Corruption is a scourge which undermines economic growth and social development in South Africa.

The Office of the Public Service Commission (OPSC) is responsible for, amongst others, investigating, monitoring and evaluating the organisation and administration of the Public Service.

Corruption in the Public Service undermines effective service delivery by enriching corrupt officials with money meant for the socio-economic development of the country. Apart from increasing the cost of public services and slowing down service delivery to the public, rampant corruption could scare off foreign investors.

KEY FACTS ABOUT THE NACH

- Over 300 000 calls reporting allegations of corruption and maladministration have been made since the NACH was launched in 2004.
- Tip-offs provided by whistleblowers have resulted in the investigation of over 24 035 cases of corruption, fraud and other crimes by government departments and other law-enforcement agencies.
- In the first quarter of the 2021/22 financial year, the OPSC received 337 corruptionrelated cases through the NACH.
- Out of the 337 cases, the OPSC has investigated 35 Cases of appointment and procurement irregularities. The remaining cases have been referred to government departments or other law-enforcement agencies for investigation.
