PART I: DEFINITIONS AND INTERPRETATIONS

1. In these regulations any word or phrase to which a meaning has been assigned in the Act shall have that meaning and, unless the context otherwise indicates-

"Border Management Authority (BMA) officer" means an officer appointed in terms of the Border Management Authority Act, 2020 (Act No. 2 of 2020) responsible for the execution of frontline border law enforcement functions related to plant biosecurity control in terms of these Regulations;

"delegated officer" means the person delegated in terms of section 6(1)(a) of the Act;

"extended detention" means authorization of imports of plants, plant products and other regulated articles through designated ports of entry for inspection at an approved inland facility, beyond a 10 km radius from the port of entry, as determined by the BMA officials with the concurrence of the executive officer;

"e-permit" means a digital platform or an electronic permitting system that allows an importer to apply for a permit online.

"interception (of a consignment)" means the refusal or controlled entry of an imported consignment due to failure to comply with phytosanitary regulations;

"post-entry quarantine" means quarantine applied to a consignment after entry; and

"quarantine facility" means an official facility for holding plants, plant products, and regulated articles under quarantine.

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PART II: IMPORT OF PLANTS, PLANT PRODUCTS, AND OTHER REGULATED ARTICLES

Requirements for imports

- 2. (1) A person intending to import plants, plant products and other regulated articles into the Republic shall apply for an import permit in terms of section 13(1) of the Act.
- (2) The importer must comply with the phytosanitary import requirements.
- (3) The importer should stipulate the intended destination of the imported plants, plant products and other regulated articles into the Republic; where applicable, the delegated officer shall verify and validate the address to ensure traceability.

Application for an import permit

- 3. (1) An application for the issuing of an import permit shall be made in the form set out in Annexure B, or through the electronic permitting system (e-Certification) available on the departmental website
- (2) Such an application form referred to in Annexure B shall be-
 - (a) fully completed and submitted to the executive officer or authorised person at least 30 working days prior to the date of the consignment leaving the exporting country; and
 - (b) accompanied by proof of payment made in accordance with the prescribed fees stipulated in Annexure A.
 - (c) sent via electronic mail (e-mail) to PlantHealthPermits@nda.gov.za or be delivered by post, addressed to the Directorate Food, Import and Export Standards, P.O. Box 40024, Arcadia, Pretoria, 0007 or by hand at Harvest House, 30 Hamilton Street, Arcadia, Pretoria.

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Issuance of an import permit

- **4.** (1) The application for an import permit shall be evaluated and verified by the executive officer or delegated officer to ensure compliance.
- (2) The import permit shall be issued within 30 days if the phytosanitary import requirements are available.
- (3) Pest Risk Analysis (PRA) will be conducted when there are no phytosanitary import requirements by NPPOZA, and upon completion of the PRA process an the import permit will be issued.
- (4) The import permit granted is solely applicable to the commodity stated on the import permit, and in the quantity indicated.
- (5) The issued import permit is valid for a period as determined by the executive officer.
- (6) The executive officer may review, amend or revoke the issued import permit in terms of section 13(4)(a) of the Act.
- (7) An import permit that requires compliance with the Plant Improvement Act, 2018 or other relevant legislations shall only be issued if accompanied by an approval letter from the relevant Registrar.

Point of entry

5. (1) Any person importing plants, plant products, and other regulated articles into the Republic on the authority of a permit must do so through the prescribed point of entry specified in Table 1 unless the executive officer has determined some other point of entry in terms of section 13(3)(a) of the Act.

Presentation of consignment for inspection

6. (1) The consignment imported and required documents shall be presented to the BMA officer or authorised person for inspection at the point

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- of entry or any other place determined by the executive officer in terms of section 13(3)(b) of the Act.
- (2) The consignment inspected in sub-regulation 6(1) shall not be removed from the point of entry or any other place before the BMA officer or executive officer or authorised person has authorised such removal in writing.
- (3) In cases where consignments do not comply with the phytosanitary import requirements the BMA officer or executive officer or authorized person may order the consignment to be:
 - (a) removed from the Republic
 - (b) detroy
 - (c) treat (depending on the risk identified)
 - (d) detained for any other phytosanitary action.
- (4) The non-compliance referred to in sub-regulation 6(3) shall be communicated to the country of origin through the NPPOZA contact point.

Extended detention of imports for inspection at an inland facility

- 7. (1) Extended detention for all imports shall be authorised by the BMA officer with the concurrence of the executive officer.
- (2) All consignments granted extended detention shall be:
 - (a) verified at the designated point of entry prior to movement to an approved facility;
 - (b) moved by affixing seals, marks, and movement documents issued at the point of entry to ensure consignment integrity;
 - (c) monitored for traceability; and
 - (d) inspected at an approved official facility.
- (3) The seals may only be removed by a designated officer or authorised person during inspection.
- (4) The consignment shall not be used for any other purposes unless it has been inspected and cleared for distribution in the Republic.

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- (5) The BMA officer and executive officer/ delegated officer within the responsible authority shall:
 - (a) coordinate among each other for inspection;
 - (b) perform any other functions to manage the risk of pest introduction;
 - (c) provide a feedback report after inspection to the relevant authority.
- (6) The executive officer/ delegated officer responsible for inspection will then release the consignment upon compliance.
- (7) In cases of non-compliance in the consignment during inspection, such consignment will either be treated or destroyed, depending on the level of risk identified.

Post-entry quarantine measures

- **8.** (1) Any importer shall seek guidance from the NPPOZA for propagation material that should be subjected to post-entry quarantine measures regarding the availability of an officially approved quarantine facility.
- (2) All imported propagation material destined for post-entry quarantine measures shall be:
 - (a) presented to the BMA officer at the point of entry
 - (b) collected by the NPPOZA official directly from the point of entry for establishment and propagation at the quarantine facility.
- (3) All post-quarantine facilities shall be approved by the executive officer.
- (4) The NPPOZA shall inspect, test, and examine all the propagation material that is subjected to the post-entry quarantine facility.
- (5) If the propagation material held in the quarantine facility does not pose any phytosanitary risks or and are free from regulated pests, the propagation material will be released.

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Importation of a biological control agent

- **9.** (1) A person importing a biological control agent shall apply for an import permit.
- (2) The NPPOZA with relevant entities shall conduct a risk assessment, and upon completion of the risk assessment, the NPPOZA shall issue an import permit.
- (3) The NPPOZA shall ensure that the biological agent is taken directly to the designated quarantine facility or mass-rearing facility, if appropriate, and passed directly for release into the environment.

Importation for research purposes

- **10.** (1) A person intending to import plants, plant products and other regulated articles for research purposes shall apply for an import permit and comply with phytosanitary import requirements.
- (2) The researcher must adhere to specific disposal protocols after the research is complete.

PART III: GENERAL

Payment of fees

- **11.** (1) The cost of any application or other document which is submitted or furnished in terms of these regulations, as well as on or of anything pertaining thereto, shall be paid by the sender thereof in terms of section 13(3)(e) of the Act and as stipulated in Annexure A.
- (2) Any amount which is payable in terms of these regulations shall-
 - (a) be paid by cash or at the bank, or electronically, and the proof of payment must be submitted together with the relevant document to the executive officer.
