DEPARTMENT OF HIGHER EDUCATION AND TRAINING**NOTICE 4150 OF 2026****CONTINUING EDUCATION TRAINING ACT, 2006 (ACT 16 OF 2006)****DISPOSAL OF OR ALIENATION OF MOVABLE ASSETS ACQUIRED WITH THE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE OF THE STATE BY TECHNICAL AND VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND TRAINING COLLEGES**

I, Kgwaridi Bhuti Manamela, Minister of Higher Education and Training, acting in terms of Sections 3(3) and 3(4) of the Continuing Education and Training Act, 2006 (Act No. 16 of 2006), hereby determine and publish the conditions applicable to the disposal, alienation, or write-off of movable assets by Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) Colleges acquired with the financial assistance of the State.

It is hereby approved that a TVET College Council may, without obtaining the prior concurrence of the Minister, dispose of, alienate, or write off any movable asset acquired with the financial assistance of the State, provided that the historical acquisition cost of such asset does not exceed **R400 000.00** per item.

During the course of a financial year and at such intervals as may be necessitated by its operational requirements, A TVET College may write off and dispose of movable assets where such assets have reached the end of their useful life, have become obsolete, have been damaged beyond economical repair, or are no longer required for purposes of service delivery.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, any TVET College intending to dispose of, alienate, or write off a movable asset acquired with the financial assistance of the State, the historical acquisition cost of which exceeds **R400 000.00** per item, shall obtain the prior concurrence of the Minister, as contemplated in the CET Act of 16 of 2006. Any immovable assets must still obtain concurrence of the Minister as required by the CET Act.

The notice is effective from the date of publication and must be applied progressively.
