The sale of alcohol at retail outlets is now permitted during all licensed trading hours


As before, alcohol will be permitted for on-site consumption in licensed establishments with strict adherence to the curfew

## New regulations on international travel

PROTECT SOUTH AFRICA


All international travel will resume subject to stringent health protocols


Travellers will need to present a negative COVID-19 test result not older than $\mathbf{7 2}$ hours from time of departure


Where necessary, travellers will need to enter mandatory quarantine facilities at their own cost

The following restrictions will remain in place to prevent the spread of the virus (Part 1)

PROTECT SOUTH AFRICA


The number of people allowed in a retail store, bar, cinema, theatre or other public space remains limited to 50\% of its normal capacity to prevent the spread of the virus

Gatherings are limited to $\mathbf{2 5 0}$ indoors and $\mathbf{5 0 0}$ outdoors

The following restrictions will remain in place to prevent the spread of the virus (Part 2)


It is mandatory to wear a mask in all public spaces and to ensure social distancing


A curfew remains in place from 12:00am to 04:00am
