## MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT, 1951 (ACT NO. 57 OF 1951)

## THE DRAFT MERCHANT SHIPPING (CONSTRUCTION AND EQUIPMENT OF FISHING VESSELS OF 24 METRES IN LENGTH AND OVER) REGULATIONS, 2022
