

BOARD NOTICE 669 OF 2024**SOUTH AFRICAN PHARMACY COUNCIL****RULES RELATING TO GOOD PHARMACY PRACTICE**

The South African Pharmacy Council herewith publishes amendments for implementation to the minimum standards as contained in Annexure A of the *Rules relating to good pharmacy practice*, which was published on 17 December 2004, Government Gazette No: 27112, in Board Notice 129 of 2004 (as amended), in terms of Section 35A(b)(ii) of the Pharmacy Act, 53 of 1974.

SCHEDULE**Rules relating to what constitutes good pharmacy practice.**

1. In these rules "the Act" shall mean the Pharmacy Act, 53 of 1974, as amended, and any expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Act shall bear such meaning.
2. The following rule to Annexure A of the *Rules relating to good pharmacy practice* is hereby amended –
 - (a) Rule 2.29: PRODUCTS WHICH MAY NOT BE SOLD IN A PHARMACY

MINIMUM STANDARDS FOR SERVICES PROVIDED IN A PHARMACY

Rule 2.29 PRODUCTS WHICH MAY NOT BE SOLD IN A PHARMACY, is hereby deleted and replaced with Rule 2.29 as follows:

2.29.1 PURPOSE

This standard aims to control what can and cannot be offered in pharmacies, irrespective of the category of pharmacy listed in the Council Register.

2.29.2 DEFINITIONS/ACRONYMS

“**ENDS**” Electronic Nicotine Delivery Systems

“**ENNDS**” Electronic Non-Nicotine Delivery Systems

2.29.3 PRODUCTS WHICH MAY NOT BE SOLD IN A PHARMACY

The following may not be sold in the pharmacy:

- (a) arms and ammunition;
- (b) fireworks;
- (c) tobacco, and tobacco-related products;
- (d) Electronic Nicotine Delivery Systems (ENDS) and Electronic Non-Nicotine Delivery Systems (ENNDS);
- (e) alcohol, except when meant for medicinal purposes; and
- (f) gambling services and/or products.
