DEPARTMENT OF TRADE, INDUSTRY AND COMPETITION**NOTICE 4162 OF 2026****INTERNATIONAL TRADE ADMINISTRATION COMMISSION****NOTICE OF THE CONCLUSION OF A SUNSET REVIEW OF THE ANTI-DUMPING DUTIES ON ROPES AND CABLES OF A DIAMETER THAT IS EXCEEDING 32MM ORIGINATING IN OR IMPORTED FROM THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF GERMANY AND THE UNITED KINGDOM**

The International Trade Administration Commission of South Africa (“the Commission”) conducted a sunset review investigation of the anti-dumping duties on ropes and cables of a diameter that is exceeding 32mm (also known as ropes and cables of steel or wire ropes) (“the subject products”), originating in or imported from the Federal Republic of Germany (“Germany”) and the United Kingdom (“the UK”).

The investigation was initiated after the Commission considered that there was *prima facie* evidence that there would be a likelihood of the continuation of dumping and the recurrence of material injury should the anti-dumping duties expire. The Notice of initiation was published in Notice No. 3695 of 2025 in *Government Gazette* No. 53872. All known interested parties were notified of the initiation of the investigation.

After considering comments to essential facts letters, the Commission made a final determination that the expiry of the anti-dumping duties on the subject products originating in or imported from Germany and the UK would likely lead to the continuation of dumping and the recurrence material injury, and therefore decided to recommend to the Minister of Trade, Industry and Competition that the current anti-dumping duties on ropes and cables be maintained as per Report No. 786.

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
