

CORONAVIRUS LOCKDOWN: REGULATIONS FOR THE HOTEL INDUSTRY TALKING POINTS

The regulations for the hotel sector strengthens our fight against COVID-19.

- The regulations allow for a united effort by the hotel sector in response to the declaration of COVID-19 as a national disaster.
- It exempts the hotel industry from the application of Sections 4 and 5 of the Competition Act, which prohibits uncompetitive agreements.
- Through the exemptions, government is strengthening its programmes designed to fight COVID-19.
- Parties participating in any agreements must keep minutes of meetings held and written records of such agreements or practices.

The regulations allow government and the industry to work together to identify facilities for quarantine.

- The regulations allows the hotel industry to collectively engage with the Department of Health and the Department of Tourism.
- It permits all stakeholders to work together in identifying and providing facilities for persons placed under quarantine.
- It allows the Department of Health and the Department of Tourism to reach agreements for the accommodation of persons placed under quarantine
- Industry participants can communicate with each other on their capacities and utilisation of facilities.

The regulations permit agreement on pricing for the industry to provide facilities for quarantine.

 It allows for discussion and agreements in the hotel industry on the reduction of the cost of providing appropriate facilities.

- These pricing agreements must be at the request of the Department of Health and the Department of Tourism.
- Department of Health and the Department of Tourism must be specifically authorised by the Minister of Health and Minister of Tourism.
- The agreements are subject to oversight and guidance by the Department of Health and the Department of Tourism.
