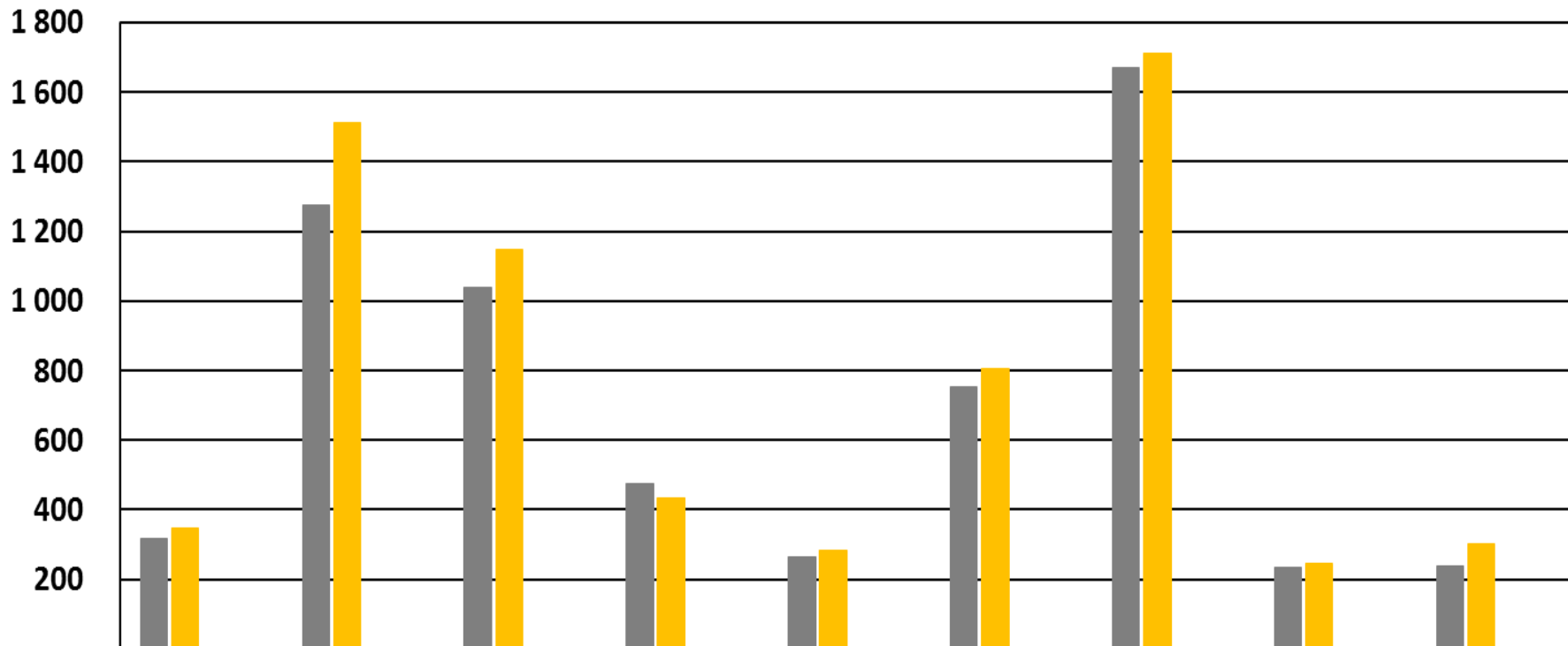
# RAPE : RATIO vs % CONTRIBUTION

# DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL AND/OR DRUGS: TREND OVER 10-YEAR PERIOD

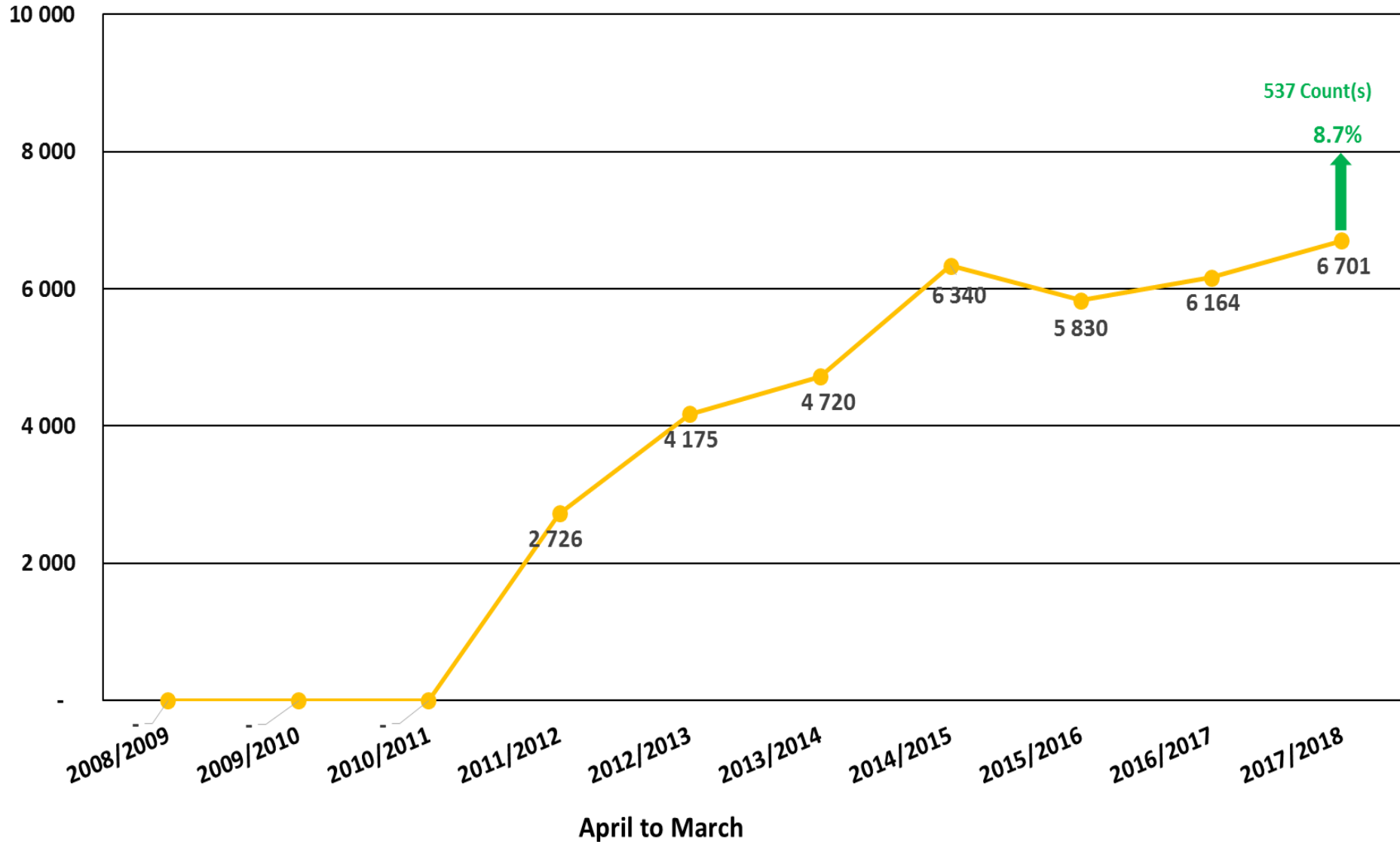

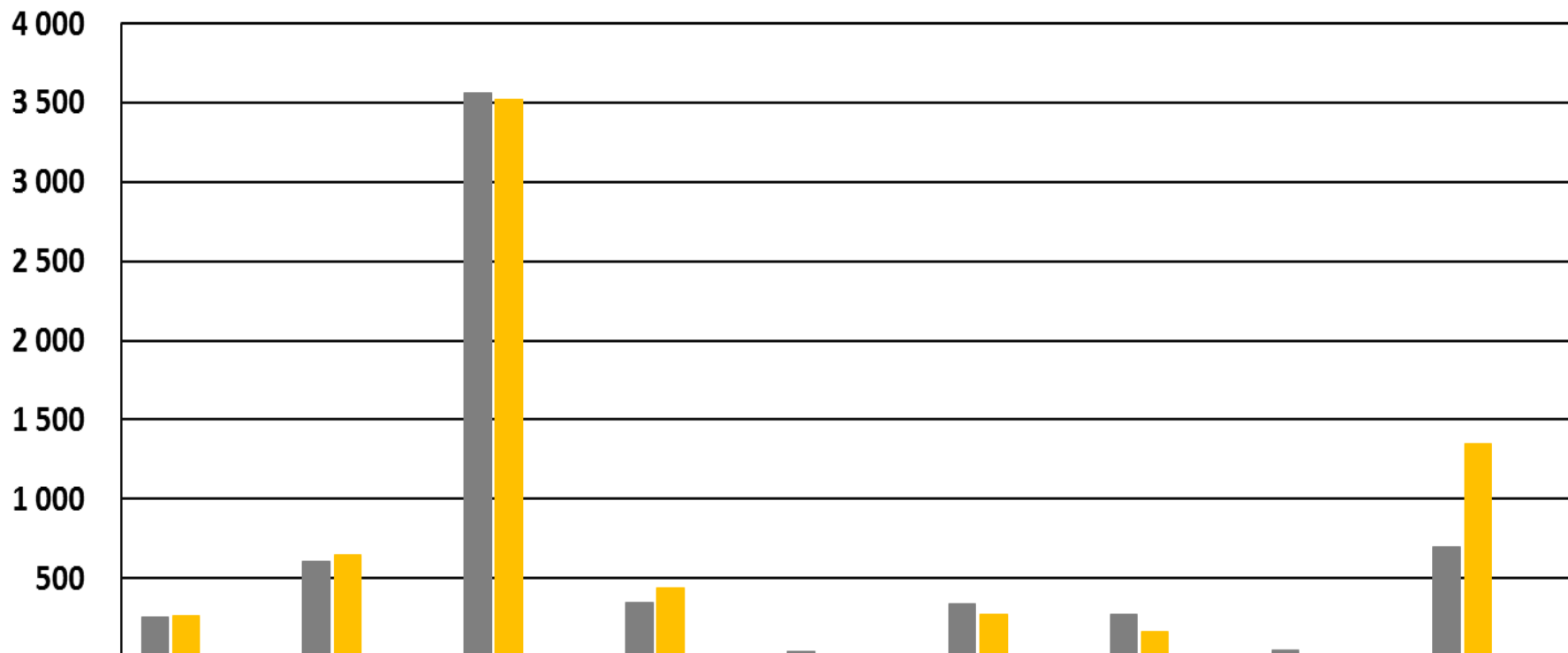




# SEXUAL OFFENCES DETECTED AS A RESULT OF POLICE ACTION: TREND OVER 10-YEAR PERIOD
