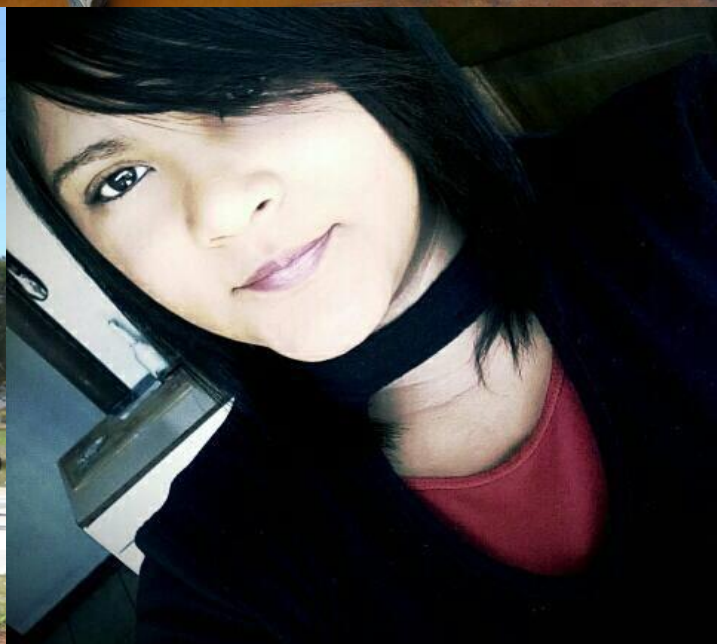

Deep within the Elgin Valley in the Western Cape lies the largest single export fruit producing area in Southern Africa - the small town of Grabouw. With its beautiful farmlands and hills, it's easy to see why many view this town as tranquil and idyllic. But the reality is very different for many in Grabouw, where 24 years into democracy there has been little change in who owns and controls the land - and consequently the unacceptably harsh conditions farmworkers have to bear. The film follows several inspiring activists who are doing everything they can to challenge the status quo - for women, for youth, for the homeless and for those fighting for land redistribution.

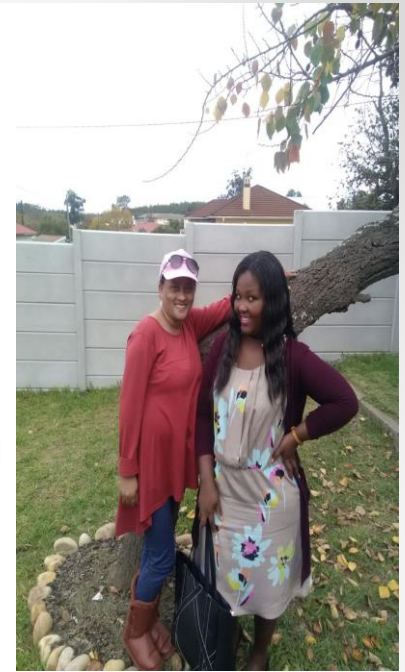
