

New regulations on the sale of alcohol



The **sale of alcohol** at retail outlets is now permitted during **all licensed trading hours**



As before, alcohol will be permitted for **on-site consumption** in licensed establishments with **strict adherence to the curfew**

South Africa will remain on Level 1

New regulations on international travel



All **international travel** will resume subject to **stringent health protocols**



Travellers will need to present a **negative COVID-19** test result not older than **72 hours** from time of departure



Where necessary, travellers will need to enter **mandatory quarantine** facilities at their **own cost**

The following restrictions will **remain in place** to prevent the spread of the virus (Part 1)



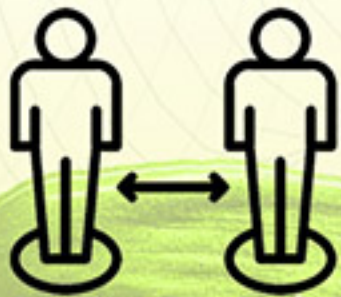
The number of people allowed in a retail store, bar, cinema, theatre or other public space remains **limited to 50% of its normal capacity** to prevent the spread of the virus



Gatherings are limited to **250 indoors** and **500 outdoors**

South Africa will remain on Level 1

The following restrictions will **remain in place** to prevent the spread of the virus (Part 2)



It is **mandatory to wear a mask** in all public spaces and to ensure **social distancing**



A **curfew** remains in place from **12:00am to 04:00am**

What can you do to stop the second wave? (Part 1)



Download the COVID Alert South Africa app now and get notified if you are exposed to coronavirus



Keep wearing a mask whenever you are in public



Wash or **sanitise your hands** regularly

What can you do to stop the second wave? (Part 2)



Maintain a **distance of one-and-a-half metres** from other people at all times



Meet outdoors or in a space with **good ventilation**



Avoid crowds and gatherings
