## Schedule

### Definitions

1. In these directions, the "Directions" means the Directions on measures to address, prevent and combat the spread of COVID-19 in the Public Transport Services, published under Government Notice No. 801, in *Government Gazette* No. 43538 of 22 July 2020 and amended under Government Notice No. 925 published in *Government Gazette* No. 43652 of 25 August 2020 and Government Notice No. 953 published in *Government Gazette* No. 43679 of 09 September 2020

### Amendment of direction 8 of the Directions

2. Direction 8 of the Directions is hereby amended by the addition of the following direction:

"(2) The Game drive vehicle are permitted to carry 100% licensed passenger capacity."

### Commencement

3. This amendment shall come into effect on the date of publication in the *Government Gazette*.
