BOARD NOTICE 902 OF 2026

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

**CALL FOR NOMINATIONS FOR MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC TO SERVE ON THE COUNCIL FOR THE BUILT ENVIRONMENT****CLOSING DATE: 31 JULY 2026**

The Honourable Minister of Public Works and Infrastructure, Mr Dean Macpherson (MP), hereby invites nominations for new members to serve on the Council for the Built Environment's (CBE) Seventh Term Council.

The Council for the Built Environment (CBE) is a Schedule 3A Public Entity that reports to the National Department of Public Works and Infrastructure. It is a regulatory body established under the Council for the Built Environment Act (No. 43 of 2000) (the CBE Act) for the purpose of regulating the Built Environment sector and exercising oversight on the Councils for the Built Environment Professions (architecture, landscape architecture, engineering, property valuers, project and construction management professions, and quantity surveying) for the purpose of promoting good conduct within the professions, transforming the professions and advising South African government on built environment related issues. Additionally, the CBE has a formal partnership with the South African Council for Planners, South African Geomatics Council, and the Environmental Assessment Practitioners Association of South Africa through a memorandum of understanding.

Requirements

In terms of section 6(2)(d) of the Council for the Built Environment Act, 2000 (Act 43 of 2000), the CBE hereby *invites nominations from members of the public within the period specified in the notice from the date of the notice*, for its seventh term of office.

Council members of the CBE must have demonstrable leadership qualities and be committed to the development and transformation of the built environment professions. They must possess knowledge and/or expertise of the following: built environment sector; procurement and any other supply chain prescripts; black economic empowerment and the emerging sector; training, research and development; law, including construction law and legislation governing labour relations; communication, marketing and public relations; project management and financing; accounting compliance and reporting in terms of the Public Finance Management Act (PFMA); managing public budgeting, expenditure, and audit and risk, including combating fraud and corruption. Due consideration will be given to race, gender, disability and geographic location in the composition of the Council.

Preference would be given to persons with either legal; finance; corporate governance or human resource experience to contribute to the strategic direction of the Council for the Built Environment in the interest of the built environment and the public whom they represent.

Disqualification

The following persons are *not* eligible for appointment to the Council of the Built Environment in terms of section 8 of the CBE Act.

(1) A person may not be appointed as a member of the council if that person—

- (a) is not a South African citizen and ordinarily resident in the Republic;
- (b) is an unrehabilitated insolvent;
- (c) has been convicted of an offence in the Republic, other than an offence committed prior to 27 April 1994 associated with political objectives, and was sentenced to imprisonment without an option of a fine, or, in the case of fraud, to a fine or imprisonment or both;
- (d) subject to subsection (3), has been convicted of an offence in a foreign country and was sentenced to imprisonment without an option of a fine, or, in the case of fraud, to a fine or imprisonment or both;
- (e) has, as a result of improper conduct, been removed from an office of trust;
- (f) has in terms of this Act been found guilty by the council of improper conduct; or
- (g) in the case of persons referred to in section 5(2)(c) is not a registered person

Term of Office

The term of office of members will be four (4) years from the date of appointment by the Minister of Public Works and Infrastructure and approval of Cabinet. The Council meets at least four times per annum, and the appointed person will be required to serve on sub-committees of the Council. Council members may be reappointed for one consecutive term. Candidates will be subjected to a security screening process.

Nomination Particulars

Nominations must be made on the Nomination Form provided for on the CBE website or on request from the e-mail address here below. Please note that failure to comply with the above requirements may result in disqualification of the nomination.

Nominations must be in writing, completed in the accompanying prescribed form* and contain the following information:

- Full name, address and contact details of the nominating person or organisation;
- Full name, identity number and contact details of the nominee;
- Signed acceptance of the nomination by the nominee;
- Declaration by nominee* that he/she is qualified to serve on the CBE in terms of section 8 of the CBE Act;
- A motivation (one page only) for appointment of the nominee to the CBE;
- A Curriculum Vitae of the nominee (not more than two pages) covering the following: the nominee's full name, ID number, race, gender, contact addresses, telephone numbers, qualifications, experience, knowledge and skills and current and former board memberships as well as the names and contact details of at least two referees;
- Certified copy of the nominee's South African ID document; and
- Certified copies of the nominee's qualifications.
